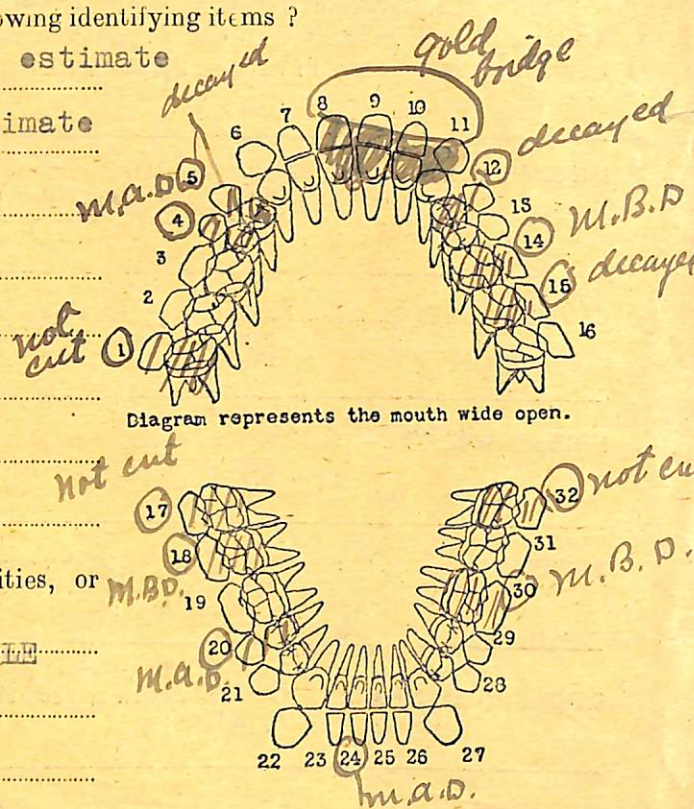

SUBJECT: Case of Private McKinley Wright Cole

1. In reply to your letter of August 16, 1920, you are advised that the records of this office contain your request that the remains of your son, Private McKinley Wright Cole, be returned to you at Adams, Wisconsin, for private interment and instructions will be issued that your wishes be complied with, provided, there is no relative whose legal right to direct disposition has priority over yours.

2. The remains of this soldier are interred in grave #181, American Cemetery Menil-la-Tour, Department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, which cemetery lies within that area designated as the "Zone of the Armies", where, under the agreement with the French Government operations for the removal of our soldier dead will not begin prior to September 15, 1920. Therefore, it will be realized that a reasonable length of time must necessarily elapse after this date before shipment may be made.

3. However, in order that sufficient time may be had for making such arrangements as may be desired the legal next of kin will be notified by telegram upon shipment of the remains from a European port and again upon the arrival of the body at Hoboken, N.J.

4. The Government bears all expenses in connection with the return of our soldier dead to point designated by the legal next of kin for final burial, and the Chief, Bureau of War Risk Insurance, Washington, D. C., is authorized, upon application made direct to him, to reimburse the legal next of kin in a sum not exceeding \$100 for expenses incident to final burial.

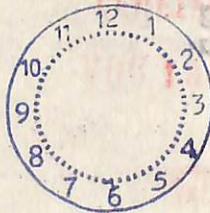
