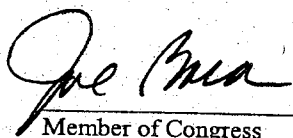
We write to you today in response to your administration's recent decision to change the regulations implementing Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. We are writing to express our concern over your intention to introduce single-sex education in mainstream public schools and about the effects that changing Title IX to allow for this may have on its legal statute.

Now as Title IX celebrates its 30th anniversary, we urge you to reaffirm its spirit. For over 30 years, Title IX has helped to close the gap between the quality of education that girls and boys receive. It has greatly improved the educational experiences of girls in the classroom, in after-school activities, and on the athletic field. Title IX is a major legal foundation for protecting civil rights in America and has been instrumental in protecting women's rights in a wide spectrum of areas. Altering it could have serious implications for athletics, financial aid and admissions policies, higher education, and elementary and secondary education. We have an obligation to protect the rights guaranteed by the Constitution that are secured by Title IX.

We also urge great caution as you consider introducing single-sex education to mainstream public schools. Over the past 30 years, single-sex education has existed in elite private colleges and selective elementary and secondary schools. These institutions face significantly different challenges than mainstream public schools. Single-sex education is not a quick fix for the educational problems facing our nation, just as vouchers are not a quick fix. There simply is not enough information on the effects of single-sex education in public schools, both on students in the programs and on other students within those districts, to merit a major policy change of this magnitude at this time. What is clear is that we must work to ensure greater school funding, smaller class sizes, parental involvement, more attention to core academic subjects, and a clear code of behavior expectations and discipline, elements that are proven to lead to better schools and higher quality education.

Please protect our citizens' civil rights and the integrity of our nation's schools. Again, we urge you to reaffirm Title IX and request further research into the merits of single-sex education in mainstream public schools, as you consider altering the regulations implementing Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972.

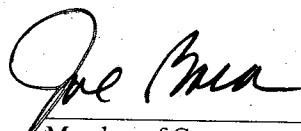
We write to you today in response to your administration's recent decision to change the regulations implementing Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. We are writing to express our concern over your intention to introduce single-sex education in mainstream public schools and about the effects that changing Title IX to allow for this may have on its legal statute.

Now as Title IX celebrates its 30th anniversary, we urge you to reaffirm its spirit. For over 30 years, Title IX has helped to close the gap between the quality of education that girls and boys receive. It has greatly improved the educational experiences of girls in the classroom, in after-school activities, and on the athletic field. Title IX is a major legal foundation for protecting civil rights in America and has been instrumental in protecting women's rights in a wide spectrum of areas. Altering it could have serious implications for athletics, financial aid and admissions policies, higher education, and elementary and secondary education. We have an obligation to protect the rights guaranteed by the Constitution that are secured by Title IX.

We also urge great caution as you consider introducing single-sex education to mainstream public schools. Over the past 30 years, single-sex education has existed in elite private colleges and selective elementary and secondary schools. These institutions face significantly different challenges than mainstream public schools. Single-sex education is not a quick fix for the educational problems facing our nation, just as vouchers are not a quick fix. There simply is not enough information on the effects of single-sex education in public schools, both on students in the programs and on other students within those districts, to merit a major policy change of this magnitude at this time. What is clear is that we must work to ensure greater school funding, smaller class sizes, parental involvement, more attention to core academic subjects, and a clear code of behavior expectations and discipline; elements that are proven to lead to better schools and higher quality education.

Please protect our citizens' civil rights and the integrity of our nation's schools. Again, we urge you to reaffirm Title IX and request further research into the merits of single-sex education in mainstream public schools, as you consider altering the regulations implementing Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972.

PURPOSE OF THE FOUNDATION

The Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Foundation is a federally endowed agency established by Congress by Public Law 99-661 on November 14, 1986. The Foundation was established in recognition of Senator Goldwater's fifty-six years of service to the United States as a soldier and statesman, including thirty years as a U.S. Senator.

In view of Senator Goldwater's longstanding special interest in the education of America's youth, particularly in the fields of science and mathematics, Senator Sam Nunn proposed the establishment of a scholarship program encouraging outstanding students to pursue careers in these fields.

The Scholarship Program, designed to foster and encourage excellence in science and mathematics, and which now includes the engineering disciplines, was approved by Congress as a tribute to the leadership, courage and vision of Senator Barry Goldwater.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

A Board of thirteen Trustees, who serve without pay, governs the Foundation. Eight, not more than four of whom shall be of the same political party, are appointed by the President, with the advice and consent of the Senate. Two are members of the Senate appointed by the majority and the minority leaders of the Senate. Two are members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the majority and minority leaders of the House of Representatives. The Secretary of Education also serves as a Trustee, in an ex-officio capacity.

THE GOLDWATER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The general guidelines and other information regarding the Goldwater Scholarship Program are fully explained in the 2001 Bulletin of Information at Appendix A.

In March 2001, the Board of Trustees of the Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Foundation awarded 302 one and two year scholarships for the 2001/2002 academic year to college sophomores and juniors for use during their undergraduate studies.

The Goldwater Scholars were selected on the basis of academic merit from a field of approximately 1200 mathematics, science and engineering students nominated by the faculties of colleges and universities from the fifty States. The scholarships cover the cost of tuition, fees, books and room and board up to a maximum of \$7,500.00 annually. Sophomore Scholars are eligible for two years of support.

The Goldwater Scholars have very impressive academic qualifications in a wide variety of scientific, mathematical and engineering disciplines and intend to pursue a Ph.D. and careers in those fields. During the last several years many Goldwater Scholars have received prestigious post-graduate fellowships from various sources. Goldwater Scholars have been awarded forty-four Rhodes Scholarships (six of the thirty-two selected in the U.S. for 2001), and thirty-nine Marshall Awards, in addition to numerous other prestigious graduate fellowships. The names and schools of the Goldwater Scholars for the 2001/2002 academic year are listed in Appendix B.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

In FY 2001, the Foundation Trustees authorized an additional maximum expenditure of \$2,985,000 to the new Goldwater Scholars payable over three fiscal years.

The actual outlays for scholarship grants during the fiscal year amounted to \$2,780,926.00 and the administrative expenses incurred in connection with the above grants and for the identification, nomination and selection process of the 2001 Goldwater Scholars totaled \$428,000.00. Total Foundation expenditures for FY 2001 amounted to \$3,199,187.00.

The original Foundation endowment of \$40,000,000, which is totally invested in Federal Government Securities, is currently valued at \$63,765,997.00. The Goldwater Scholarship Foundation's financial statement for FY 2001 is included at Appendix C.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES ACTIVITIES

In accordance with Foundation by-laws, the Board of Trustees met this year on March 28, 2001. The Trustees awarded 302 Goldwater scholarships for the 2001/2002 academic year. The Trustees also decided to award as many as 300 scholarships during the 2002/2003 academic year.

2002/2003 PROGRAM

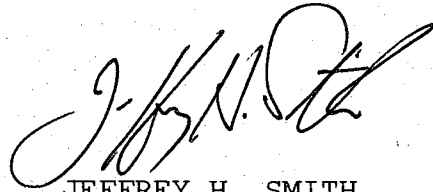
