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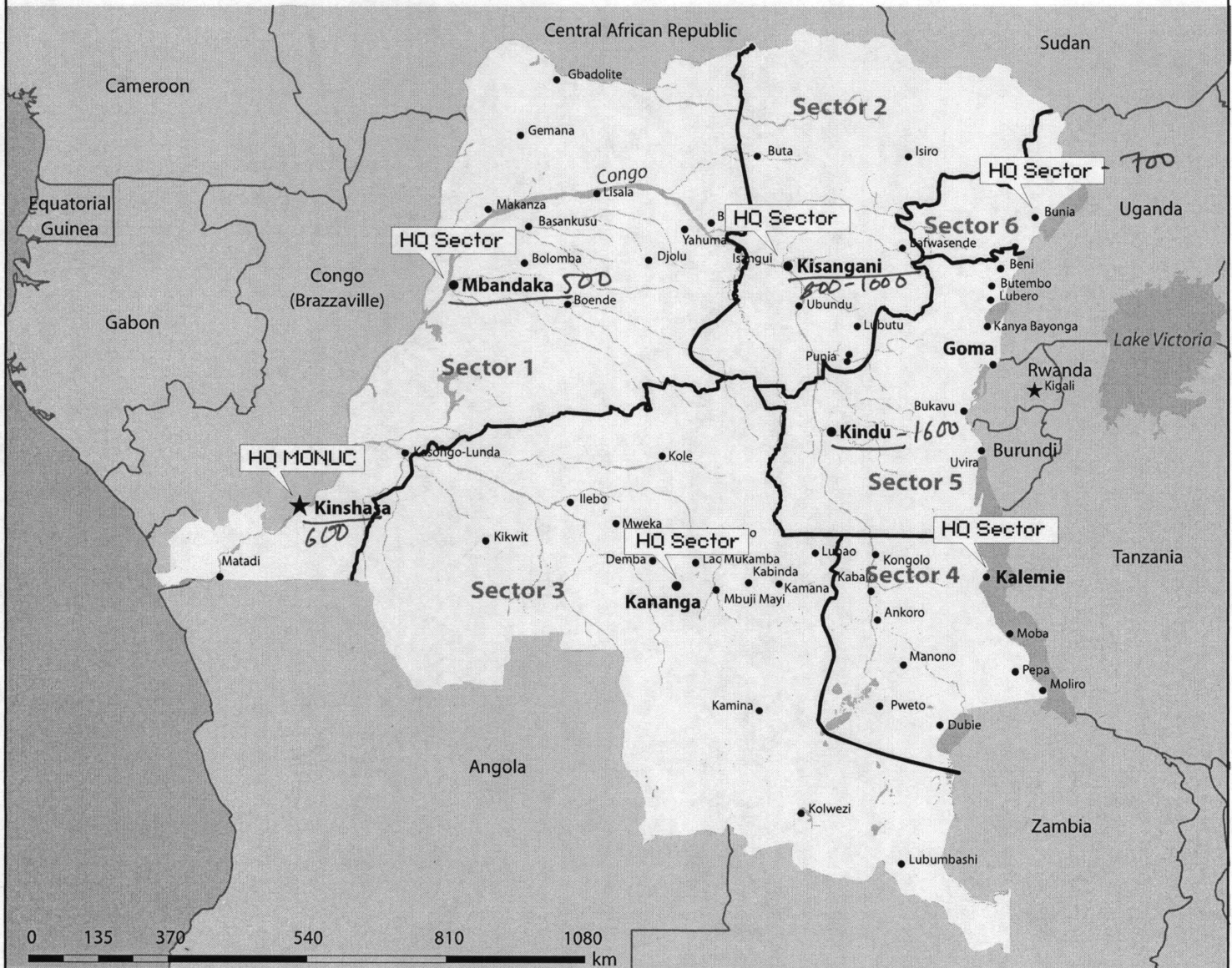

15 countries. Two international staffs (1 Legal Adviser and 1 Administrative Assistant) and local driver are also assigned to the Commissioner's Office.

On 28 October 2001, the first elements of the Civilian Police Component were deployed in Kinshasa. Civpol is tasked to assess the Congolese National Police, its needs and capabilities, and to train and advise the police in Kisangani.

Civpol Strength

CIVPOL has an authorized strength of 100 police officers to fulfill its mandate. As of 26 February 2003, CIVPOL is composed of 50 Senior Gendarmes and Police Officers.

Advising Programme

Within the Pilot project developed for Kisangani local police, a second track consisting of Civpol advisors at the different levels of command to assist in the daily management of police force. The advisors are already deployed in Kisangani awaiting the effective implementation of the advising program, probably in January 2003.

The way forward

The civilian police component has consulted closely with the political affairs division, and components of MONUC, on issues of mutual concern. Moreover, a detailed strategic plan on the mandate of CIVPOL, was completed in close consultation with all stakeholders.

Finally, CIVPOL is taking the necessary steps with MONUC administration so as to secure funding under the trust fund for Kisangani's activities. Furthermore, contacts have been with donors, bilateral or multilateral, to seek assistance and coordinate, as needed, ongoing future activities.

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On MONUC: background

MONUC Background

1997

After 32 years in power as president of then Republic of Zaïre, Mobutu Sese Seko was toppled on 16 May by the Alliance of Democratic Forces for the Liberation of the Congo. Laurent Désiré Kabila became the President of the DRC.

1998

On 2 August 1998, Laurent Désiré Kabila came under a rebellion in the East sparked off by his former AFDL comrades-in-arms. A few months later another front was opened in the Northeast of the DRC. Zimbabwe, Angola, Chad and Namibia deployed their troops in the DRC to join forces with the loyalist army, while Rwanda, Uganda and Burundi sponsored the different rebel movements (the Congolese Rally for Democracy and the Movement for the Liberation of the Congo) with a view to toppling Kabila.

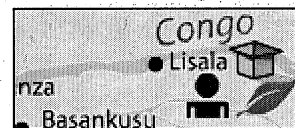
In August, the United Nations Security Council expressed deep concern over the fresh upsurge of tensions in the Great Lake regions which represents a threat to the regional peace and security. It called on the countries involved to refrain from interfering in other countries internal affairs and called for an immediate ceasefire as well as the withdrawal of foreign forces from the DRC. The Council further stressed the need to reach a national reconciliation consistent with the principles of equality and harmony between all the ethnic groups and called for democratic elections.

In a declaration issued by the Security Council in December, the Council reaffirmed the obligation to respect the DRC territorial integrity. It said it was ready to envisage an active role for the UN in cooperation with OAU that would consist in contributing troops to the implementation of a peace process leading to political settlement accepted by the parties.

1999

In April, to further support the regional peace initiatives, the Secretary-General appointed Mr. Moustapha Niasse (Senegal) as his Special Envoy for the peace process in the DRC, assisted by his

Representative for the Great Lakes region, Mr. Berhanu DINKA, appointed in December 1997. The Council welcomed this initiative in its resolution 1234 of 9 April 1999 and appealed to the Secretary-General to issue recommendations on the United Nations role in the peace process. The same resolution further deplored the presence of foreign forces in the DRC "declaring it inconsistent with the principles of the United Nations Charter" and called on the countries involved to put an end to the presence of their "uninvited" forces.

On 10th July in Lusaka, Zambia, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), along with Angola, Namibia, Rwanda, Uganda and Zimbabwe signed a **Ceasefire Agreement** for a cessation of hostilities between all belligerent forces in the DRC.

The agreement included provisions on the normalization of the situation along the DRC border; the control of illicit trafficking of arms and the infiltration of armed groups; the holding of a national dialogue; the need to address security concerns; and the establishment of a mechanism for disarming militias and armed groups. It also provided for a Joint Military Commission (JMC) composed of two representatives from each party under a neutral chairman appointed by the Organization of African Unity (OAU) and proposed that an "appropriate force" be constituted, facilitated and deployed by the United Nations in collaboration with OAU. The Agreement also provided for the appointment of a Facilitator who will organize the Inter Congolese political talks to lead to a new political order, in consultation with the Congolese parties.

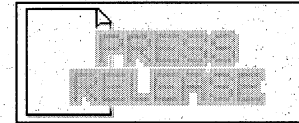
On 6 August, the Security Council welcomed the agreement and urged the second rebel group, that is, the Congolese Rally for Democracy to sign as well. On the same occasion, the Security Council commended the OAU, the Southern African Development Community (SADC) and the Secretary-General for their efforts to find a peaceful settlement to the conflict.

Referring to the Secretary-General's recommendation featured in his report of 15 July 1999, the Security Council authorized by its resolution 1258 of 6 August 1999, a deployment of 90 UN Liaison Military staff members, as well as an essential civilian personnel, on the capitals of the signatory states, to JMC provisional headquarters, to the rear military headquarters of the main belligerents in DRC as conditions permitted, and to other areas deemed necessary by the Secretary-General. The deployment began

once the break-away wing of the RCD had signed the agreement on 31 August 1999. The Movement for the Liberation of the Congo (MLC) signed the Agreement on 1 August 1999.

On 1st November 1999, the Secretary-General recommended extension of the mandate until 15 January 2000 provided necessary conditions are met. Despite the inability for the technical team deployed on the region to conduct reconnaissance activities, the Secretary-General sought prior authorizations for MONUC deployments and the 500 military observers, after security conditions are met in the area. On 13 November, the Secretary-General appointed Kamel Morjane (Tunisia) as his Special Representative for the DRC.

Under its resolution 1273 of 5 November 1999, the Security Council renewed MONUC mandate until 15 January 2000. By its resolution 1279 of 30 November 1999, the Council decided that the previously authorized personnel would constitute MONUC and expressed its intention for a new deployment based on the Secretary-General's recommendation. It called on the Secretary-General to accelerate the development of a concept of operations based on conditions of security, access and freedom of movement and cooperation on the part of the part of the signatory parties to fully cooperate.

2000

On 24 February 2000, the Security Council, by its resolution 1291 (S/RES/129 (2000)), decided to extend MONUC mandate until 31 August 2000 and to authorize the reinforcement of the Mission to include up to 5,537 observers or more, should the Secretary-General deem it necessary and feel that the size and structure of the overall force permits this; an additional support civilian staff especially in the respective fields of human rights, humanitarian affairs, information, child protection, political affairs, medical and administrative support staff will as well be provided. The Council further calls on the Secretary-General to recommend the deployment of reinforcements when necessary to better ensure the protection of the force.

In March 2000, the Secretary-General appointed a Major General, Mountaga Diallo (Senegal) as the UN Force Commander for the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

From 4 to 8 May, a Security Council mission conducted an assessment mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

On 23 August 2000, by its resolution 1316, the Security Council decided to extend MONUC

mandate until 15 October 2000 to facilitate diplomatic activities in support of the ceasefire Agreement and to give the Council the possibility of further planning the next Mission's mandate and make possible adjustments. The Council renewed MONUC mandate until 15 December by its resolution 1323 of 13 October 2000 and until 15 June by its resolution 1332 of 14 December 2000.

2001

On 16 January 2002: President Laurent Désiré Kabila was assassinated. His close collaborators decided that his son Joseph Kabila, then 29 years old, should succeed his father as president and Commander-in-chief of the Armed Forces.

On 26 January: President Joseph Kabila assumed his functions as Head of State and was sworn in before the DRC Supreme Court.

From 15 to 26 May: The Security Council conducted an assessment and consultative mission in the Great Lakes region, including DRC.

In August: The Secretary-General appointed Mr. Namanga Ngongi (Cameroon) as his Special Representative for the DRC.

On 9th November: By its resolution 1376, the Council supported the beginning of MONUC phase III devoted to Disarmament, Demobilization, Repatriation, Reintegration and Resettlement (DDRRR) of the foreign armed groups.

2002

On 25 February: in a solemn declaration, the Security Council called on MONUC to conduct a first assessment of the Rwandan armed groups.

The same day the Inter Congolese political talks started in Sun city, South Africa coinciding with the launching of the United Nations Radio Okapi.

On 19 March: The Security Council adopted the resolution 1399 (2002), calling on all the parties to the **Lusaka ceasefire agreement** to refrain from any form of military activities or act of provocation, especially when the Inter Congolese dialogue was being held. This resolution was adopted after the inter Congolese dialogue was temporarily suspended, following the recapture of Moliro by RCD-Goma

9 April: MONUC signed an agreement with the Movement for the Liberation of the Congo on reopening the River Congo to commercial and

civil traffic. MONUC and RCD signed the same agreement on 11 April.

On 18 April: End of the Inter Congolese Dialogue at Sun City. The Government and MLC signed a bilateral agreement for power sharing and invited the other parties to join in. RCD-GOMA and UDPS having turned down the proposal announced, a few days later, the creation of the Alliance for the safeguard of the Inter Congolese dialogue.

From 27 April to 7 May: A UN Security Council Mission visited the Great Lakes region for the third time in three years, as a way to demonstrate the importance the Council attaches to the issue.

On 29 April: MONUC signed an agreement with the government on the reopening of the River Congo to commercial and civilian traffic.

On 14 June: By its Resolution 1417 (2002), the Security Council decided to extend MONUC mandate until 30 June 2003 and appealed to the member countries to contribute troops to increase MONUC strength to 5,537, including observers.

On 30 July: The governments of the DRC and Rwanda signed an **agreement in Pretoria** setting out a calendar for the withdrawal of Rwandan troops from the DRC and called on the DRC government to track down the elements of the former Rwandan Armed Forces and Interahamwe militia operating in the Congolese territory. The agreement set up a Third Party Verification Mechanism consisting of South Africa and UN representatives (MONUC), tasked to monitor its application.

On 6 September: Ugandan and DRC governments signed an agreement in Luanda on the withdrawal of Ugandan troops from Bunia and the creation of an Ituri Pacification Committee.

On 17 September 2002: Rwandan forces began pulling out of the DRC

On 30 September: the first 69 ex-combatants-group and 10 Rwandan civilians are repatriated to Rwanda from Kamina as part of the Disarmament, Demobilization, Repatriation, Resettlement and Reintegration (DDRRR) operation of the armed groups.

On 5 October: Rwanda announces the end of its troop-withdrawal from the DRC. MONUC confirmed the withdrawal of 20,941 soldiers from 21 assembly sites.

On 21 October: The Security Council published the UN Experts Panel's report on the illicit trafficking of the DRC natural resources. DRC, Rwandan and Ugandan "Elites' networks" were named. Military and political officers from these countries as well as rebel movements members were also named by the report.

On 8 November: MONUC repatriated to Kigali 64 Rwandan ex-combatants, cantoned in Kamina in the framework of the DDRRR. This increases to 278 the total number of Rwandan ex-combatants and their dependants repatriated by MONUC on a voluntary basis.

On 11 November: Radio Okapi launched "Gutahuka", a new program in Kinyarwanda intended to inform the Rwandan armed groups based in the DRC on the package prepared for their return home and reintegration into civilian life.

On 20th November: MONUC completed the first phase of repatriation of Rwandan ex-combatants cantoned in Kamina to Rwanda. A total of 677 people comprising 375 ex-combatants and 302 dependents are repatriated.

On 4 December: The Security Council decided, by its resolution 1445, to reinforce MONUC mandate by authorizing the Mission's expansion whose military staff would be increased to 8,700 and will mainly consist of two intervention forces to be deployed gradually.

On 17 December: The Congolese parties to the Inter Congolese Dialogue (Kinshasa government, MLC, RCD, RCD-ML, RCD-N, Political Opposition, the Civil Society and the Mai Mai) signed a global and inclusive agreement for a consensual running of the transition. The agreement ordered a cessation of hostilities and committed the country along a political transition process path that should lead to legislative and presidential elections within a period of two years starting from the time the transition government is put in place.

On 26 December: MONUC inaugurated the Lubero reception center for ex-combatants who volunteer for the DDRRR (Disarmament, Demobilization, Repatriation, Reintegration, Resettlement).

On 30 December: Thanks to MONUC mediation, a ceasefire agreement was signed in Gbadolite between MLC, RCD-N and RCD-K/ML on a cessation of hostilities in Ituri. Gbadolite Agreement provided for an immediate cease-fire, the cessation of all troop-movement in the axis leading to Beni, Bunia, Butembo, Bafwasende and Watsa. It also guaranteed the freedom of

movement to the civilian populations from one area to another.

2003

On 9 January: France signed an agreement with the UNDP under which it provided the UNDP with 1,000,000 (one million) euros to support MONUC DDDR operations.

On 15 January: MONUC confirmed the gross human rights abuses in Mambasa. A preliminary report issued by MONUC Human Rights Unit on the events in the Northeast and Ituri, particularly in Mambasa, confirmed the gross human rights abuses perpetrated by MLC troops led by Jean Pierre Bemba and the RCD-N troops led by Roger Lumbala.

On 22 January: Monuc carried out a voluntary repatriation of 11 Rwandan ex-combatants of the Democratic Forces for the Liberation of Rwanda (FDLR). The returnees were among 21 people held by the Congolese authorities since October 2002.

On 31 January: Monuc declared having received alarming information on troop-movement in the East and North East of the DRC. The report signaled troop-movements and imminent attack by the RCD-Goma on Kanyabayonga, Lubero territory in North-Kivu, under RCD/K-ML control; the presence of four battalions of Congolese Armed Forces in Beni, RCD/K-ML; the presence of Rwandan troops in Ituri; the movements of Ugandan troops – two UPDF brigades – towards Mahagi, in the North of Bunia, near the border with Uganda; the presence of soldiers wearing Rwandan uniform in the Kivus.

On 6th February: following the unconfirmed information of troop-movements mainly in the North East of the DRC, MONUC military observers who conducted verifications, did not notice any presence of Ugandan presence – other than at the Bunia airport, nor that of Rwandan troops in Ituri and the East of the DRC.

On 7 February: Monuc carried out voluntary repatriation of nine Rwandan ex-combatants and their four dependents to Kigali, therefore increasing the number of Rwandan ex-combatants and dependents repatriated, to date, to 850 in the framework of MONUC DDDR operations.

On 10 February: DRC and Ugandan Ministers of Foreign Affairs signed an amendment to the Luanda agreement in Dar-Es Salaam, Tanzania, updating the calendar for the creation of Ituri

Pacification Committee and the withdrawal of Ugandan troops from Bunia.

On 18 February: Monuc announced the postponement of the signing ceremony of the agreement on the cessation of hostilities in Ituri for 19 February in Bunia, following Thomas Lubanga's objections. The leader of the Union for the Congolese Patriots (UPC) created more obstacles in order to prevent some actors to the Ituri crisis from participating in the efforts for the cessation of hostilities and the pacification of the region.

24 February: Monuc helicopter was fired on while flying over Bunia. The bullet penetrated the cockpit but the eight persons on board, including Monuc Force Commander, General Mountaga Diallo, escaped injury. The incident caused the suspension of MONUC flights to Bunia.

25 February: The United Nations Secretary-General, Kofi Annan, presents its thirteenth report on the situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo to the Security Council.

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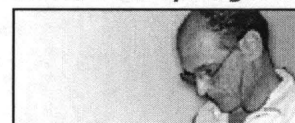
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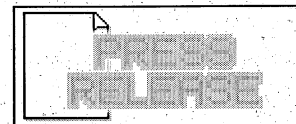
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
