Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

Please be assured that in effecting removal of the dead, the utmost reverential care was exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

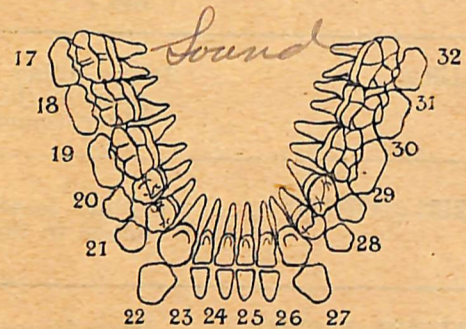
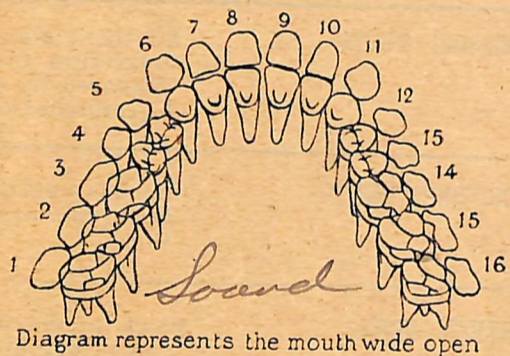

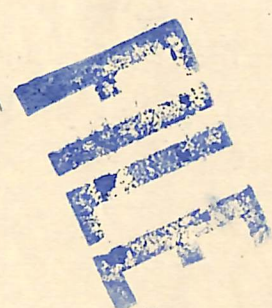

1. Reference letter Cem. Div., Hoboken, dated February 23, 1921, File No. 293.8, to this office, wherein it was directed that we communicate with next of kin of the above deceased soldier, you are advised that a letter was written, as instructed, to Mr. Salvatore Consorte, Contrada Fontonelle, Chieti, Abruzzi, Italy, on March 25, 1921. A reply was received from the above April 6, 1921, requesting remains be left where buried. We replied on April 15, 1921, to same, stating it was not the policy of the Service to leave an isolated grave and requesting further expression of desires. The first follow-up letter was sent on June 12, 1921, inclosing our official form certificate for execution, and the second follow-up letter August 30, 1921.

No replies having been received to these latter letters, the remains of the above-deceased soldier will be left in France for final burial in a permanent American cemetery.

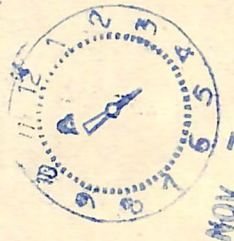



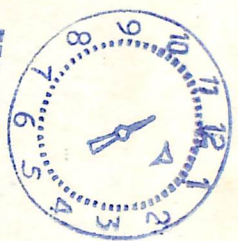

This Government bears all expense in connection with the transfer of the body.

Should you desire to have the body removed to Italy for reburial such transfer will be subject to the health regulations and sanitation laws of France and Italy, and should the operation of such instrumentalities prevent the removal of the body in the manner desired, it will remain in the care and custody of the American Graves Registration Service in Europe and will be cared for under the supervision of this Government.

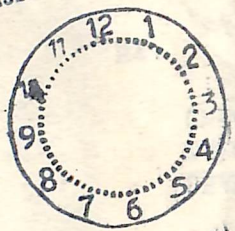
