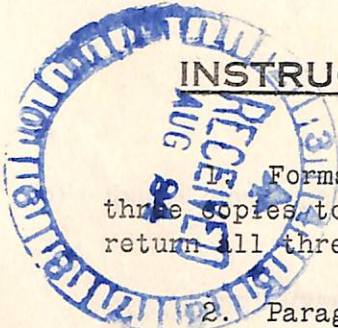

He told me he was done for, but I tried to cheer him up and said for him to hurry back to the outfit as we didn't want to lose a man like him. He received 1st aid immediately and as soon as he was fixed up, I sent to the 1st aid station by a Marine who was carrying back prisoners. I heard with regret of his death from his wounds.
