Since the 12th of July 1949, a few weeks after the lifting of the Berlin blockade, a new unpublicized supply line to Berlin has been in regular operation, hauling hundreds of tons of Class 1, 2, and 4, supplies by road convoy. The "Berlin Road Lift" as it is known to many, consists of a convoy of approximately fifty trucks and trailers, which makes the round trip per week between Giessen and Berlin. During the period 12 July - 17 October, some 2,264 tons of supplies were hauled involving a total mileage of over 600,000 miles.

REHABILITATION

At Walter Reed Army Hospital, Washington, D. C., one of the nation's leading military hospitals, six-hundred young men wounded in Korea are undergoing various phases of rehabilitation. In this process the soldiers are learning to eat, write and work with artificial arms -- walking, dancing and engaging in active out-of-door sports with synthetic legs -- and, earnestly striving to rebuild shattered muscles. In addition, the hospital is offering these veterans daily classes designed to improve their education during their periods of treatment. These include English, history, shorthand, typing, bookkeeping and other practical studies, and are supplemented by college subjects for those seeking higher education.
