Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

Please be assured that in effecting removal of the dead, the utmost reverential care was exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.





Dear Sir:

On May 17th and July 28, 1921, this office communicated with you, requesting a statement as to your wishes regarding the final disposition of the remains of your son, Pvt. John Cimoch, #2383563, Co. F, 60th Inf., who is now buried in PERMANENT Cemetery #1233, Thiaucourt, Meuse, France. No reply has been received therefrom.

Do you wish his body to remain buried in said Permanent American Cemetery in France, or removed therefrom and buried in a National Cemetery in the United States? In either decision the U.S. Government bears all expenses incurred.

However, should you prefer the remains for private interment, the U.S. Government will DELIVER same free of expense, provided the health regulations and sanitary laws permit the entry into Poland; and provided further that the deceased was, at some time during his life, a resident of the town, city, or neighborhood in which you now live.


If the deceased never resided in your community, then this Service will transport the remains to the place where he actually did reside in Poland.

All expenses covering burial, tombstones, and future care of the grave and cemetery are to be paid by you.



Dear Sir:

On May 17, 1921, this office communicated with you requesting an expression of your desires as to the final disposition of the remains of your late son, Private John Cimoch, #2383563, Co. F, 60th Infantry, who is temporarily buried in Cemetery #1233, Thiaucourt, Meuse, France.

Up to the present time, no reply has been received from you and you are again informed that the American Government is prepared to bury these remains:

- (a) In a National Cemetery in the United States;
- (b) Concentrate the remains for final burial in a permanent American cemetery in France;
- (c) Transport the remains to your address, at the expense of the U.S. Government, for final burial, provided the health regulations and sanitary laws will permit the entry; and provided the deceased was, for a period of time prior to enlistment in the U.S. Army, a resident of the city, town or neighborhood in which you now live; or if the deceased was not a resident of the place at which you now live, this Service will transport the remains to such place at which he was a resident; burial expenses to be borne by you.

It is requested that you will return this letter with your wishes clearly indicated thereon, so that we may have a record as to your preference, and in the event that you wish the remains shipped to you or some other place under the conditions referred to in (c), the attached affidavit should be taken before an official in your commune, properly authorized to administer oaths, sworn to and sealed, and forwarded to this office together with your reply.


