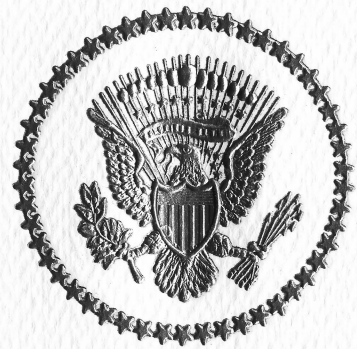

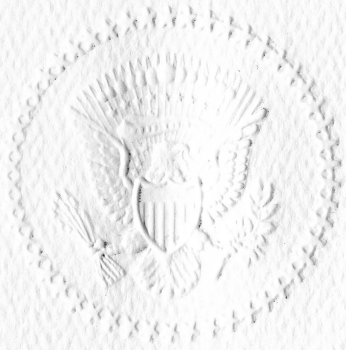

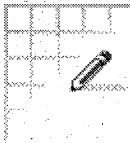

"But by day four, his feet were on the ground, his bearing set: a late bloomer blossoming in the nick of time. From a pulpit in Washington, he led the country in graceful prayer. From atop Manhattan's smoldering 'pile,' megaphone in hand, he roused the crowd of rescue workers in the manner of the Andover cheerleader he once was. At a gut-wrenching private meeting, Bush cried along with the families of dead firemen as they shared their stories. Working the phone at all hours, he put military and world leaders through a to-do list of astonishing length at astonishing speed. And the commitment of our fathers is now the calling of our time.' When the son returned to the pew, his father patted him on the had as if to say, 'Well done.' And the country, gladly, agreed."

REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT
AT NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER AND REMEMBRANCE SERVICE

THE PRESIDENT: We are here in the middle hour of our grief. So many have suffered so great a loss, and today we express our nation's sorrow. We come before God to pray for the missing and the dead, and for those who love them.

On Tuesday, our country was attacked with deliberate and massive cruelty. We have seen the images of fire and ashes, and bent steel.

Now come the names, the list of casualties we are only beginning to read. They are the names of men and women who began their day at a desk or in an airport, busy with life. They are the names of people who faced death, and in their last moments called home to say, be brave, and I love you.

They are the names of passengers who defied their murderers, and prevented the murder of others on the ground. They are the names of men and women who wore the uniform of the United States, and died at their posts.

They are the names of rescuers, the ones whom death found

running up the stairs and into the fires to help others. We will read all these names. We will linger over them, and learn their stories, and many Americans will weep.

To the children and parents and spouses and families and friends of the lost, we offer the deepest sympathy of the nation. And I assure you, you are not alone.

Just three days removed from these events, Americans do not yet have the distance of history. But our responsibility to history is already clear: to answer these attacks and rid the world of evil.

War has been waged against us by stealth and deceit and murder. This nation is peaceful, but fierce when stirred to anger. This conflict was begun on the timing and terms of others. It will end in a way, and at an hour, of our choosing.

Our purpose as a nation is firm. Yet our wounds as a people are recent and unhealed, and lead us to pray. In many of our prayers this week, there is a searching, and an honesty. At St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York on Tuesday, a woman said, "I prayed to God to give us a sign that He is still here." Others have prayed for the same, searching hospital to hospital, carrying pictures of those still missing.

God's signs are not always the ones we look for. We learn in tragedy that his purposes are not always our own. Yet the prayers of private suffering, whether in our homes or in this great cathedral, are known and heard, and understood.

There are prayers that help us last through the day, or endure the night. There are prayers of friends and strangers, that give us strength for the journey. And there are prayers that yield our will to a will greater than our own.

This world He created is of moral design. Grief and tragedy and hatred are only for a time. Goodness, remembrance, and love have no end. And the Lord of life holds all who die, and all who mourn.

It is said that adversity introduces us to ourselves. This is true of a nation as well. In this trial, we have been reminded, and the world has seen, that our fellow Americans are generous and kind, resourceful and brave. We see our national character in rescuers working past exhaustion; in long lines of blood donors; in thousands of citizens who have asked to work and serve in any way possible.

And we have seen our national character in eloquent acts of

sacrifice. Inside the World Trade Center, one man who could have saved himself stayed until the end at the side of his quadriplegic friend. A beloved priest died giving the last rites to a firefighter. Two office workers, finding a disabled stranger, carried her down sixty-eight floors to safety. A group of men drove through the night from Dallas to Washington to bring skin grafts for burn victims.

In these acts, and in many others, Americans showed a deep commitment to one another, and an abiding love for our country. Today, we feel what Franklin Roosevelt called the warm courage of national unity. This is a unity of every faith, and every background.

It has joined together political parties in both houses of Congress. It is evident in services of prayer and candlelight vigils, and American flags, which are displayed in pride, and wave in defiance.

Our unity is a kinship of grief, and a steadfast resolve to prevail against our enemies. And this unity against terror is now extending across the world.

America is a nation full of good fortune, with so much to be grateful for. But we are not spared from suffering. In every generation, the world has produced enemies of human freedom. They have attacked America, because we are freedom's home and defender. And the commitment of our fathers is now the calling of our time.

On this national day of prayer and remembrance, we ask almighty God to watch over our nation, and grant us patience and resolve in all that is to come. We pray that He will comfort and console those who now walk in sorrow. We thank Him for each life we now must mourn, and the promise of a life to come.

As we have been assured, neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, can separate us from God's love. May He bless the souls of the departed. May He comfort our own. And may He always guide our country.

God bless America.

We are here in the middle hour of our grief. So many have suffered so great a loss, and today we express the Nation's sorrow. We come before God to pray for the missing and the dead, and for those who love them.

On Tuesday, our country was attacked with deliberate and massive cruelty. We have seen the images of fire and ashes and bent steel. Now come the names – the list of casualties we are only beginning to read.

They are the names of men and women who began their day at a desk or at an airport, busy with life.

They are the names of people who faced death, and in their last moments called home to say, "Be brave," and "I love you."

They are the names of passengers who defied their murderers, and prevented the murder of others on the ground.

They are the names of men and women who wore the uniform of the United States, and died at their posts.

They are the names of rescuers – the ones whom death found running up the stairs and into the fires to help others.

We will all read these names. We will linger over them, and learn their stories. And many Americans will weep. To the children, and parents, and spouses, and families, and friends of the lost, we offer the deepest sympathy of the Nation. And I assure you: You are not alone.

Just three days removed from these events, Americans do not yet have the distance of history. 'You can't stop us,' New Yorkers vo

Destruction of skyline changes people's outlook

NEW YORK — This famously hard-boiled city was a place of fragile hope and gnawing fear on the day after its worst tragedy, as the emotional shock sank in and the missing slowly became the dead.

New Yorkers tried to go about their lives Wednesday, the way the mayor told them to, to strike back at the ter-

rorists who used passenger airliners to destroy Manhattan's two tallest buildings.

"We're gonna rebuild," Mayor Rudy Giuliani said. "We're gonna come out of this stronger than we were before. ... You can't stop us."

Giuliani vowed to "bring the city back to normal as soon as possible" and urged people to get out to eat or shop — to "not let these cowards affect us."

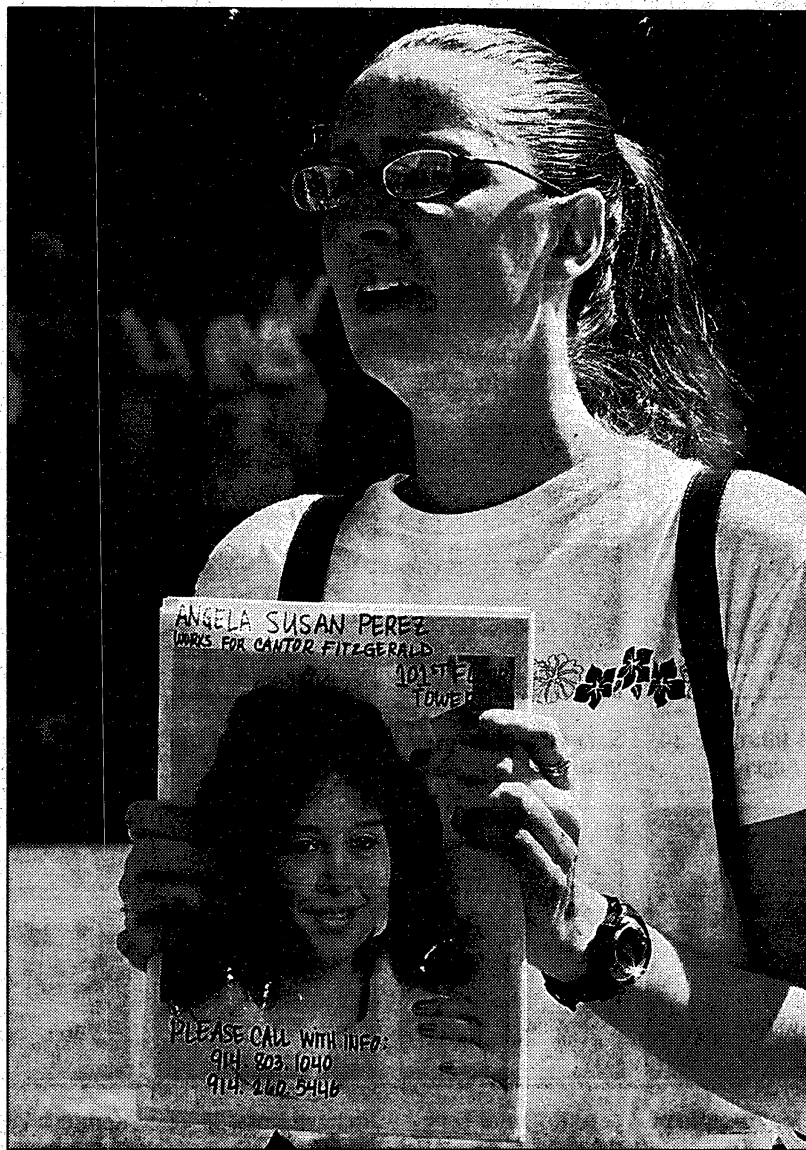
But they had. The emergency turned New York not into a ghost town but something worse — a city of sadness, fear and loss. The realization that thousands are likely dead crept across the city like the acrid smoke that wafted northward across the island.

Friends and relatives of the missing roamed from hospital to hospital, searching for news of relatives and co-workers. They clutched photographs, from family snapshots to formal wedding portraits, and held them up before TV cameras. They passed out homemade fliers or simply held up pieces of paper inscribed with a single name.

So many people are searching — more than 2,400 have gone to hospitals since the disaster — that the city will open an armory today as an information center for families.

Saul Zelmanowitz of Queens told the somber story of his missing uncle, Zelmanowitz. Abe called his family from his workplace on the 7th floor of one of the towers of the World Trade Center after the evacuation began Tuesday. He was staying with a quadriplegic co-worker. "We were being urged to leave," his mother pleaded with him, Saul Zelmanowitz said. "But he was steadfast that he wouldn't leave his friend."

Maria Santillan, 27, of Parsippany, N.J., worked for bond firm Cantor Fitzgerald on the 103rd floor of one tower. "She

called her father on an office phone and said, 'Dad, a plane just hit our building. I have to go. I have to go,' said Darren Sasso, her fiancé of 8 months. "And that was it."

Like New York itself, the World Trade Center drew people of all stripes.

Thiam Fallou, 41, a Senegalese cab driver, awaited word of friends who worked as security guards in the complex. Two were from Mali, three from Ghana, one from Senegal and one from the Ivory Coast. "I keep calling, there's no answer. I don't know where they are," he said. "I cannot think straight right now."

He wasn't alone. For years, New Yorkers coming above ground from the subway have oriented themselves by looking for the World Trade Center. Now the cityscape has changed.

Tribeca, a neighborhood of chic res-

taurants and million-dollar loft apartments, was deserted, covered in ash and patrolled by National Guard troops in Humvees. In Washington Square Park, pedestrians covered their faces with scarves from the smoke.

Schools, museums, courts and libraries were closed, as were the very symbols of New York: the stock exchange, the Empire State Building, the Staten Island Ferry. Broadway theaters were dark.

But there were signs of a return to normal. Many of the city's bridges and tunnels re-opened. A production of *Carmen* at the City Centre theater went on as scheduled. Movies and popcorn were free at a multiplex in Union Square.

Playgrounds like the one at Clement Clarke Moore Park, more than 2 miles north of the World Trade Center site,

were full of parents and children found themselves at liberty for the first time. When a troupe of dusty, weary firefighters walked by, people erupted in applause.

New Yorkers reacted to the tragedy by doing what they do they best: talking about it.

"It's pretty much the only conversation," said Columbia University grad student Ryan Just. "Other things (like school) are more of a distraction."

"Everyone is moving about, but except no one stops talking where they were when it happened," said Holly Hughes, a magazine editor who spent Wednesday lugging a Gatorade to an emergency shelter.

At a sidewalk cafe near Columbia University, two couples discussed missing friends. "We don't even talk to each other, and we've been together for 20 minutes," said Liz Streitz, 30.

"New Yorkers are now making contact with each other," said Coleman, 31, a vice president at Nickelodeon television network.

And they are trying to help. Larger efforts and smaller ones have been organized. Le Cirque, one of the city's fanciest restaurants, sent sandwiches to workers at St. Vincent's Hospital. Outside the hospital, volunteers to sort donated clothing, blood or whatever was needed stretched down the block.

"Like everyone else I just want to help," actress Kathleen Chalfant said. "This is the fourth time I've been here."

The oddly slow pace of the recovery of the disaster zone brought a sense of loss to sink in and a wish to see the dead to rest.

Urban Express messenger Ryan Rodriguez, 40, delivered packages to investment firm Morgan Stanley in the trade district almost daily. But not Tuesday. "It was one woman there named Mandy, who signed for my packages every day," he said. "I don't know if she made it or not, but I thought it was all night."

Memorials of flowers and handwritten messages cropped up in city streets. People put flowers on fire trucks.

Others remembrances were more private.

At a pharmacy on Madison Avenue, Allison Goldberg, 24, bought a candle in the shape of the New York skyline dominated by the Twin Towers. "I'm going to keep it," she said. "This is how I think about New York City when I try and picture it now. It will never be the same."
