The citation accompanying the award describes the effective action which Colonel Mausert took on 28 May 1951, resulting in the routing of an enemy group which had halted the progress of an infantry-armored task force enroute from Charen-ri to Kaesong, Korea. Moving toward the head of the halted column, Colonel Mausert, despite intense enemy fire, ordered a flank

attack which routed the enemy.

Colonel Mausert, a native of North Adams, Mass., served with the 26th Infantry Division, Massachusetts National Guard, as an enlisted man, and later was commissioned. In 1943, he served with the Airborne Command and the XVIII Airborne Corps. After wartime service in the European Theater, he was assigned to the 187th Infantry. In October, 1946, he assumed command of the 3rd Battalion, 187th Infantry Division, a position which he filled until he was assigned to the Research and Development Board, his present assignment.

Sgt. May, the son of Mrs. Edna M. May of East Bridgeport, Mass., contracted the dread disease at the age of eight and after a long hard fight has now fully recovered, and is a full fledged paratrooper, with over 50 parachute jumps to his credit. He enlisted in the Army at Boston in April of 1946. After finishing basic training, he volunteered for

parachute training. Sgt. May has also proved to be one of the outstanding athletes at Fort Bragg. In 1948 and 1949, he was a starting half-back of the 82nd Airborne Division's All-American, a football team that lost only two games in these two years. During the 1950 season, May was an outstanding back and the high scorer on the Post, while playing with the unbeaten, United 505th Airborne Infantry Panthers. He scored a total of 115 points, most of them on breakway runs. After visiting with Sgt. May, little Harry Garza, son of Sgt. and Mrs. Guillerm B. Garza of Balanger, Texas, has received much inspiration for the future.
