The War Department

Washington.

I, the undersigned, respectfully request from the Government of the United States the amount which I should receive because of my son who died in the service of the U.S. My son Joseph Cip born Mch. 19, 1893, in Dvore Kralove, Czechoslovakia, lived in America in May, 1918, he entered the American Army in 10th Co. Columbus Barracks, O. He went to France with the American Army, took part in the battle at Verdun and March 11, 1918 was severely wounded while fulfilling his duties as sergeant as is shown by the accompany report. Because of my age (67) my son was the only one who assisted me, I have been since his death in terrible poverty. I am without property and absolutely unable to work, and I shall be very grateful to the US if it will have compassion upon me and alleviate my suffering even to a small degree. My son in his letters always told me that in case of his death I could rely upon the goodness and liberty of the American Government and I hope that I shall not be disappointed. Sept. 1, 1925 Praue

For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

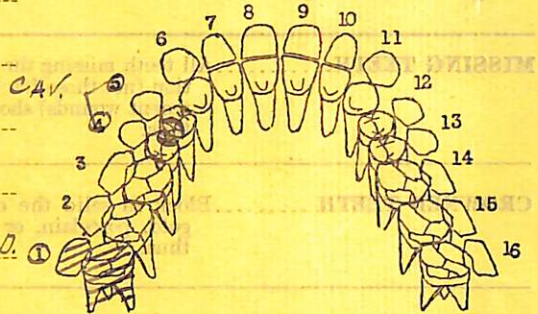
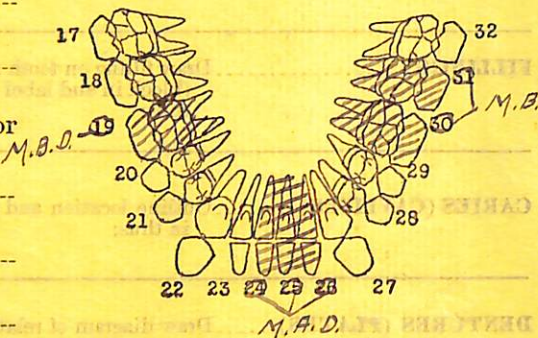


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.








INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No."
 (b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No. 6.

6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
