Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the cousin of the late Pvt. Antonio Ciprietti, Co. H. 166th Inf., whose remains are interred in the Oise-Aisne American Cemetery, Seringes-et-Nesles, Aisne, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.



1. In answer to the letter received from the office of the Chief G.R.S. January 5, 1919 and dated December 23, 1919, will state that our records show that grave of Criprietti, Antonio Pvt. Co. H 166 Inf. was originally located in the Commune of Seringes-et-Nesles, Dept. Aisne, Map 33 S.E. No. 275.150 E. 194.250, which report was rendered to Chief G.R.S. in early part of October 1918 as report of isolated grave. This body was disinterred and reburied in Battle Area # 2 Carr. Commune Seringes-et-Nesles, Aisne on the road from Fere-en-Tardenois to Coulonges Map 33 S.E. No. 275.400 E. 195.250, on October 24, 1918. This report was also rendered in the last part of October but no date was stated as date of reburial. (C-57)

2. Identification of this body was established by the name on stake at grave and no tags or other means of identification was found either on the body or on the grave. Only one body bearing the identification of Criprietti, Antonio Pvt. Co. H 166 Inf. has been found by this group.

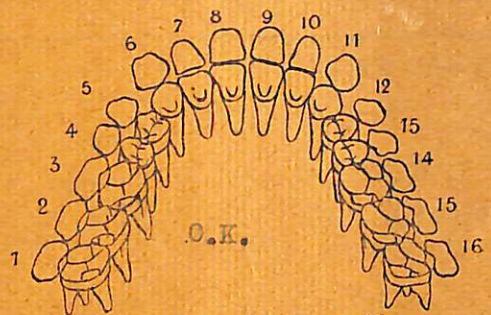
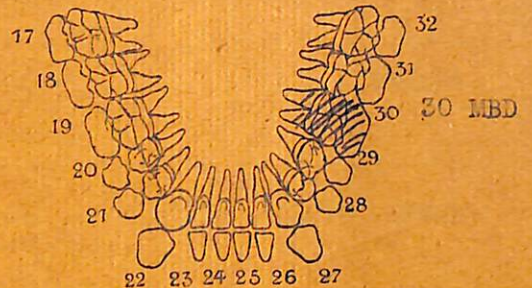


Diagram represents the mouth wide open
