

"the vicinity of Cornay. The soldiers buried on both sides of U-3427 were also members of Co. M, 327th Inf., as were most of the other burials in this BAC. BAC. 667 is charted on Blue Print A-51".

2. The body description furnished by The Adjutant General indicates the height of Pvt. Connolly as 6 ft. 5 in. Form 16-A, when U-3427 was exhumed July 27, 1921, shows teeth 14, 17, 19 and 30 MBD. while that Form for disinterment made Aug. 24, 1921, lists 14, 19 and 30 MBD. and states 17 not out.

3. It is recommended that a check of all data in your office be made in order to establish whether U-3427 is or is not Pvt. Connolly.

1. In reporting result of search made to find the body of above named casualty, the Investigator who was unsuccessful in locating the grave of the deceased states:-

"Attention is invited to Unknown U.S. Soldier U-3427 brought from Grave 6, BAC Cornay, (Ard.) S5 NW. East 297.3 North 281.3 April 8, 1919. Records show that U-3427 was exhumed Aug. 11, 1920, for purpose of identification with the following results. - Body about 5' 8", badly decomposed, buried in full uniform and slicker, issue woolen gloves on hands, scapula around neck, GRS. plaque with body read: "A. Solomon, killed in action Oct. 14, 1918, teeth chart taken" Lieut. O'Neil.

Body was again exhumed Aug. 24, 1921 by Group 1, Field Section 3, with following results: "Shoes approximately size 6. Bottle record found on body read: Metal plaque on body read: A. Solomon, killed in action -- 14, 1918, and on reverse side, Solomon".

This body was exhumed 7/27/21 by Group 6, Field Section 9, which found two collar ornaments in pocket of blouse, USNA. and -- 327 crossed rifles --M, and G.R.S. plaque on body reading: A. Solomon, Killed in action -- 14th, 1918, Reverse side: Solomon, rosary beads on body and one Lt. bar in pocket.

It is the opinion that U-3427 are the remains of Pvt. 1/cl. Patrick Connolly, Co. M, 327th Inf. Pvt. Connolly had teeth #14, 19 and 30 missing on date of enlistment. Tooth chart for U-3427 shows teeth #14, 19 and 30 MBD. Pvt. Connolly's height is given as 5' 6", weight 129 lbs., hair brown. U-3427 was estimated as about 5' 8" upon examination of remains on Aug. 11, 1920. Size of shoes is given as approximately size 6 upon examination Aug. 24, 1921, which would tend to show him as a small man. Hair is given as apparently light brown. Scapula was found around neck on Aug. 11, 1920, which would tend to show that this man was a catholic. Collar ornaments USNA. and Co. M, 327 Inf. tend to show that U-3427 was a casualty from Co. M, 327th Inf., and Pvt. 1/cl. Connolly is the only member of Co. M, 327th Inf. missing in





INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".
 (b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No. 6.
6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). Case of A. Soloman:

Our records show one Arthur Sloman, #1208645 Pvt. Co. K, 106 Infantry, who died 9/27/18 of wounds received in action. Buried in Gr. #5, Row B, Plot L, Villers Faucon, Br. Mil. Cty. #625 and reburied 5/14/19 in Gr. #111, Row 5, Plot D, Bony, Mil. Cty. #636. This body had tags.

2 We also have record of one A. Soloman who was K/a 11/18/18 and buried in /Gr. #6, Plot 1, Amer. B/A Cty. #667, Cornay, Ardennes and reburied 4/8/19 in Gr. #186, Sec. 29, Plt 4, Argonne.

The J.W.B. has evidently confused these two cases in their records as they say A. Soloman, Pvt. Co.K, 106 Inf. DWRIA 9/27/18.

The burial is reported by form 1-A #3446 as A. Soloman, no further information and no tag on gr. mkr.

The form-16 reports Soloman A., reburied in Gr. #186, Sec. 29, Plot 4, Argonne, no tag on body and no officers insignia.

The form 1-A #10702 reports A. Soloman reburied in Gr. #186 with tag to cross. (Note Paragraphs 4 and 5).

No Searchers or Chaplains report of this case, but there is a Chaplains report for Arthur Sloman, #1208645, above mentioned.

With the file papers is a report by Sgt. Scott, Group 3, Unit 305, very similiar to the GRS form-1. This slip reports Soloman A., K/A 10/14/18, buried in Gr. #6, Plot 1, 20 yds. S. of road, 300 Yds. S. of Cornay, 35 NW: E-297.3 N-281.3. Identified by clothing.

The sketch and Cmme. lists for Cornay were looked over, all different organizations noted and Searchers reports for each Division (77, 78, 80, 82, 90, 35 and 37) were searched without results. The Chaplains reports for these Divisions were gone over carefully for record of A. Soloman or similiar name. Also for any record having Soloman as a first name. None found but a few which were similiar were traced far enough to proove to be other cases.
