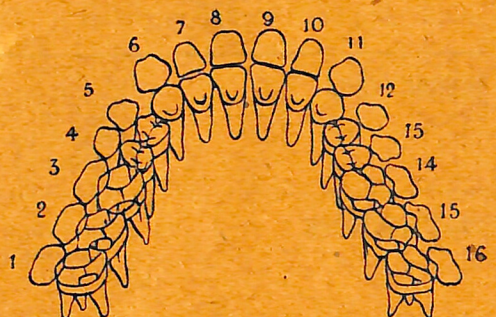
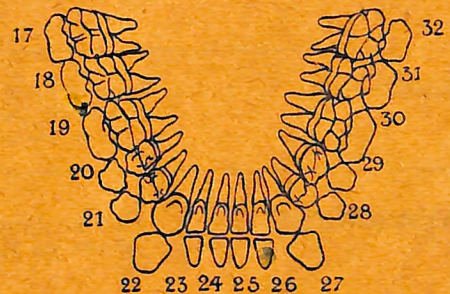


Diagram represents the mouth wide open


Dear Madam:
