United States Navy Sea Chanters

The Sea Chanters, the 17-voice chorus of The United States Navy Band in Washington, D.C., perform a variety of music ranging from traditional choral music, including the sea chantey, to Broadway musicals. Organized in 1956 as an all-male chorus specializing in songs of the sea, the group was named by Admiral Arleigh Burke, then Chief of Naval Operations. Female voices were added in 1980 and the chorus' repertoire expanded. The Sea Chanters marked their 45th anniversary in June 2001 with a concert and clinic featuring guest conductor Donald Nuen and the premiere of Keeping the Ocean Free by Roger Bourland and William MacDuff.

The Sea Chanters, under the leadership of Senior Chief Musician John R. Bury and musical director, Chief Musician Keith D. Hinton, appear throughout the United States, and often perform at the White House, Vice President's house and for Washington dignitaries.

The Sea Chanters are also featured in national events such as the 2001 dedication ceremony of The National D-Day Memorial in Bedford, Va.; The International Naval Review 2000 festivities in New York City, the memorial service for the USS Cole (DDG 67) at Naval Station Norfolk, Va., and performed for the site dedication of the World War II Memorial in Washington, D.C. They appeared with the National Symphony Orchestra for the nationally telecast 2001, 2000, 1998, 1997 and 1995 "National Memorial Day Concerts" directed by Erich Kunzel at the U.S. Capitol. In 1994 the chorus provided music at the funerals of former President Nixon in Yorba Linda, Calif., and former first lady Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis at Arlington National Cemetery. In addition, the Sea Chanters appeared in concert with The United States Navy Band at Carnegie Hall in March 1996. In July 1997 the group performed at the Texas Choral Directors Association conference in San Antonio. In 1998 they performed at the American Choral Directors Association Convention in Providence, R.I., and at the memorial service for Rear Admiral Alan B. Sheppard at NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston.

The chorus performed aboard the USS Constitution in Boston, Mass. for the Constitution Bicentennial Celebration, and in 1988, the group gave its first performance for the annual Independence Day celebration at the Washington Monument grounds. A year later, they appeared on the nationally televised NBC special "From The Heart." The chorus also performed at the Kennedy Center Honors for Bob Hope, and appeared with the Boston Pops Esplanade Orchestra, Baltimore Symphony, Virginia Symphony and Cincinnati Pops Orchestra.

The Rt. Rev. Jane Holmes Dixon
Bishop of Washington, Pro tempore

Biographical Information

The Rt. Rev. Jane Holmes Dixon, elected May 30, 1992 and consecrated November 19, 1992 as suffragan bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Washington, was born (b)(6) (b)(6). She was the second woman to be elevated to the office of bishop in the Episcopal Church, the third in the worldwide Anglican Communion. There are now twelve female bishops in the Anglican Communion, nine in the United States, one in New Zealand and two in Canada. Effective January 1, 2001 she has been named Bishop of Washington, Pro tempore by the Standing Committee of the Diocese and will be the ecclesiastical authority during the search and transition to the 8th Bishop of Washington.

Dixon attended Randolph-Macon Woman's College (1955-1958) and earned B.A. and M.A.T. degrees from Vanderbilt University (1959 and 1962), and a Master of Divinity degree from Virginia Theological Seminary (1981). She was awarded a Doctor of Divinity degree in 1993, also from Virginia Theological Seminary.

Bishop Dixon was ordained to the diaconate in 1981 and to the priesthood in 1982. She then served as Associate Rector at Good Shepherd Church in Burke, Virginia, and at St. Alban's Church in Washington, DC. In 1986, she became rector at St. Philip's Church, Laurel, Maryland, only the second female rector to be called in the Diocese of Washington.

Prior to her election as bishop, Dixon served in the diocese as president of the Standing Committee for five and a half years, two and a half years as president. She also co-chaired the Task Force on Human Sexuality; was a member of the Committee on Constitution and Canons, the Commission on Ministry, Personnel and Insurance Committees, and served on the Bishop's Task Force on Women's Ministries.

The Rt. Rev. Jane Holmes Dixon makes weekly visitations to the 96 congregations of the diocese which includes the District of Columbia and four counties in Maryland. The bishops of the diocese strongly uphold the ministry of the baptized. Bishop Dixon oversees the discernment process, a process to help persons understand whether their particular ministry should follow a lay pathway or an ordained one. She bears direct responsibility for the 9 mission congregations, including the design and construction of building projects at 4 missions and property sales for two others. She shares pastoral responsibility for the clergy with Bishop Allen L. Bartlett, Jr., retired bishop of Pennsylvania and currently Assisting Bishop of the Diocese of Washington. In the fall of 1998, the Diocese of Washington sponsored a seminal conference on Christianity and Islam under her oversight. In addition to her diocesan duties, Dixon frequently preaches and lectures to church, educational, and civic groups throughout the United States.

Currently, Bishop Dixon serves on the Theology and Urban Affairs Committees for the House of Bishops. She is President of the Board of the Interfaith Alliance, a member of the Board of Trustees at Virginia Theological Seminary; a member of the Board of the Fair Housing Council of Greater Washington; on the Religious Advisory Committee of the Washington Lawyers' Committee. She is a member of the Women's Forum of Washington, DC and serves on the Leadership Committee of the Board of the International Women's Forum. Dixon is the 1996 recipient of the Margaret Brent Award given annually from St. Mary's College to the woman who has been a pioneer in her field. She received the Alumnae Achievement Award from Randolph-Macon Woman's College in 1997, and she has once again been selected by the Washingtonian Magazine as one of the 100 most influential women in the Washington metropolitan area.

Dixon is married to David M. Dixon, an attorney with the U.S. Department of Justice in Washington. They have three grown children, two sons and a daughter, and two grandchildren.

Nathan D. Baxter
Dean of Washington National Cathedral

The Very Rev. Nathan D. Baxter, a third generation clergyman, was elected sixth dean of Washington National Cathedral in November 1991. Before becoming dean of the Cathedral, Dean Baxter served as the administrative dean and associate professor of Pastoral Theology at Episcopal Divinity School, Cambridge, Massachusetts. Previously, he was the dean and associate professor of Church and Ministry at Lancaster Theological Seminary in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and chaplain and professor of Religious Studies at St. Paul's College, Lawrenceville, Virginia. He has served parishes in Virginia and Pennsylvania.

Dean Baxter graduated from Lancaster Theological Seminary

in 1976 with honors and prizes in homiletics and theology and earned a Doctor of Ministry degree from Lancaster Seminary in 1984. He received, honoris causa, a Doctor of Sacred Theology degree from Dickinson College, a Doctor of Divinity degree from St. Paul's College and is an honorary alumnus of the Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Presently, he is a lecturer in the Medina Seminar for State and Federal Judges at Princeton University. He was granted a resident Fellowship at the College of Preachers in 1990 and designated as a Charles E. Merrill Fellow at Harvard Divinity School in 1998.

Dr. Siddiqi was awarded his Ph.D. in comparative religions from Harvard University.

Dr. Siddiqi has taught courses on Islam and world religions at Harvard University, Seton Hall University, Birmingham University (U.K.) and International Islamic University (Pakistan), and currently serves as an adjunct professor at California State University in Fullerton.

Among positions Dr. Siddiqi has held are chairman of the Muslim Students Association (MSA) of Canada and the USA; chairman of the Department of Religious Affairs at the Muslim World League office to the United Nations; and director of the Islamic Center in Washington, DC. He is a founding member of the Council of Mosques in the U.S. and Canada, a member of the Fiqh (Islamic Law) Council of North America and serves as director of the Islamic Society of Orange County in Garden Grove, California.

Dr. Siddiqi is a regular participant in interfaith forums; television programs and is widely published in various newspapers, magazines and professional journals.

Dr. Siddiqi and his wife, Khaleda, are blessed with three sons, a daughter, and four grandchildren.

Rabbi Joshua Haberman

Rabbi Joshua O. Haberman received an invitation to become senior rabbi of the Washington Hebrew Congregation in 1969. He reintroduced the Congregation to many of the beautiful traditions that early Reform Judaism had discarded. His love of learning resulted in Early Torah Study, Bible Class, and the Foundation for Jewish Studies, which brings Jewish scholars to the Washington area. Kirbyjon Caldwell has been recognized as one of Newsweek's 100 "People to Watch in the 21st Century" and received the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Director's Community Leadership Award.

Caldwell is a member of the boards of the American Church Mortgage Company, Children's Defense Fund, Houston Annenberg Challenge, the Forum Club, Greater Houston Community Foundation, Memorial Hermann Healthcare System, Music Hall Foundation, United Way of the Texas Gulf Coast and the Greater Houston Community Foundation. He serves on The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center's Board of Visitors.

He earned his bachelor's degree from Carleton College, a master's from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School and a master's in theology from Southern Methodist University-Perkins School.

He opened the Republican National Convention in Philadelphia in 2000.

Cardinal Theodore E. McCarrick, PH.D, D.D.
Archbishop of Washington

Cardinal Theodore Edgar McCarrick, installed as Archbishop of Washington on January 3, 2001, was born [redacted] (b)(6) to Theodore Egan McCarrick and Margaret McLaughlin. The young McCarrick attended Catholic elementary school and later Fordham Preparatory School. He studied in Europe for a year and a half before returning to Fordham University, his mind already made up to study for the priesthood. He entered St. Joseph's Seminary, Yonkers, NY, where he earned a BA in 1954 and a Master's Degree in History in 1958. Francis Cardinal Spellman ordained him to the priesthood on May 31, 1958 in New York City. He went on to earn a second Master's degree in Social Sciences and a Ph.D. in Sociology from The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.

Father McCarrick's first assignment was as Assistant Chaplain of Catholic University where he went on to serve as Dean of Students and as Director of Development. He was named President of the Catholic University of Puerto Rico in Ponce in 1965, where he was responsible for the intense development of the school as a major institution. That same year he was named a monsignor by Pope Paul VI. In 1969, Terence Cardinal Cooke recalled Msgr. McCarrick to New York to serve as Associate Secretary for Education from 1969-1971 and then as the Cardinal's Secretary from 1971-1977.

In 1977, Pope Paul VI named Msgr. McCarrick Auxiliary Bishop of New York. In his years as Auxiliary Bishop, he served as Vicar of East Manhattan and the Harlems. Pope John Paul II appointed Bishop McCarrick as the First Bishop of Metuchen, New Jersey when the diocese was established in 1981. From 1986 until his appointment to the Archdiocese of Washington, he served as the Fourth Archbishop of Newark, New Jersey. Newark is the seventh largest diocese in the United States, with a population of more than 1.4 million Catholics. While leading the Archdiocese of Newark, Archbishop McCarrick ordained more priests than any other bishop in the United States did in the same period.

The National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB) elected Archbishop McCarrick to head its Committee on Migration in 1986 and in 1992. In 1992, he also was named to head the Committee for Aid to the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, and was elected in 1996 as chair of the Committee on International Policy. Other NCCB committees on which the Archbishop has served are Administrative, Doctrine, the Laity, Latin America and the Missions. He was elected one of 15 U.S. bishops to serve as a member of the Synod for America held in 1997. At the conclusion of that Synod, the bishops elected him to serve on the Post Synodal Council.

He is Chancellor of The Catholic University of America and President of the Board of Trustees of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. A founding member of the Papal Foundation, he has served as its President since 1997. Cardinal McCarrick also is a member of the Board of Catholic Relief Services. For the Vatican, he previously served as a member of the Pontifical Council for Migrants and Refugees and presently serves on the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace.

He has visited many nations as a human rights advocate and to survey humanitarian needs. These include China, Cuba, Vietnam, the Philippines, South Korea, Rwanda and Burundi. He has traveled extensively in Eastern Europe. In November 1996, Archbishop McCarrick was invited to serve on the Secretary of State's Advisory Committee on Religious Freedom Abroad and in July 1999 he was named a member of the United States Commission for International Religious Freedom, which was established by federal legislation the previous year.

In January 1998, Archbishop McCarrick was one of three American clerics invited to visit China and discuss religious freedoms in that country. In January 2000, the President of Lebanon named Archbishop McCarrick an Officer of the Order of the Cedars of Lebanon. In December 2000, then-United States President Bill Clinton presented him with the Eleanor Roosevelt Award for Human Rights.

On February 21, 2001, just seven weeks after he was installed as the Archbishop of Washington, Archbishop McCarrick was elevated to the College of Cardinals by Pope John Paul II.

Billy Graham

"My one purpose in life is to help people find a personal relationship with God, which, I believe, comes through knowing Christ." -- Billy Graham.

Evangelist Billy Graham took Christ at His word when He said in Mark 16:15, "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature."

Mr. Graham has preached the Gospel to more people in live audiences than anyone else in history -- over 210 million people in more than 185 countries and territories -- through various meetings, including Mission World and Global Mission. Hundreds of millions more have been reached through television, video and film.

Since the 1949 Los Angeles crusade vaulted Mr. Graham into the public eye, he has led hundreds of thousands of individuals to make personal decisions to live for Christ, which is the main thrust of his ministry.

Born (b)(6) four days before the Armistice ended World War I, Mr. Graham was (b)(6) Growing up during the Depression, he learned the value of hard work on the family farm, but he also found time to spend many hours in the hayloft reading books on a wide variety of subjects.

(b)(6) Mr. Graham made a personal commitment to Christ through the ministry of Mordecai Ham, a traveling evangelist, who visited Charlotte for a series of revival meetings.

Ordained in 1939 by a church in the Southern Baptist Convention, Mr. Graham received a solid foundation in the Scriptures at Florida Bible Institute (now Trinity College in Florida). In 1943 he was graduated from Wheaton College in Illinois and married fellow student Ruth McCue Bell, daughter of a missionary surgeon, who spent the first 17 years of her life in China.

After graduating from college, Mr. Graham joined Youth for Christ, an organization founded for ministry to youth and servicemen during World War II. He preached throughout the United States and in Europe in the immediate post-war era, emerging as a rising young evangelist.

The Los Angeles crusade in 1949 launched Mr. Graham into international prominence. Scheduled for three weeks, the meetings were extended to more than eight weeks, with overflow crowds filling a tent erected downtown each night.

Many of his subsequent early crusades were similarly extended, including one in London which lasted 12 weeks, and a New York City crusade in Madison Square Garden in 1957 which ran nightly for 16 weeks.

Today, at age 82, Billy Graham and his ministry are known around the globe. He has preached in remote African villages and in the heart of New York City, and those to whom he has ministered have ranged from heads of state to the simple-living bushmen of Australia and the wandering tribes of Africa and the Middle East. Since 1977, Mr. Graham has been accorded the opportunity to conduct preaching missions in virtually every country of the former Eastern bloc, including the former Soviet Union.

Mr. Graham founded the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association in 1950, which headquarters in Minneapolis, Minnesota. He conducts his ministry through BGEA, including:

the weekly "Hour of Decision" radio program broadcast by more than 600 stations around the world.

crusade television specials which are regularly broadcast in prime time in almost every market in the United States and Canada, reaching more than four million households per telecast.

a newspaper column, "My Answer," which is carried by newspapers across the country with a combined circulation of more than five million readers.

Decision magazine, the official publication of the Association, has a circulation of 1.7 million in 160 countries -- making it one of the largest religious periodicals in the world.

World Wide Pictures is one of the foremost producers of evangelistic films in the world. Since its first feature-film, "Mr. Texas," in 1951 Billy Graham evangelistic films have been translated into 46 languages and viewed by more than 200 million people around the world. World Wide Pictures has produced and distributed over 130 productions - from 15-minute television programs to approximately 25 feature-length films such as "The Hiding Place," "Powerplay," "Joni," "Caught," and "The Ride" - and provides its films for showing at minimum charge at prisons and correctional facilities nationwide each year.

Mr. Graham has written 18 books, all of which have become top sellers. His latest, "Just As I Am," published in 1997, achieved a "triple crown," appearing simultaneously on the three top best-seller lists in one week. In this autobiography, Mr. Graham reflects on his life, including nearly 60 years of ministry around the world. From humble beginnings as the son of a dairy farmer in North Carolina, he shares how his unwavering faith in Christ formed and shaped his career.

Of his other books, "Approaching Hoofbeats: The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse" (1983) was listed for several weeks on The New York Times best-seller list; "How to Be Born Again" (1977) had the largest first printing in publishing history with 800,000 copies; "Angels: God's Secret Agents" (1975) sold one million copies within 90 days; and "The Jesus Generation" (1971) sold 200,000 copies in the first two weeks.

Mr. Graham's counsel has been sought by presidents, and his appeal in both the secular and religious arenas is evidenced by the wide range of groups that have honored him, including numerous honorary doctorates from many institutions in the U. S. and abroad. Recognitions range from the Congressional Gold Medal to the Speaker of the Year Award and the Templeton Foundation Prize for Progress in Religion and the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation Freedom Award for contributions to the cause of freedom. He has received the Big Brother Award for his work on behalf of the welfare of children and been cited by the George Washington Carver Memorial Institute for his contributions to race relations. He has also been recognized by the Anti-Defamation League of the B'nai B'rith and the National Conference of Christians and Jews for his efforts to foster a better understanding among all faiths.

Mr. Graham is regularly listed by the Gallup organization as one of the "Ten Most Admired Men in the World," whom it described as the dominant figure in that poll over the past 54 years -- making an unparalleled 43rd appearance and 36th consecutive appearance. He has also appeared on the covers of Time, Newsweek, Life, U.S. News and World Report, Parade, and numerous other magazines and has been the subject of many newspaper and magazine feature articles and books.

Mr. Graham stays fit by swimming and aerobic walking when his schedule permits. He and his wife, Ruth, have three daughters, two sons, 19 grandchildren and numerous great-grandchildren. The Grahams make their home in the mountains of North Carolina.

They hijacked four passenger jets, crashed two of them into the World Trade Center's twin towers **and** a third into the Headquarters of the U.S. Department of Defense at the Pentagon, causing great loss of life and tremendous damage. The fourth plane crashed in the Pennsylvania countryside, killing all on board but falling well short of its intended target apparently because of the heroic efforts of passengers on board. This carnage, which caused the collapse of both Trade Center towers and the destruction of part of the Pentagon, killed more than 250 airplane passengers and thousands more on the ground.

Civilized people around the world denounce the evildoers who devised and executed these terrible attacks. Justice demands that those who helped or harbored the terrorists be punished -- and punished severely. The enormity of their evil demands it. We will use all the resources of the United States and our cooperating friends and allies to pursue those responsible for

this evil, until justice is done.

We mourn with those who have suffered great and disastrous loss. All our hearts have been seared by the sudden and sense-less taking of innocent lives. We pray for healing and for the strength to serve and encourage one another in hope and faith.

Scripture says: "Blessed are those who mourn for they shall be comforted." I call on every American family and the family of America to observe a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance, honoring the memory of the thousands of victims of these brutal attacks and comforting those who lost loved ones. We will persevere through this national tragedy and personal loss. In time, we will find healing and recovery; and, in the face of all this evil, we remain strong and united, "one Nation under God."

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE W. WASHINGTON, Sept 13 (Reuters) - U.S. President George W. Bush is declaring Friday a day of "prayer and remembrance" after this week's terror attacks, the White House said on Thursday.

"The president is declaring today that tomorrow should be a national day of prayer and remembrance," White House spokesman Ari Fleischer told reporters.

Knife-wielding hijackers seized four commercial airliners on Tuesday, two of which slammed into and destroyed New York's World Trade Center towers. A third hit the Pentagon, and a fourth plane crashed in western Pennsylvania. Thousands are feared dead.
