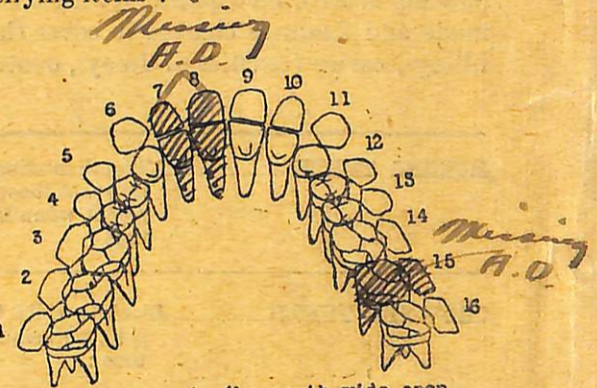
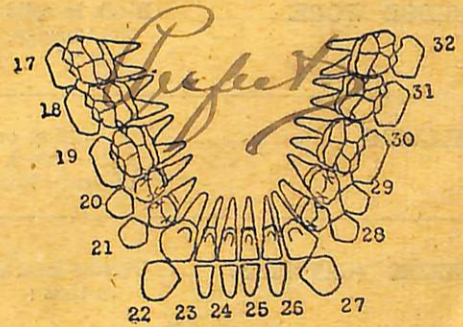


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

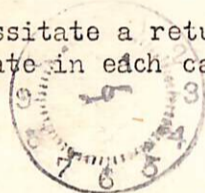

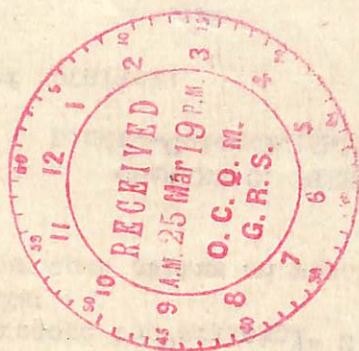

1. In reply to your letter of July 26th, 1920, you are advised that we have on record your request that the body of your son, Pvt. Clyde Comer, be returned to you for private interment.

2. The body of your son was removed from the American Military Cemetery at St. Gengoulph, Aisne, to the American Cemetery at Belleau, Aisne, in order that the remains might receive better care and attention. This removal will, in no way, interfere with the body being returned to you.

3. The bodies, now being returned from France, come from the Zone of the Interior. Both the American Military Cemetery at St. Gengoulph, Aisne, and the American Cemetery at Belleau, Aisne, lie within the Zone of the Armies. Under our agreement with the French Government, operations for the removal of the soldier dead can not begin in this area prior to September 15th, 1920. It will be realized that a reasonable length of time must elapse after this date, before you can expect the return of the remains.

4. You will be notified by telegram, when the body leaves a French port, and again, on its arrival at Hoboken, New Jersey.




