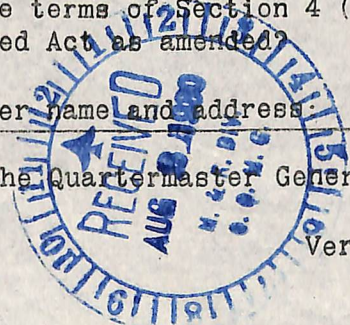

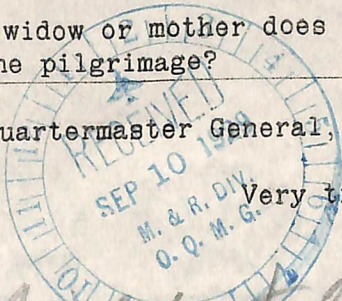

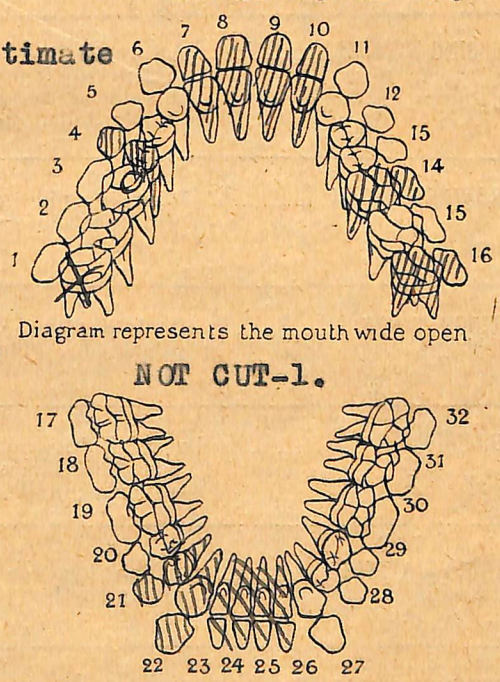


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

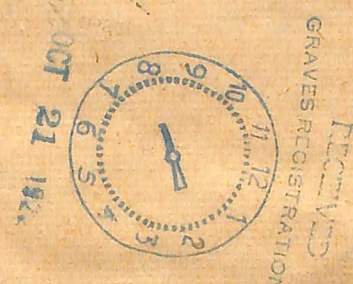

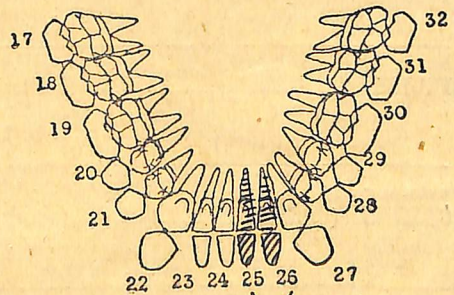
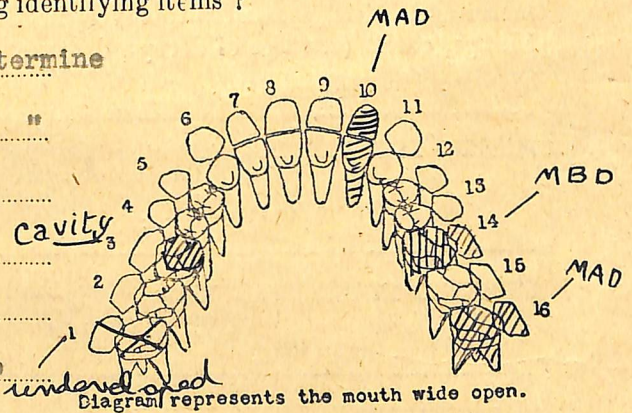

1. Bertie L. Connally was a Private in 141st Infantry, 36th Division, and left the United States about the middle of June, 1918. He was killed in action August 31, 1918. Inasmuch as this division did not get in action until October, 1918, this soldier must have been transferred to another organization. I am told by members of his regiment that about 50 men out of each company were transferred to the 2nd Division immediately after their arrival in France, and it is probable that he was among those so transferred.
