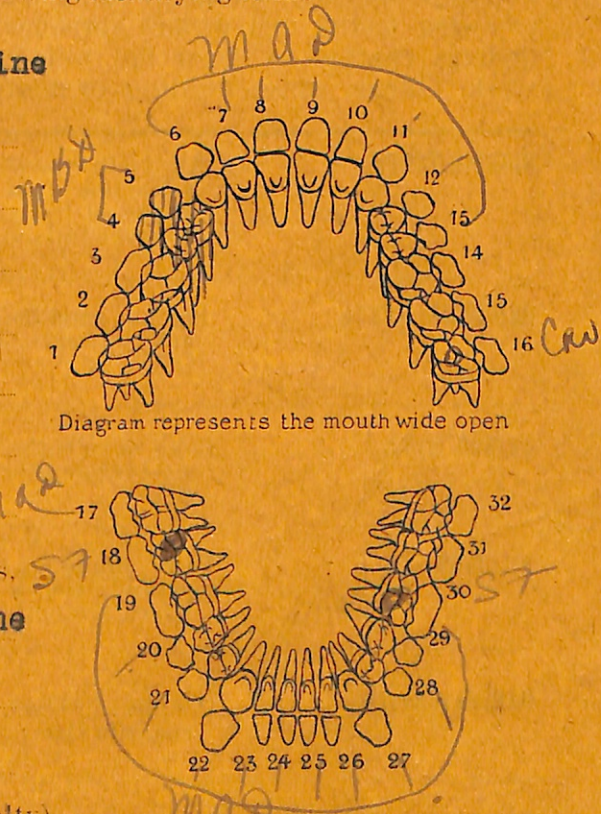


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

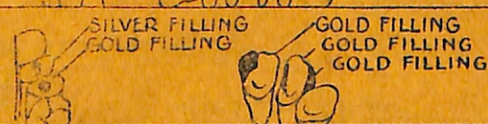

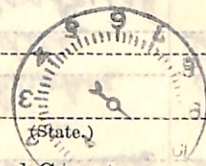

2. Chaplain C.P. Fatcher 109th Infantry submitted Grave Location blank showing Sergeant Edward Stofflet, Howard Delaney, Floyd D. Clegg and Nicola Barlatta, 109th Infantry to be buried in Bois de Rouges (Aisne) in one grave. The grave was opened and found to contain bodies of Sergeant F.A.Harris, Floyd D. Clegg and one unidentified, wither Delaney or Barlatta. The remains of Sergenat Stofflet were removed from another grave.

3. We tood the matter of identifying Delaney and Barlatta up with the Chaplain and he advised as follows:-

"as to finding of body of Sgt. A.F. Harris in this grave state according to our records there has been no soldier in this regiment by that name Delany and Barlatta were both buried in grave containing Stofflet and Clegg on Bois-de-Rougis

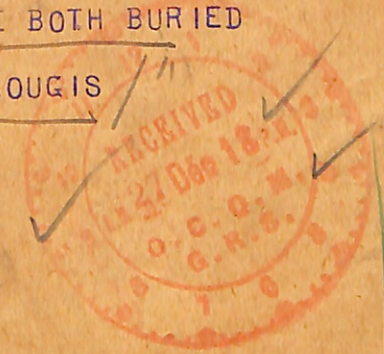

1. We enclose herewith Form #1 Reports covering the disinterrment and reburial of 78 American Soldiers in the American Cemetery at St. Agnan (Aisne), also plan showing location. The owner of the ground is Comte de Cadi, Hotel Ste Catharine, Orleans, Loiret.

2. We would call your attention to report covering burial in grave #42. This body was found buried with P. Clegg and Sgt. F. A. Harris, but no means of identification were found on the body. The marker over the grave contained 4 names, P. Clegg, Sgt. F. A. Harris, Delaney and Barlotta, but only 3 bodies were found and two were identified as Harris and Clegg. Therefore we were unable to state whether body is that of Delaney or Barlotta.
