Case of Private Josef Hanna, 2432619, Company K, 101st Infantry, now buried in Grave 83, Row 14, Block D, St. Mihiel American Cemetery:

Form 1-A, records the original burial of Private Hanna in isolated grave, Commune Mouilly, Meuse, 52 N.W., N-341.14, N.251.39. Form 16, dated June 5, 1919, records reburial from isolated grave, Les Eparges, Meuse, 52 N.W., E-342.3, N.242.2, to grave 172, Section 5, Plot 4, St. Mihiel American Cemetery, #1233. Form 114-B, records the original burial as grave 5, Bois de Versel, Meuse, N-242.2, E-342.3.

Case of Private Otis E. Cook, 114022, Company B, 151 Machine Gun Battalion.

Form 1-A, records the original burial of Private Cook in grave 3, isolated, Comm. St. Benoit en Woivre, Meuse, 52 NW, E-358.76, N-245.24. Form 16, dated June 6, 1919, records reburial from grave number not given, A.C.F. Cemetery, St. Benoit, M-st-M, 52 NE, E-358.8, N. 245.4. Original Form 114-B, records the burial in grave 1, Hattonchatel, Meuse, 52 NW, N-245.03, E.358.8. This office has no record of burial in this Commune. The body of Private Cook, was reburied from original grave location into grave 141, Section 10, Plot 3, Cemetery #1233, then concentrated into grave 23, block C, Row 13, Cemetery #1233.

Case of Mechanic George D. Dreslin, 2363506, Company F, 60 Infantry.

Form 1-A, dated January 21, 1919, records the burial of Mechanic Dreslin in grave 1, Preny, Meurthe-et-Moselle, Cemetery, 52 NE, E-367.5, N-242.6. Form 16, dated June 25, 1919, records reburial from Preny, M-st-M, 52 NE, E-367.3, N-242.6, no grave number given, to grave 205, Section 18, Plot 4, Cemetery #1233, St. Mihiel American Cemetery. Form 114-B, recording the permanent burial in grave 5, block C, row 5, St. Mihiel American Cemetery, gives the original burial as isolated, Jaulny, M-st-M, 52 NE, N-242.42, E-367.70.

Case of Private, first class, Herbert M. P. Cocker, 1750255, Company B, 311 Infantry.
Form 1-A and Form 16 give the original burial for Private, First class, Cocker in Freny, M-et-M, 52 NE, 368.5E, 241.6N. Form 114-B records the original grave location as isolated grave near Thiaucourt, M-et-M, N-241.46, E.362.03.

Case of Private Benny Paul, 756802, Company K, 11th Infantry.
Form 1-A records the original burial in grave 5, isolated, Commune of Regnieville, M-et-M, 52 NE, N-236.5, E-368.1, C-127. Form 16, dated June 11, 1919, records the same information, except the grave number was not mentioned. Form 114-B records the original grave location as grave 28, Bois-de-Prezle, M-et-M, 236.5N, 368.1

Case of Captain Fritz L. Dressler, Office Chief Quartermaster.
The records of this office show the original grave location of Captain Dressler as grave 66, plot B, Cemetery 58, St. Symphorien (Tours), Indre-et-Loire. Form 114-B, gives his original grave location as Grave 68. The records here show that 2nd Lieutenant Warren B. Leonard, 2nd Aviation Instruction Center, was returned from grave 68, with no record of any discrepancy. 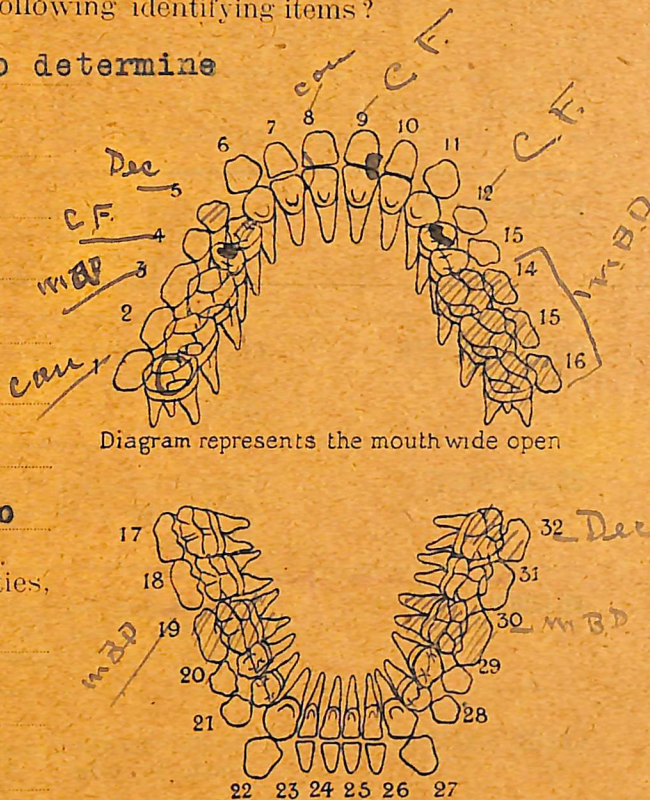

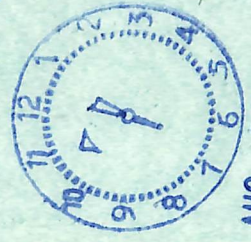

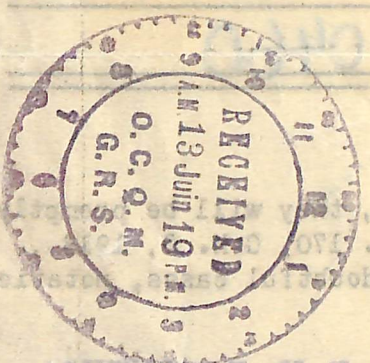
