An estimated 20,000 pro-life Americans rallied that day. Today, the March for Life has grown to approximately 200,000 marchers.

BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Ambassador Le Cong Phung (Vietnam) graduated from Hanoi's Institute for International Relations and joined (North) Vietnam's Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1971. Prior to his posting in Washington, he served as Vice Foreign Minister handling Asian affairs, including border demarcation talks with China. He served as Ambassador to Thailand from 1993 to 1997, and as deputy in the Foreign Ministry's Policy Planning Department. Ambassador Phung enjoys golf and has two sons living in the San Francisco area. He speaks fluent English but is so soft-spoken that he can sometimes be hard to hear.

Ambassador Cornelius A. Smith (Bahamas) received a bachelor's degree in education from Bahamas Teachers Training College in 1957 and a master's degree in business administration from the University of Miami in 1982. This ambassadorship is his first diplomatic posting. He has had a long career in public service as a Member of Parliament and several times as a Cabinet minister, all as a member of the now-governing Free National Movement political party. Ambassador Smith enjoys fishing. He and his wife, the former Clara Elizabeth Knowles, have three children and several grandchildren.

Ambassador Dr. Suresh Chandra Chalise (Nepal) has a Ph.D. in political sociology from Banaras Hindu University in India. This is Ambassador Chalise's first ambassadorship. Prior to his posting in Washington, Ambassador Chalise served as Special Advisor to Prime Minister Koirala for Foreign Policy. Ambassador Chalise is a 2006 graduate of the Senior Executive Course at the Asia Pacific Center for Security Studies in Honolulu. He is an honorary citizen of Galveston, Texas. He speaks fluent English.

Ambassador Yao Charles Koffi (Cote d'Ivoire) studied geography at the University of Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire. He went on to complete his career diplomat degree at the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium. Since joining the Ivorian government in 1977, Ambassador Koffi held positions of increasing importance before becoming first counselor at the Embassy of Cote d'Ivoire in Washington, DC. He later served as Cote d'Ivoire's Ambassador to Mexico from 2004 to 2007. Ambassador Koffi is personally close to Ivoirian President Laurent Gbagbo and his family. He is married with three children, and he speaks excellent English. Ambassador Koffi enjoys tennis, swimming, and walking.

Ambassador Adrian Cosmin Vierita (Romania) received a degree in engineering from Bucharest Polytechnic Institute. This is Ambassador Vierita's second ambassadorship and third overseas tour. Prior to his posting in Washington, Ambassador Vierita served as State Secretary for European and Euro-Atlantic Affairs in the Romanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Since joining the Romanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ambassador Vierita has risen quickly through the ranks and is considered one of Romania's most talented and capable diplomats by the U.S. embassy in Bucharest. Ambassador Vierita enjoys classical music and opera. He speaks very good English.

Ambassador Paramanga Ernest Yonli (Burkina Faso) studied economics and development at universities in Burkina Faso, Benin, France, and the Netherlands and holds several degrees, including two doctorates. From November 2000 to June 2007, he served as Prime Minister, thereby holding the office longer than any other individual in Burkina Faso's history. Ambassador Yonli enjoys reading and jogging. He is married with four children, and he speaks proficient English.

Ambassador Carlos Bounbou (Gabon) studied international relations and political science at Schiller International University in London. This is Ambassador Bounbou's third ambassadorship and his fifth overseas posting. Prior to his posting in Washington, Ambassador Bounbou served as the Gabonese Ambassador to Libya and after that Spain, his last assignment. Ambassador Bounbou enjoys soccer, walking, and working out. Since his return to Gabon following his studies in London, Ambassador Bounbou has held government positions of increasing importance, including that of Chargé d'Affaires at the Gabonese Embassy in London. Ambassador Bounbou has five children: two sons who are studying in Europe, a daughter living in Libreville, and two younger children who have accompanied him and his wife to Washington. I. PURPOSE

To announce the establishment of the President's Advisory Council on Financial Literacy.

II. BACKGROUND

On April 25, 2007, as part of Financial Literacy Month, you met with Treasury Secretary Henry Paulson, Education Secretary Margaret Spellings, Housing and Urban Development Secretary Alphonso Jackson, and private sector leaders in the financial education field. At the meeting, you asked the Treasury Department, with the support of the other departments, to develop a new initiative to improve our Nation's financial literacy.

On August 31, 2007, in conjunction with your remarks related to helping homeowners avoid foreclosure, the Administration announced the intention to establish a financial literacy council to promote financial education. Today's event builds on these two prior announcements.

Note: Earlier on Tuesday, you will sign an Executive Order entitled "Establishing the President's Advisory Council on Financial Literacy." The individuals that you will greet are the new members of the Council. Chuck Schwab, Chairman and CEO of the Charles Schwab Corporation, will serve as Chairman, and John Hope Bryant, Chairman, CEO and Founder of Operation Hope, Inc., will serve as Vice Chairman.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON MEMBERS OF THE PRESIDENT'S ADVISORY COUNCIL ON FINANCIAL LITERACY

Charles "Chuck" Schwab, Chairman and CEO, Charles Schwab Corporation (Atherton, California)

Charles "Chuck" Schwab founded The Charles Schwab Corporation in 1971 and is known as a pioneer in the discount brokerage business. Today, the company is one of the Nation's largest financial services firms with \$1.4 trillion in client assets. Schwab provides full-service investing experience to clients through domestic offices, the Internet, and multilingual and international offices. Mr. Schwab is also Chairman of the Charles and Helen Schwab Foundation, a private charitable organization. Through direct service programs and grants, the foundation seeks to impact individual lives in a positive, meaningful, and lasting way.

John Hope Bryant, Chairman, CEO, and Founder, Operation Hope, Inc. (Los Angeles, California)

John Hope Bryant is the Founder of Operation HOPE, a non-profit organization that attempts to promote financial literacy among minority and under served communities. He is also the author of "Banking on our Future," a book whose aim is to promote youth and family financial literacy. JumpStart is a non-profit coalition, founded in 1995, of 180 national partner organizations from the corporate, academic, not-for-profit, and government sectors, as well as a network of 48 affiliated state coalitions, which share a commitment to advancing financial literacy for students in kindergarten through college. Before joining JumpStart, Ms. Levine served as the Director of the NASDAQ Stock Market Educational Foundation. She also worked with the National Association of Securities Dealers, Credit Union News, California Credit Union League, and the Vista Federal Credit Union.

David Mancl, Director, Office of Financial Literacy, Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions (Madison, Wisconsin)

David Mancl serves as state chair of the Wisconsin JumpStart Coalition on Economic and Personal Financial Education for Youth. The collaborative provides a forum to help coordinate existing private and public organizations with proven programs and materials to promote financial literacy among youth. Also, Mr. Mancl serves as the Executive Director of the Governor's Council on Financial Literacy for the State of Wisconsin, and he served on the 2002 Governor's Task Force on Financial Education for the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin State Superintendent's Task Force for Model Academic Standards for Personal Financial Literacy, the Board of Directors of *Economics* Wisconsin, and the Board of South Central Chapter of Wisconsin, BetterInvesting. Mr. Mancl joined the Department of Financial Institution (DFI) in 1997 and has served as policy advisor in the Office of the Secretary and as Administrator of the Division of Corporate and Consumer Services, and he has also headed DFI's financial education program.
