I was about 10 feet from Pvt. George M. Chance on Oct. 26th 1918 when he was struck in right shoulder by piece of shrapnel which passed thru his body and came out on the left side. He leaned against side of trench and said "Send and get the 1st. Aid" and fell over on his side. We went up to him and he was dead. This was near Bois-de-Buge, also near the village of Montfaucon.
