He had a severe head wound, as a piece of shell penetrated his head, entering at the forehead; he died instantly. Chaplain King held services for him, and he was buried in the cemetery at Thiacourt by a shell and killed instantly.

Pvt Louis Cohendet was killed Sept. 17th that was the morning we relieved the 6th Mar. about 6 or 7 miles beyond Thiaucourt, near Belleveux Farm. We got in about 3 o'clock in the morning. He was a runner and it was while he was showing the respective platoons their places that he was hit by shrapnel and killed. I was an eye witness. The next morning when the show detail went back, they found him in a bottom of a ravine, dead, with a wound in the side of his head and chest. Rudolph Schmidt, a pal of his; identified him. He is buried in a little open place about 100 yards from where he was killed. His home was in Jersey City. He was a blond, rather thin, wore a mustache, and used to be a lithographer. He was of French extraction talked French. He was a good fellow and always obeyed orders. He died a soldier."

Cohendet was the first ~~man~~ man in the company to be killed. The belief is that he was killed by a sniper. It was the first night that we went in and we waited there in the woods ~~in the woods~~ for a while. a short distance from the trenches and it is thought he fell asleep. It wasn't discovered that he was dead till the next morning after we had gone up to the front. They went back and found him there, dead. This was near Thiaucourt, sometime between the 12th or 16th of Sept. He was Lt. Cory's orderly I can't give you anything about his burial.

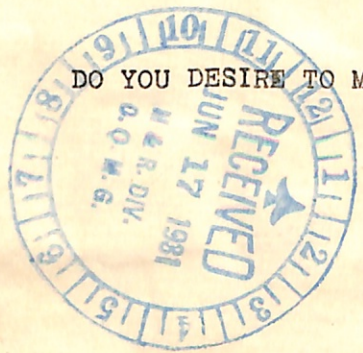

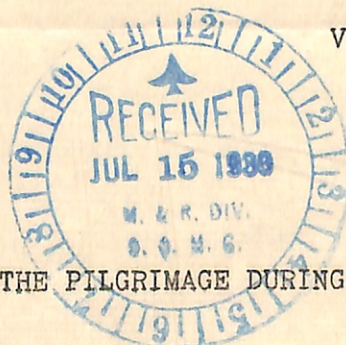

Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of dignified design, with the name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

Please be assured that in effecting removal of the dead, the utmost reverential care was exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

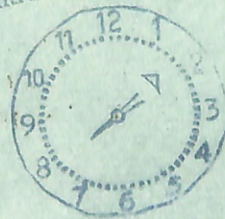

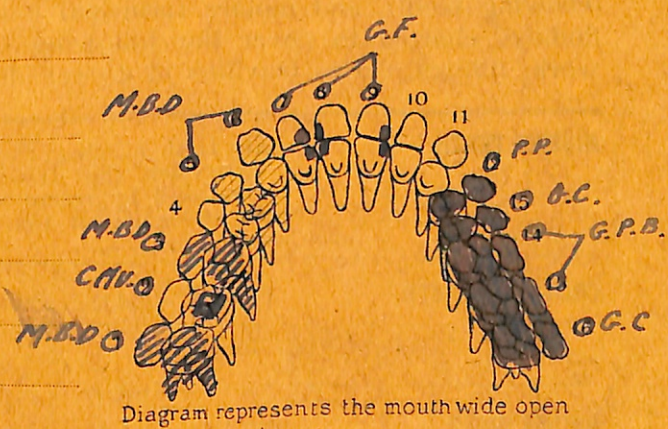
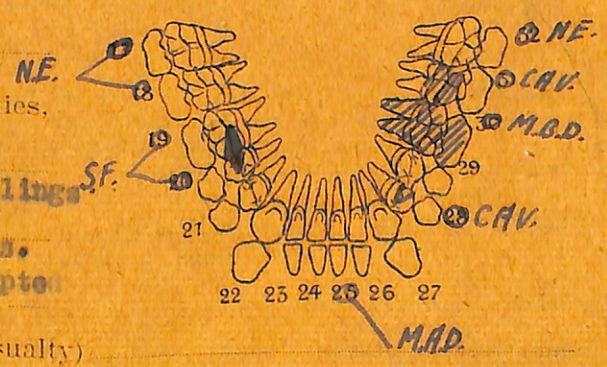


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

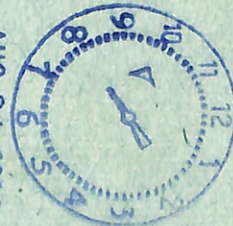

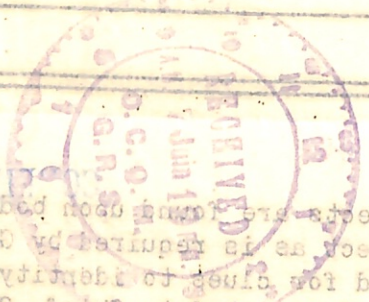
