This office is in receipt of a letter from your son, Mr. Irvin E. Cohn, relative to the pilgrimage you have been invited to make to the grave of the late Private Samuel Cohn, sailing May 17th on the LEVIATHAN.

Plans provide that pilgrimages will be conducted during the months of May, June, July and August of this year. The pilgrimages will be made in groups according to the State from which the mother or widow comes and the cemetery to be visited. Mrs. Hoover made a drawing to determine the order in which the States would be sent and, as Ohio appears fifth on the list, the mothers and widows from Ohio, who are to visit the Meuse Argonne American Cemetery where the remains of your son are interred, are scheduled to sail May 17th. This is a very advantageous time to make the journey, as this group will be at the cemetery on Memorial Day.

It is requested that you advise this office not later than March 15th whether or not you desire to sail May 17th, in order that arrangements may be made for you. In the event you are unable to sail at the designated time, an effort will be made to arrange for you to make the journey at a later date this summer.

The Government can bear no part of the expense of anyone accompanying mothers and widows on the pilgrimage, nor can it make any arrangements for them. Should anyone desire to accompany you at personal expense, it is suggested she communicate with the Roosevelt Steamship Company, #1 Broadway, New York City, who will furnish complete information as to steamship fares and reservations. Arrangements should also be made with the American Express Company, 11 rue Scribe, Paris, France, for hotel accommodations and transportation

abroad. Should she desire to be quartered with you on the journey, she should secure first class accommodations aboard ship and at hotels abroad.

Should anyone plan to accompany you under the above conditions, this office should be so notified.

Under the law no mother or widow can be provided for in Europe at Government expense for a period of more than two weeks, and the Government is absolved of the responsibility of any mother or widow who wilfully remains in Europe beyond the duration of the pilgrimage. Any mother or widow thus extending her stay abroad must personally bear all further expenses of the trip, including return steamship and railroad fare.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of January 20, 1931, advising that your mother, Mrs. Sarah Cohn, will not be able to make the pilgrimage to Europe to visit the grave of her son, the late Private Samuel Cohn, during 1931.

Accordingly, her name has been added to the list of mothers and widows who are eligible to make the journey in 1932, and she will be communicated with when plans are completed for the pilgrimages to be made next year. Under the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, pilgrimages were authorized for the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933.

It is regretted to advise that under the provisions of the law governing the pilgrimages, no extension of time in Europe can be granted to persons making the journey. The passport of each mother and widow will be limited to the duration of the pilgrimage.

While it is probable that a great number of women may desire to take this opportunity to extend their visits in Europe, I am sure you can realize that such action would necessitate special arrangements to take care of the return trip and result in confusion as to passports or travel documents. The law contemplates that the pilgrimage will be made in groups throughout the trip, and in order to make the pilgrimage a success, it will not be possible to grant requests for extensions of time except on the condition that all further expense of the trip after leaving the group to which assigned, including the return transportation, will be borne from private funds.





Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of January 20, 1931, advising that your mother, Mrs. Sarah Cohn, will not be able to make the pilgrimage to Europe to visit the grave of her son, the late Private Samuel Cohn, during 1931.

Accordingly, her name has been added to the list of mothers and widows who are eligible to make the journey in 1932, and she will be communicated with when plans are completed for the pilgrimages to be made next year. Under the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, pilgrimages were authorized for the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933.

It is regretted to advise that under the provisions of the law governing the pilgrimages, no extension of time in Europe can be granted to persons making the journey. The passport of each mother and widow will be limited to the duration of the pilgrimage.
