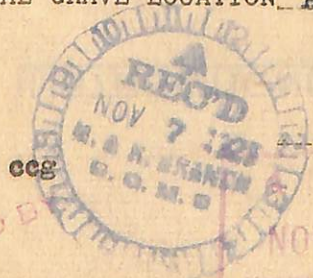

Receipt is acknowledged of form letter completed by you indicating that you stood in loco parentis to the late Clint Clark.

The only provision of the law under which anyone other than the mother or widow could be considered for the privilege of making a pilgrimage is contained in section 4 (a) of the Act of March 3, 1929, which was amended May 15, 1930, to read in part as follows: "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming eighteen years of age".

In order to satisfy the legal requirements, it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of the relationship, in loco parentis, the affidavits of at least two persons not related to you.



Receipt is acknowledged of the form letter from this office dated August 29, 1929, completed by you, relative to the Gold Star Mothers' and Widows' Pilgrimage to Europe, authorized by the Act of Congress, approved March 2, 1929.

It is assumed that you desire the privilege of making this pilgrimage under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as your brother, the late Private Clint Clark, Company C, 358th Infantry, was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 31 years and 3 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, I regret to advise that you are not eligible, within the meaning of the law, to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.
