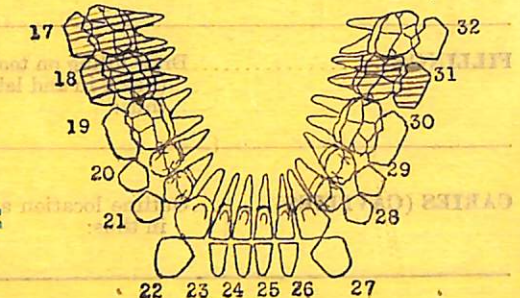
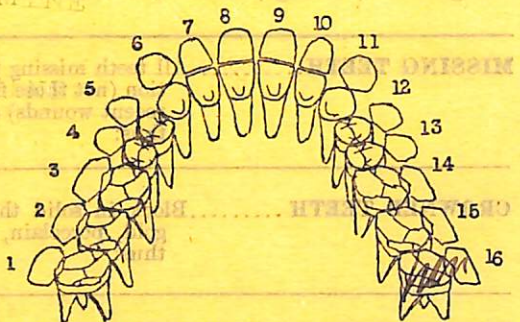

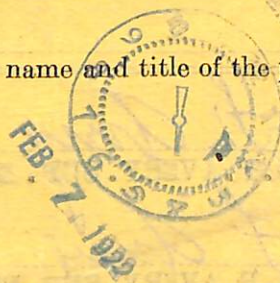

Pvt. Antonio Chinese was wounded in action late afternoon of Sept 5, 1918. He was wounded by a machine gun bullet in the right shoulder and lung. He was immediately evacuated to the first aid station and from there to hospital. And from our reports died in hospital. From the time he was wounded until the time he was evacuated from the first aid station he seemed to be in the best of spirits.

Reference letter 293.9 Disp.

The undersigned, Chianese Andrea, father of Antonio Chianese, a soldier killed in France during the World War, in the American Army, begs to state that he is quite satisfied to have his son, Antonio, buried in French soil because he knows that in spite of distance and the time, the sons of France will always keep vigil over the body of the sons who died in such a holy and just war.

However, he begs to ask respectfully of the officers of the GRS to accept to be his interpreter to the American Government, (Pension Office), in order that they may give kind attention to his case and help him by granting payment on whatever is due to him inasmuch as he is unable to do any work and that there are dependent on him three children. God knows the sacrifices that he has to make to bring them up.

The thing has been pending some time and the undersigned is surprised that the situation has not been definitely settled. The undersigned is writing to you not in any critical spirit, but because he is sure of their interest in his case.

God will reward their kindness, etc.

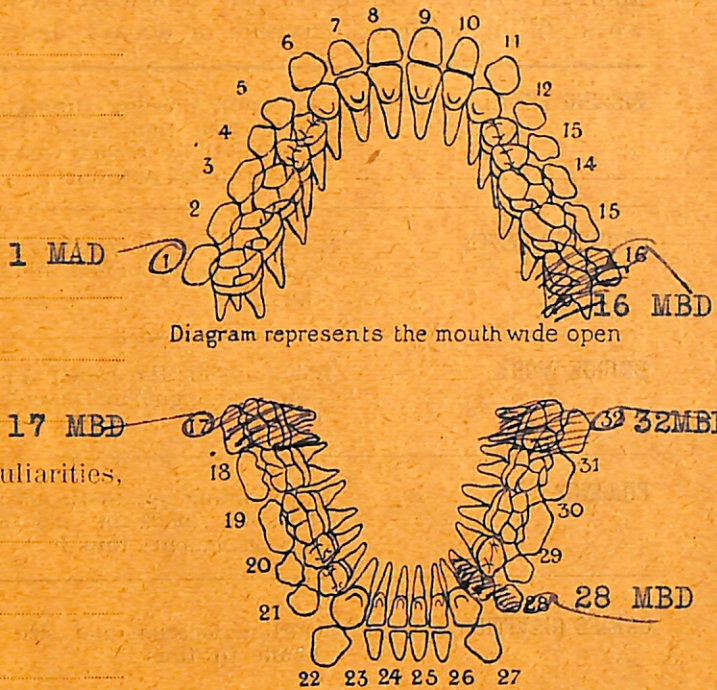



1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.

An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
