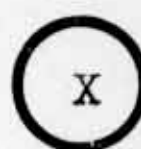

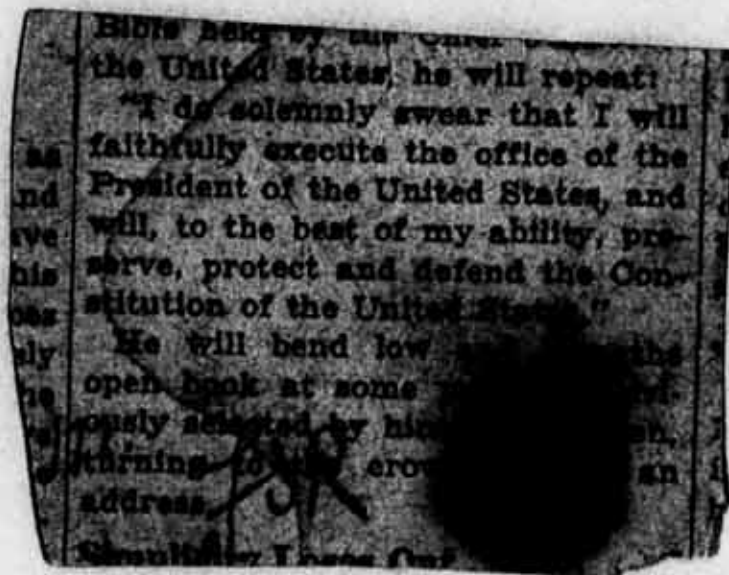

MEMORANDUM FOR

COMMISSIONER HELVERING

There has been so much change in the income tax form since the form used for the calendar year 1932 -- or to be more accurate, prior to March 4, 1933 -- that I think my tax return should be made up in accordance with the old schedules. You will remember that under the Constitution the tax rate on my salary cannot be increased during the term for which I was elected. I think, therefore, that the easiest way is for you to show me just where and how the items should be listed and the tax computed.

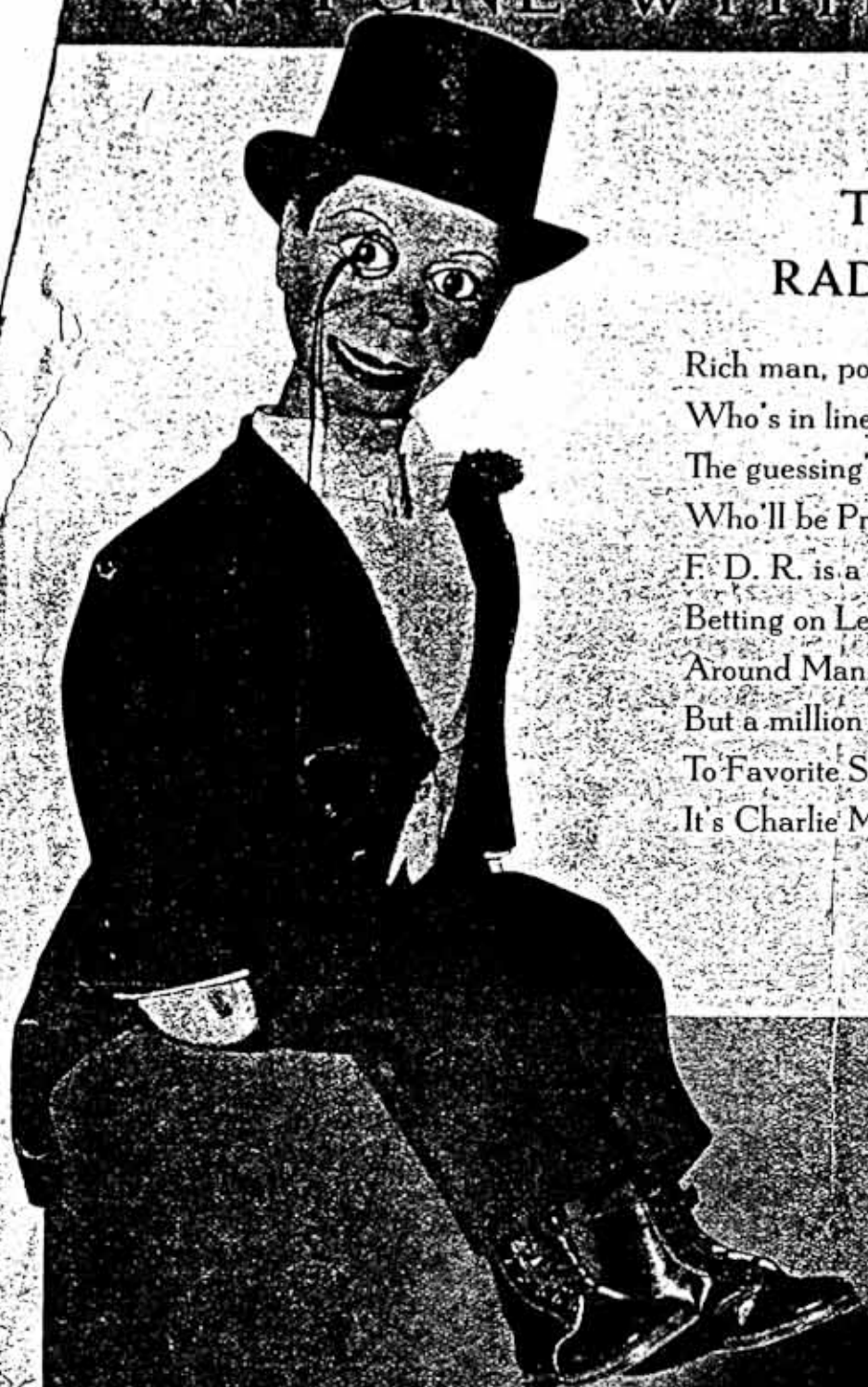

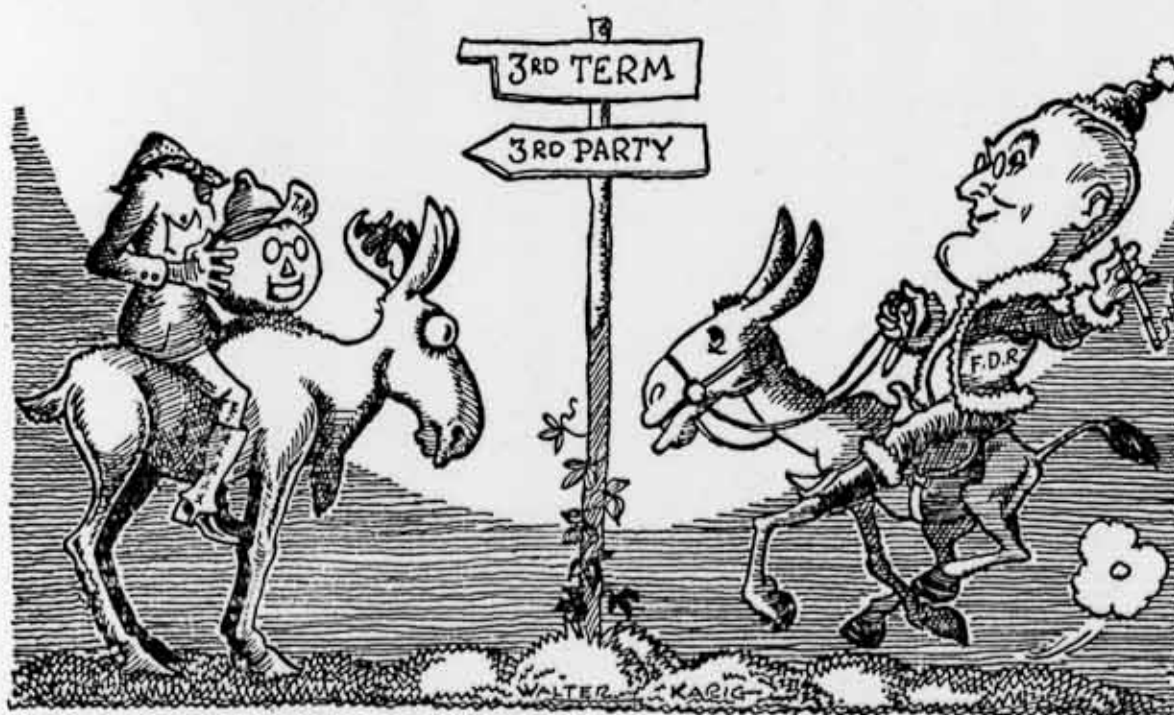

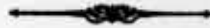
