Pvt. Cogswell was killed, on the afternoon of Sept. 28/18 about 4 o'clock outside of Eclisfontaine, France, while advancing thru heavy shell fire from the Germans. Pvt. Cogswell was carrying a message from Sgt. Widen to Corp. Hammons, when he was hit by shrapnel from a bursting shell. We were advancing very rapidly at the time. Pvt. Cogswell's death was instantaneous.
