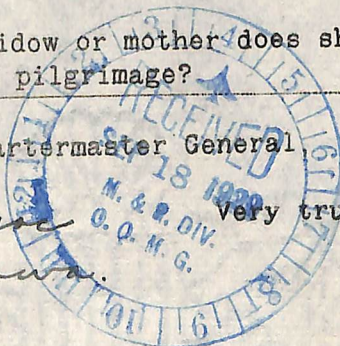

part of relatives.

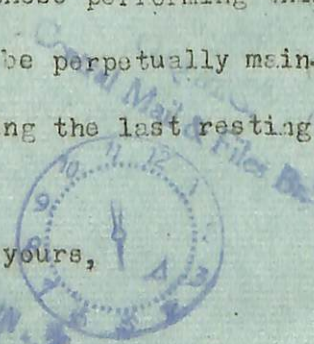
In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were

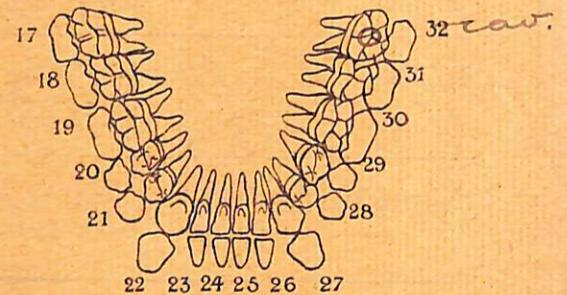
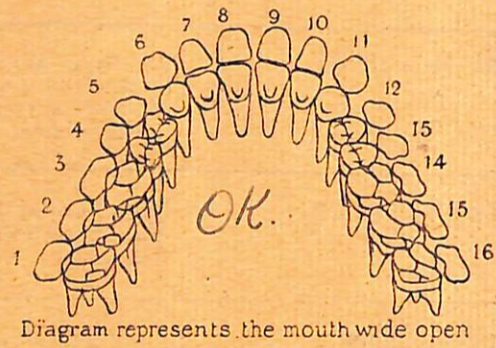
