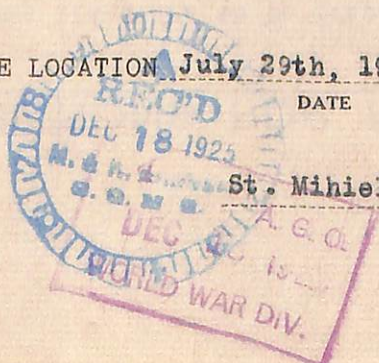

The body is buried at Menil-la-Tour. France.

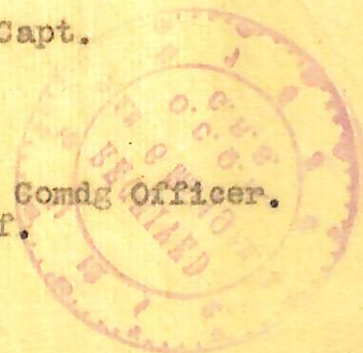

Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of dignified design, with the name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

Please be assured that in effecting removal of the dead, the utmost reverential care was exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

Dear Sir:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of June 28, 1922, relative to the case of the late Private Marcono Cirullo, Company F, 326th Infantry, referred to this office by The Adjutant General of the Army.

There is on file in this office request of the father that the remains of the deceased be permanently interred in France and the necessary instructions have been issued for compliance with his request inasmuch as he is the legal next of kin. It is regretted that it is now too late to cancel this request and return the remains to Italy for final burial as the Secretary of War rendered a decision that no changes of requests for the return of a body would be accepted after August 15, 1921 and the Department has consistently adhered to this ruling. Should changes of requests in the matter of disposition of the remains of our soldier dead continue indefinitely, it would disarrange concentration plans in Europe as well as involve additional expense to the Government.

The remains of Private Cirullo are now at the American Cemetery of the St. Mihiel, Thiaucourt, Department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, awaiting concentration and assurance may be given the relatives that upon the completion of same, the grave of this soldier will always be reverently and tenderly cared for by this Government.
