CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS

- 1901... FROM 1901 TO 1919 SOCIALIST PARTY WAS THE DOMINANT RADICAL PARTY IN THE UNITED STATES
- 1919... LEFT-WING ELEMENTS SPLIT FROM THE SOCIALIST PARTY AND FORMED THE COMMUNIST LABOR PARTY ON AUGUST 31, 1919 AND COMMUNIST PARTY OF AMERICA ON SEPTEMBER 1, 1919. THE SOCIALIST PARTY FOLLOWED ITS SEPARATE COURSE.....
- 1920... COMMUNIST PARTY OF AMERICA AND COMMUNIST LABOR PARTY UNITED IN SPRING OF 1920 INTO UNITED COMMUNIST PARTY. ELEMENTS OF COMMUNIST PARTY OF AMERICA REFUSED TO JOIN AND REMAINED A SEPARATE ORGANIZATION.....
- 1921... IN MARCH THESE FRAGMENTS OF COMMUNIST PARTY OF AMERICA AND UNITED COMMUNIST PARTY UNITED AS COMMUNIST PARTY OF AMERICA. IN DECEMBER THIS GROUP, BY AGREEMENT, FORMED WORKERS PARTY OF AMERICA AS ITS LEGAL EXPRESSION AND COMMUNIST PARTY OF AMERICA AS ITS ILLEGAL OR UNDERGROUND EXPRESSION....
- 1923... THESE TWO GROUPS UNITED AS WORKERS PARTY OF AMERICA AS A LEGAL ORGANIZATION.....
- 1928... IN AUGUST WORKERS PARTY OF AMERICA WAS RENAMED WORKERS (COMMUNIST) PARTY OF AMERICA.....
- 1929... IN MARCH RENAMED COMMUNIST PARTY OF AMERICA.....
- 1940... NOW KNOWN AS COMMUNIST PARTY OF THE U. S. A.....

U. S. A. IN THE U. S. S. R.

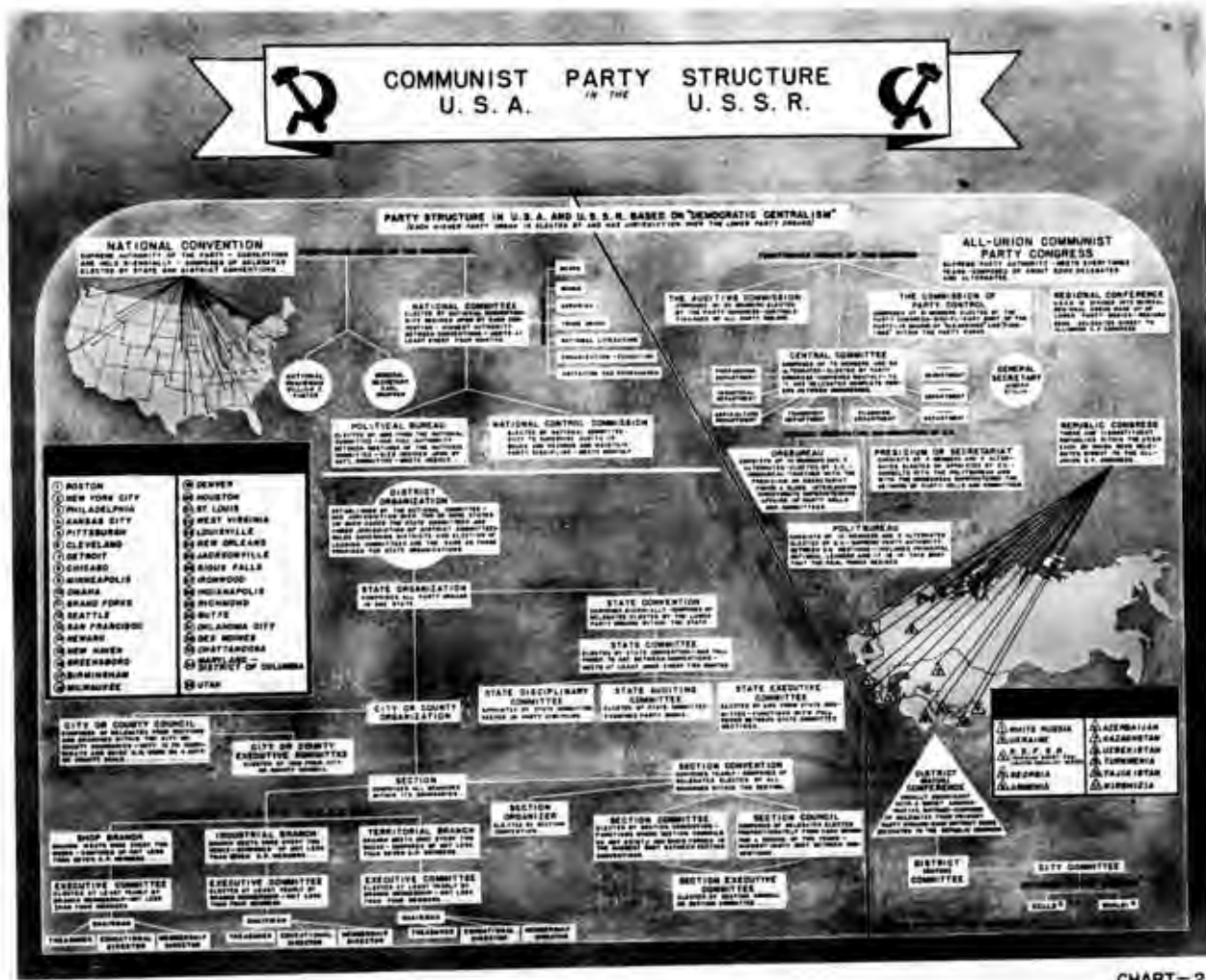

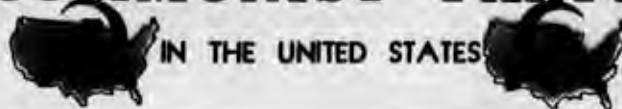

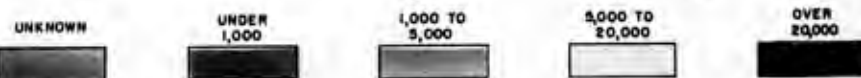

Relative Strength Of Communist Districts



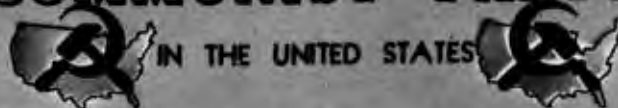

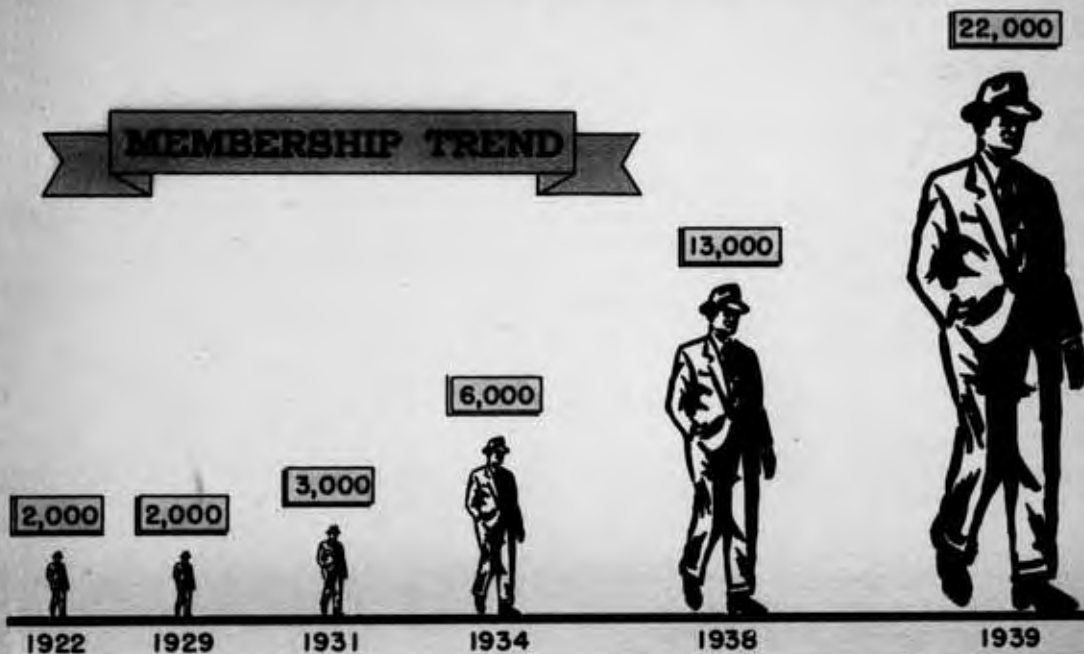

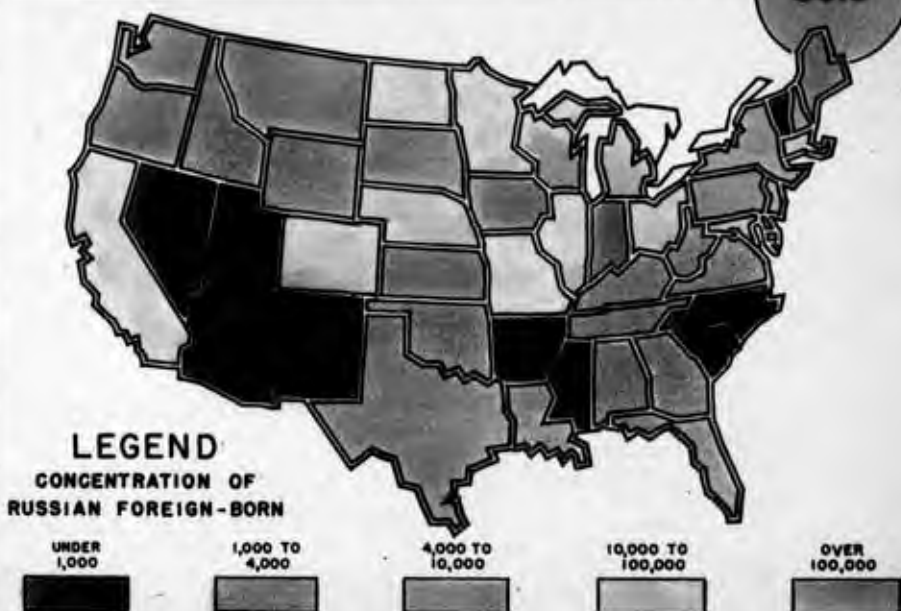


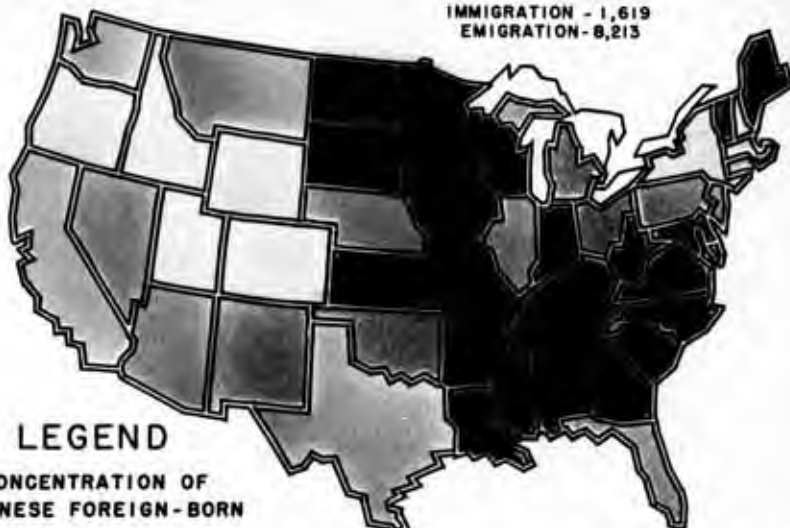

JAPANESE FOREIGN-BORN RESIDENTS IN THE UNITED STATES, BY STATES, CENSUS OF 1930

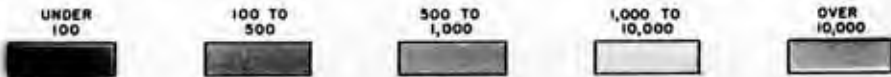

GERMAN FOREIGN-BORN RESIDENTS IN THE UNITED STATES, BY STATES, CENSUS OF 1930

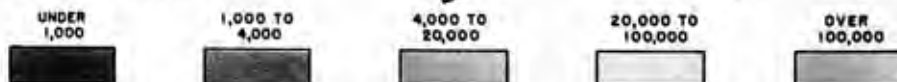

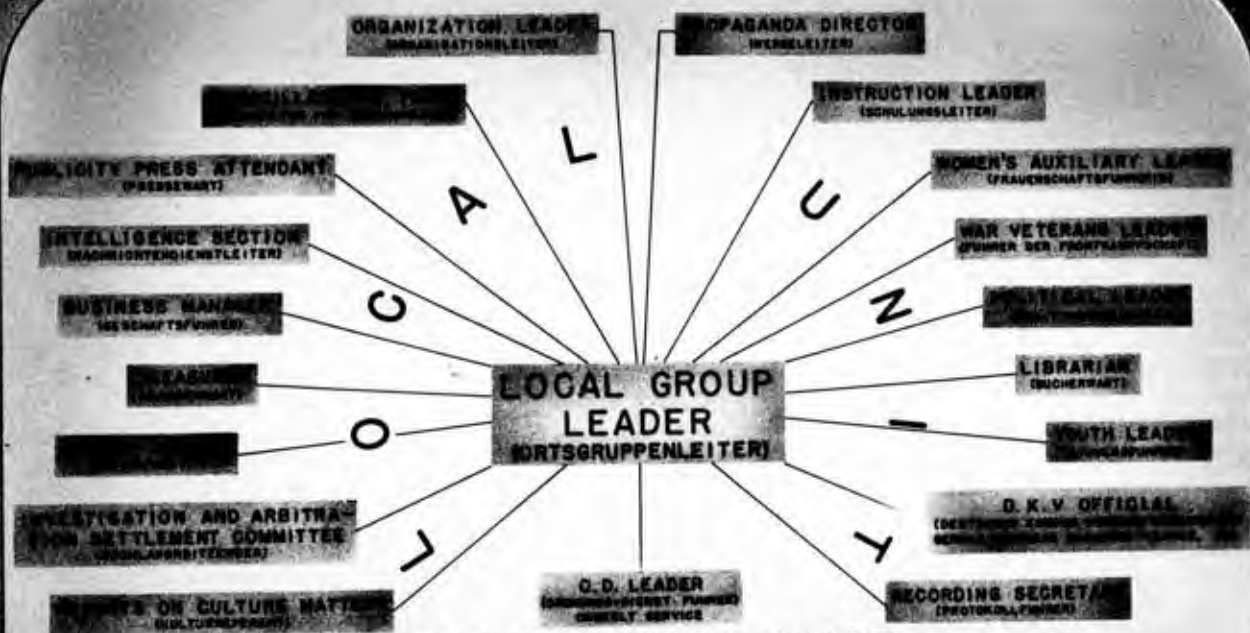

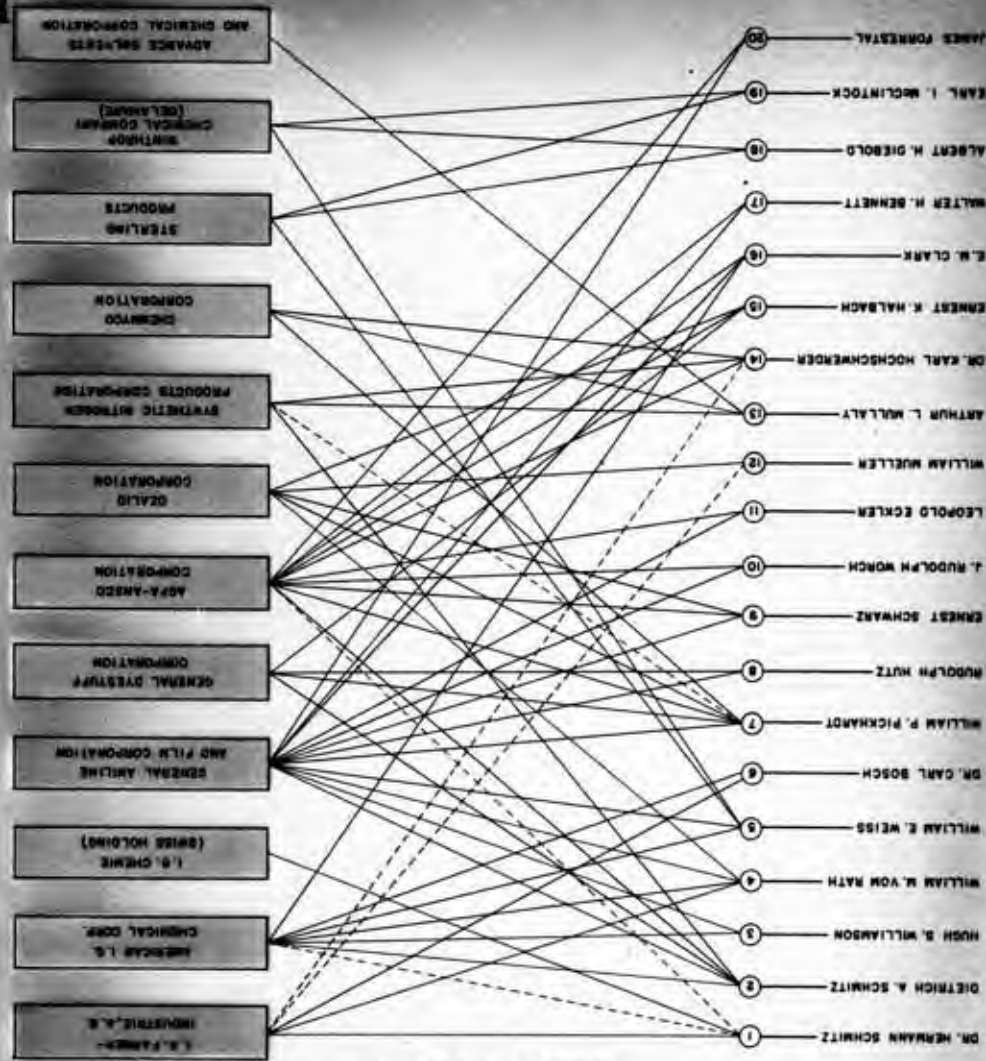

F B I FUNCTIONAL ORGANIZATION CHART SAN JUAN FIELD OFFICE PUERTO RICO

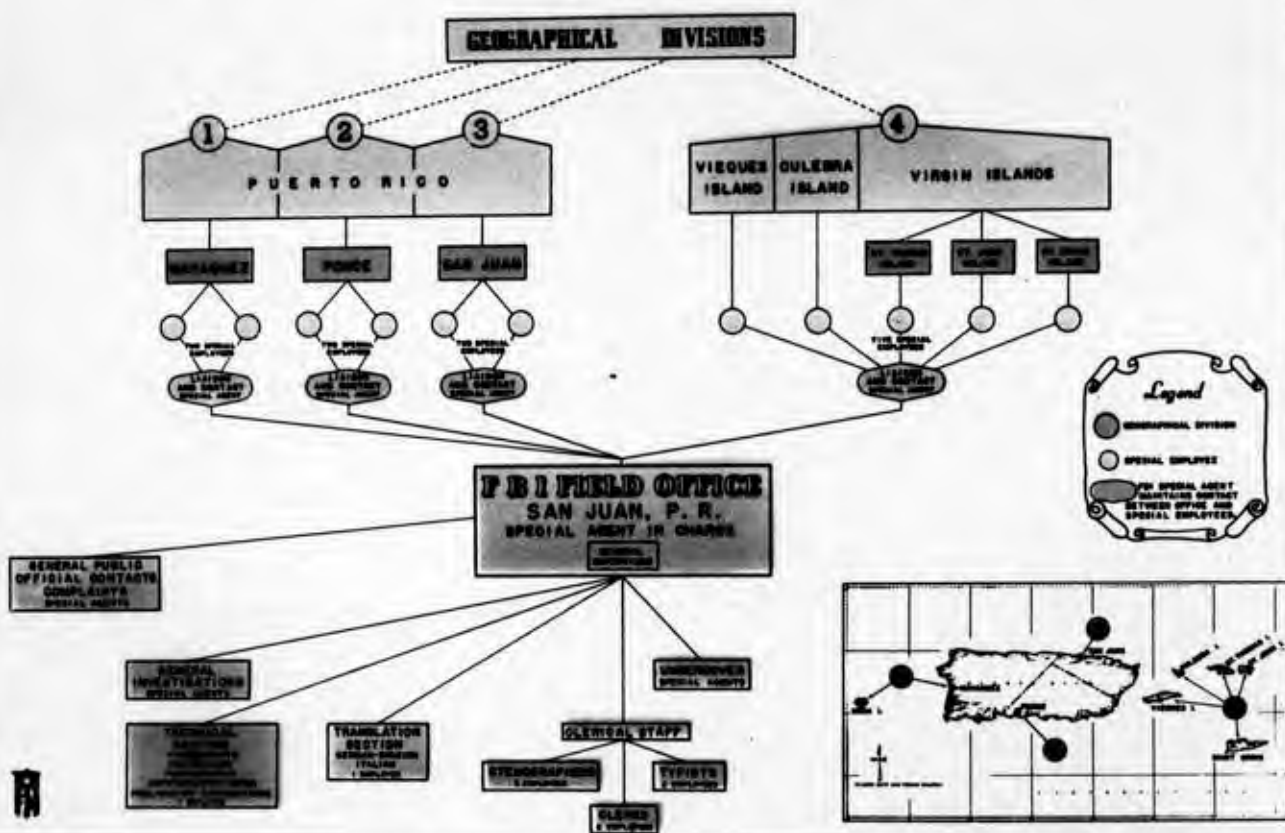
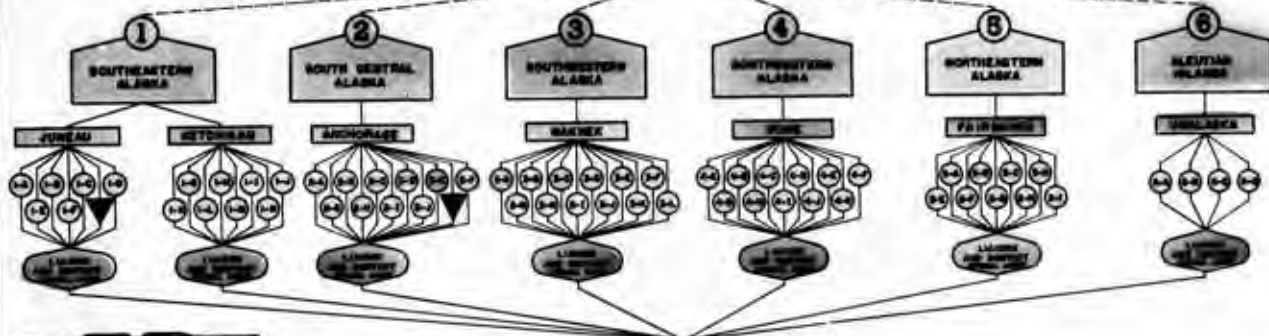

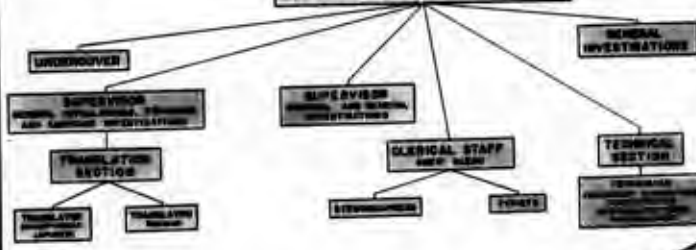
FBI FUNCTIONAL ORGANIZATION CHART
