He was seriously wounded about 5:30 A.M.,September 12th,1918 when the piece on which he was No.1-Fires the piece-blew up,I was talking to the Battery Commander,when a man from the gun Crew came down and reported the gun blown up,both of us then went to the scene of the accident immediately and I assisted in helping Coulson out of the gun pit and it seemed as if his right arm was broken and wounded in the right shoulder.He was consciende and in high spirits at the time he was taken to the dressing station.

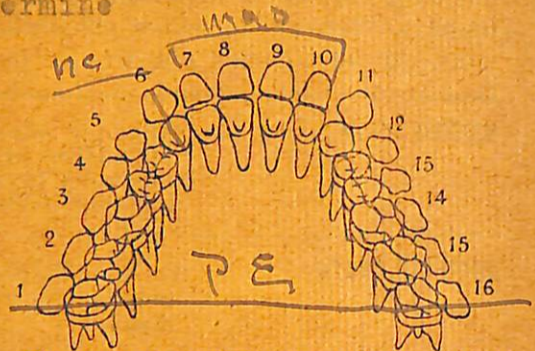
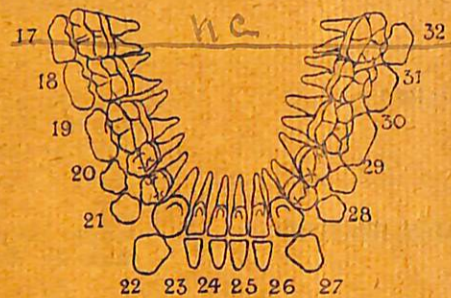


Diagram represents the mouth wide open
