

In reply to your letter of December 19, 1924, concerning the late Joseph C. Clark, you are advised that the records of this office show one Joseph Charles Clark, Private, 79th Company, 6th Marines, who was killed in action about June 10, 1918, and who is now permanently buried in Grave 77, Row 7, Block A, Aisne-Marne American Cemetery, Belleau, Aisne, France.

On February 24, 1921, the mother of this soldier, Mrs. Delia Jane Clark, 1315 Roe Avenue, Alexandria, Indiana, requested that the body remain in France. Should she now desire to return the remains of her son to this country it would have to be done at her own expense, as the Secretary of War has ruled that no changes in request for the return of remains of our soldier dead to this country would be considered after August 15, 1921, and that no original requests for return of remains would be considered after April 1, 1922.
