Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the sister of the late Edward J. Condon, Private, Company E, 102nd Infantry, whose remains are interred in the Flanders Field American Cemetery, Waereghem, Belgium.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". In reply to your letter of August 31, 1920, requesting that the remains of your brother, the late Private Edward Condon, remain undisturbed in the American Military Cemetery at Waereghem, West Flanders, Belgium, where the body is now interred, you are advised that representatives of this Government are negotiating with the French Government with a view toward the removal of American soldier dead from Belgium to American Cemeteries in France and should the conclusion result favorably, the body of your brother will be transferred to one of the three permanent American cemeteries in France, unless you instruct this office that you desire the remains of your brother to be permanently buried in a cemetery in Belgium. If the remains are buried in an American cemetery which will eventually be abandoned and instructions are received for permanent burial in Belgium, the body will be moved at Government expense and it will be necessary for the legal next of kin to assume the care and custody of the grave and the United States Government will be relieved of future responsibility thereof.

2. In view of this information of which you were not previously aware, it is requested that you advise this office whether you desire the remains of this soldier interred in Belgium under these conditions or returned to this country either for private burial or burial in a National Cemetery. Unless further advice is received from you in reference to this matter, instructions will be issued that the remains of this soldier be permanently interred in Belgium.

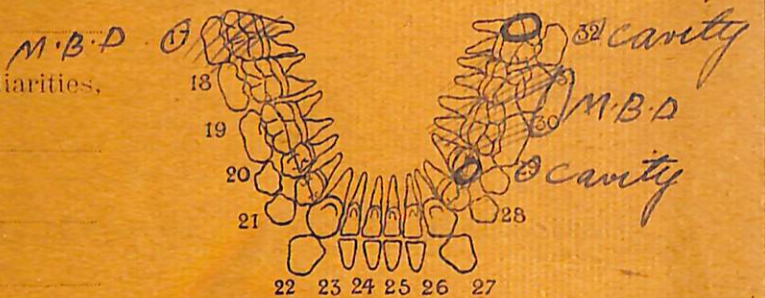
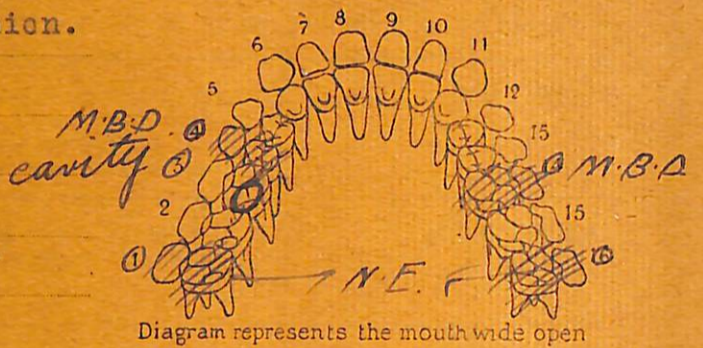


