Dear Madam:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of August 30, 1931, advising that Mrs. Edward King is unable to make a pilgrimage to the grave of the late Private first class John F. Coakley, and requesting that she be allowed a sum of money in lieu thereof.

There is no provision of law which would permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who is unable or does not desire to make the pilgrimage.

The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, provides pilgrimages to the cemeteries of Europe for mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe, and contains no provision whereby the privilege of making the journey may be transferred to a relative or friend in the event the mother or widow is unable or does not desire to take advantage of the offer of the Government. Therefore, it is regretted to advise that the brother or sister of the late Private Coakley cannot make the journey to Europe at the expense of the Government. 0

If, at some time during the summer months of 1932 or 1933, Mrs. King should desire to make the pilgrimage, it is requested that she have the enclosed affidavit forms completed by two persons not related to her and returned to this office in order that her eligibility under the Act may be determined.

Competent personnel will be provided to care for the women making the trip from the time they arrive in New York until they return thereto. Medical attendants and all other necessities will be arranged for and in the event Mrs. King makes the pilgrimage she is assured everything possible will be done for her comfort and welfare. During the summer months of 1930 and 1931 hundreds of

pilgrims of advanced age and in poor health made the journey and appear to have benefited therefrom.

Reference is made to office letter of January 5, 1931, wherein you were requested to furnish affidavits in the event you considered yourself eligible to make a pilgrimage to the grave of the late Private first class John F. An Act of Congress, approved March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, provides for pilgrimages to be made to the cemeteries of Europe by the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces whose remains are interred in Europe or were lost at sea.
