
Dear Sir:

For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

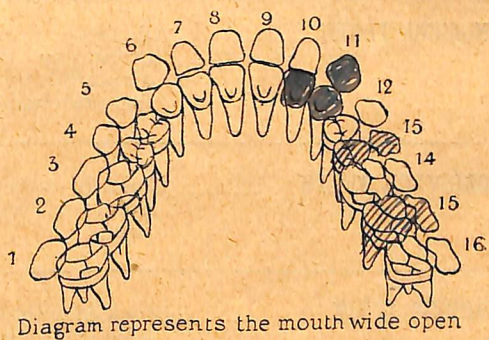
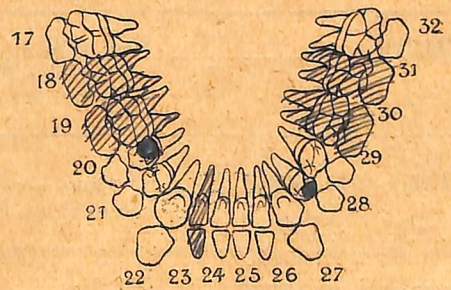


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

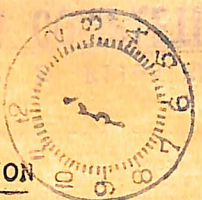
