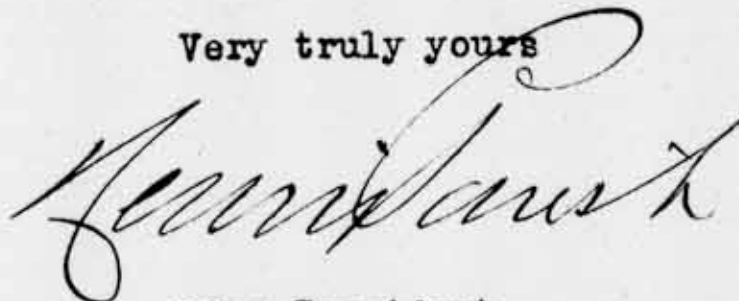

Dear Franklin:

Our Investment Committee has just reviewed the securities which we hold in the Trusts under your Deeds for the benefit of John A. Roosevelt and Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr.

In view of present conditions we have been endeavoring to increase the proportion of common stocks held in our Trusts, whereas ordinarily we adhere rather strictly to "fixed income bearing" securities. We feel that this procedure provides the possibility of participating in a normal upturn in business and also serves as a measure of protection against contingencies. The Committee has recommended the following changes in each Trust:

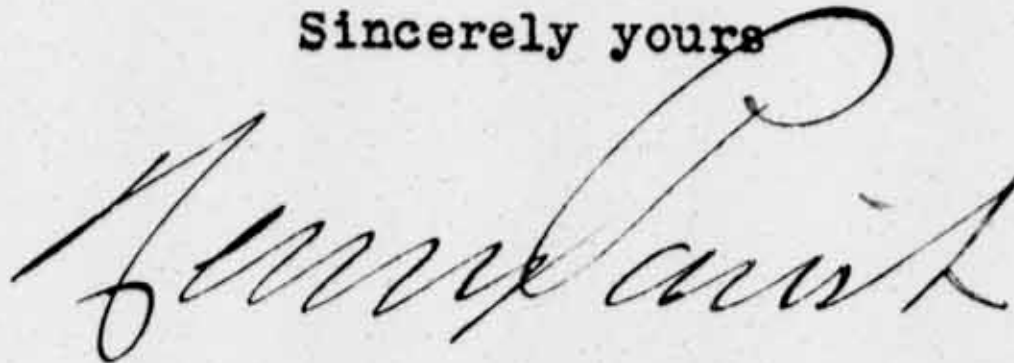

Dear Elliott:-

I am enclosing Jimmy's check for \$10,000 to cover the purchase of the new land.

The bond and mortgage should be made out to James Roosevelt for this amount at 4% interest, payable semi-annually, and I suggest the mortgage run for ten years.

In case on the purchase price you need a little more cash, I am sure both Jimmy and I would be willing to have you get this on a short payment first mortgage, say for one year, thereby making Jimmy's mortgage a second mortgage until the extra amount is paid off. I can arrange a little later on to take care of such an extra amount.

With the mortgage you should simultaneously get the title insurance, as you suggested, and be sure to have your lawyer have the deed to the property and the mortgage or mortgages properly recorded.

I have been held up on account of the flood conditions but hope to get off for Florida tomorrow.
