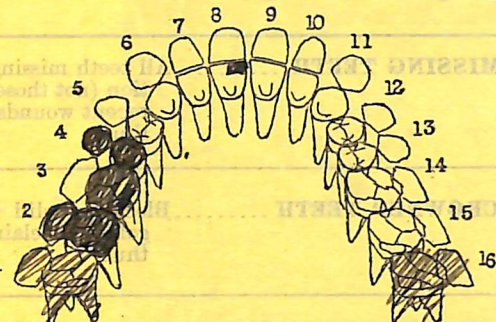
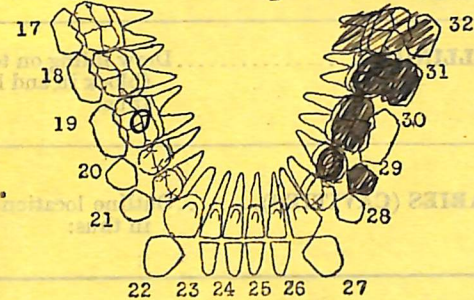


Diagram represents the mouth wide open. 19 cavity, 29,30,31 gold and porcelain bridge, 32 missing before death.
