Dear Franklin:

Upon examining the New York State transfer tax proceeding in your father's estate on file in the Surrogate's Court here, I found --

1. The decree was made and entered on April 20, 1901 fixing the tax not only on your mother's life interest but also upon the remainder. A certified copy is enclosed herewith.

2. The report of the appraiser dated April 19, 1901 contains the following statement:

"Third: The decedent died seized of certain real estate situate in the Town of Hyde Park, Dutchess County, New York, which was devised to his widow Sara Delano Roosevelt and his sons J. Roosevelt Roosevelt and Franklin D. Roosevelt, but that the transfer thereof is not subject to the payment of a transfer tax."

Your father died on Dec. 8, 1900 and the transfer of real property to direct relatives was first made subject to tax by Chapter 41 of the Laws of that year, effective March 16th. Therefore, as the title to the real property passed under your father's Will in 1900 and it was not subject to a tax at that time, it is not now subject to a New York estate tax.

Also enclosed herewith are copies of letters just received from the Museum of the City of New York and The Metropolitan Museum of Art.

I hope that you may be able to see me at Hyde Park next week.

My dear Mr. Buckett:

I beg to write you on behalf of the Trustees of the Barn Delano Roosevelt Trust set up under the will of James Roosevelt probated in 1900. As you will see, this Trust has been in force for 40 years but was not fully set up until 1903. The first trustees were Warren Delano, James R. Roosevelt, and Franklin D. Roosevelt. My brother, Warren Delano, died in September 1930, and some months after that I was named trustee in his place. Subsequently, Mr. James R. Roosevelt died (I forget the exact date) and Mr. Curtis B. Dell was named in his place. The bookkeeper for the Trust for the first 20 years was Mr. Alphonse T. Barry, and he was succeeded by Mr. Charles O. Miller, who was Mr. Barry's assistant during the latter part of his life. During the years I have been familiar with the Trust, an annual statement has been made to the beneficiary and trustees.

I call your attention to the 17 pages which give in detail all the essential figures, but if there is anything in this statement that is not entirely clear, I would be glad to explain it.

Page 1 gives a summary of the cash and securities in the Trust as originally set up, showing cash received and securities received or purchased; also, the total of the income received and the payments from income.

Page 2 gives the detailed list of bonds and stocks acquired up to December, 1900, and cash received subsequently from the estate of James Roosevelt.

Page 3 gives an inventory of all securities in the trust on the date of Mrs. Barn Delano Roosevelt's death on September 7, 1941, and the market value thereof.

On page 4 you will find some notes and explanations in re the foregoing inventory. In this connection I would call your attention to the shares in the Radio Corporation of America, which is explained on page 4. The Trust received in the form of dividends from the General Electric Company 298-4/6 shares of the stock of the Radio Corporation of America. 125-4/6 shares were sold in 1933, as explained. At that time I had hoped to sell all of this stock at ten dollars or better because it was not, in my opinion, income producing stock. Apparently, the General Electric Company did not want to hold this stock in its treasury and decided to distribute it. At the same time, the Radio Corporation has been managed not as an income producing company, per se, but as a research corporation which might in time yield very valuable assets. I do not know whether the sale of the 125 shares can be questioned, but we have in the Trust a receipt signed by Mrs. Barn Delano Roosevelt stating that in the event this dividend was deemed to be part of the principal Trust, she or her estate would reimburse the Trust for the payment made to her in 1933.

Pages 6-7 give detailed figures of the securities sold and their cost.

Pages 8-9 give a total list of securities purchased and their cost.

Pages 10-11 show profit and loss statement on all securities bought and sold.

Page 12 gives some detailed notes with reference to schedule of profit and loss on sales of securities.

Page 13 gives a list of miscellaneous charges and credits to the principal account.

Page 14 gives an annual statement of dividends and bond interest, plus interest on bank balances received in the years 1903 to September 7, 1941, incl.

Page 15 gives details of total dividends received on each of the stocks held in the Trust.

My dear Mr. Hackett:

I have written a formal letter transmitting the report of the Trustees in the Sara Delano Roosevelt Trust, covering the period from 1900 to September 7, 1941, and I am sending a copy to my co-Trustees. You will note particularly from page 17 that the Trustees have never received anything as Trustees of this fund. It was not my brother's intention to ask anything, and I certainly have never had any such intention. As the difficulties of operating this Trust have increased as the years have passed, I feel that a modest payment might properly be paid to the bookkeeper who has handled the books, tax matters, etc., of this Trust for some 20 years or more, often working outside of regular office hours to do it; and I think it would be justifiable to pay him a modest fee, say not over \$1000, but perhaps not less than \$500. I do not know whether this is in any sense appropriate for me to suggest, but I believe it is justifiable.

You will notice that prior to 1922 the only office charges made for a number of years was \$25 a month. This sum was entirely inadequate, and in 1923 I increased the charge somewhat, and later in 1929 fixed it at what I thought was something like an equitable basis. In other words, \$90 a month was charged to cover desk room and clerical hire in the New York office of the Delano Coal Company and the New Boston Land Company. As I have not been even a stockholder of the Delano Coal Company for a number of years, I may truly say that desk room in New York was maintained by me solely on account of my services as Trustee for Mrs. Forbes and Mrs. Roosevelt, both of whom are now dead.

Dear Uncle Fred:-

Thank you much for sending me the copy of the accounting of the Trustees of the Sara Delano Roosevelt Trust. I think that you, who might be called "the management Trustees", should have all the possible credit for carrying this Trust in such excellent condition through all these later difficult years. That the principle and the income have both increased and been guarded through the years represents an exception to the general rule of Trust Funds, much as I regret having to make the comparison.

It occurs to me that it would be an awfully nice thing if the beneficiaries -- Helen Robinson, J. R. Roosevelt, Jr., and myself -- were to give some token of our appreciation to Mr. Charles G. Miller who has had so much of the day-in-and-day-out handling of the physical work involved. Perhaps it might be difficult to get the approval of J. R. R., Jr., to this, but I am very certain that Helen would join with me in such an expression of our appreciation.

I wish you would let me know your thought on this and what you think would be the most appropriate thing that we could do.

I wholly agree with your thought in your letter to Henry Hackett that this should

consist of a modest fee, and I wholly approve the idea of \$1,000, as I think it is absolutely justified. I do not know whether this should come from the Trust before distribution or from the beneficiaries after distribution. Hackett would know this.

Of course, you are absolutely right about the monthly charge for desk room and clerical hire.

These amounts were paid to the beneficiary and no record appears anywhere in this accounting of these amounts, it being the idea of the Trustees that they were merely acting as agents for the beneficiary in making these sales. The balance of the stock, 173 shares, was never transferred out of the name of the Trustees and appears on the inventory at its cost for 1933 tax purposes of \$3.9375 per share.

Originally Central & South American Telegraph of which 64 shares were received from the Estate of James Roosevelt in 1900. 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ shares were purchased and 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ shares received as stock dividends. In 1920, 183 shares were exchanged for 183 shares of All America Cables. Stock dividends from All America Cables amounted to 36-6/10 shares, 19-6/10 shares being subsequently sold. The 200 shares of All America Cables were exchanged for a like number of shares International Telephone & Telegraph Co. A stock dividend of 66 shares and a purchase of 10 brought the holdings to 276 shares, after which a 3 for 1 split boosted this to 828 shares and a later purchase added 30 more.
- (e) Mahoning Investment Co.
2 $\frac{1}{2}$ shares purchased and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ shares received as a dividend from Buffalo, Rochester & Pittsburgh Rwy.
- (f) National Realty Co.
Records show 60 shares redeemed at \$3.00 per share. Can find no record of it on the inventory or of purchase. May have been a stock dividend or a realization from something previously considered worthless.

I do not think there will be much more necessity for additional checks to be signed by the President; but we are sending off our last one today, and I am therefore enclosing three more, to-wit, Nos. 273-274-275, for his signature. These, of course, may not be needed. If and when the President signs them, please send them to Mr. C. G. Miller in the enclosed envelope.
