In our estimation, some individuals who have been in Africa for a considerable period are being flown back to Italy and Germany together with some wounded by air transport. It is not unlikely that some prisoners also may be transported in this manner. We have no suggestion that anything else is being thus transported.

NOTE:- The foregoing message is in reply to message sent requesting whether there were any indications that transports flying between Tunisia and Italy were carrying anything other than individuals or wounded.

Allied naval and military authorities are making a careful study of the conditions of proposed Gouverneur General Jonnart voyage purpose of which is to evacuate women and children from Tunis. American Military Attache Madrid for action AGWAR and USFOR pass to British Chiefs of Staff for information cite Phlia signed Eisenhower. Condition which must be met before eventual approval is that before calling at French mainland port ship must proceed to Algerian port. Choice of going on to France or landing in Algiers should be given passengers. Upon approval of voyage authorities will communicate with you further.

No evacuation will proceed from Callao Peru without specific WD authority in view of definite instructions contained in last sentence of urad 3599 February 21st. All arrangements for this evacuation made prior to our letter January 31st which letter intended purely precautionary for future and not to apply to February evacuation. (sgd Brett) At time receipt your radio and in accordance with previous arrangements ship had almost reached Callao and is now in port. Ambassador has never indicated to this office any difficulty about this evacuation and at his request transport has been authorized to remain at Callao until noon 24th on basis that misunderstanding will be clarified. He has been definitely asked to confirm whether or not Peruvian Govt and State Dept desire evacuation. In view of transport being there, our ability to intern aliens here for limited time so far as this particular group is concerned, and in interest of avoiding any disagreement with Peruvian Govt it is suggested that evacuation proceed. Upon receipt of definite information from Ambassador as to whether or not Peru and State Department desire evacuation, we shall communicate with War Dept for authority. Letter will follow giving full details.

It is recommended that the Department discount the sensational reports which occasionally it apparently receives from the Free French or from the sources in British West Africa. The Free French agents certainly are not unbiased observers and many of them have their own personal and political ends to serve. They are also apt to be over enthusiastic and too ready to be influenced by wishful thinking. This office has repeatedly had to give true reports debunking the sensational stories reaching the Department from other sources.

While there has been some anger and open resentment shown here as a result of the evacuation, particularly among officials who are forced to live in this area because of their official duties, there has been no street rioting or any signs of great unrest. It should be noted that the families of officials would not be liable to protest violently against the Government which they serve and on the other hand, the civilians who are against evacuation are divided and form a minority.

It should further be noted that Dakar itself, which alone is affected by the evacuation, should be distinguished both militarily and economically from the rest of French West Africa. When the evacuation of civilians was last ordered a move by the Americans against Dakar might have received some approval among the families of soldiers and noncommissioned officers and among the local civilians, but this time has passed. In the meantime the evacuation of families is now being blamed on the British and the Americans. It is now said that such defense measures are necessary in view of the attacks on Madagascar and persons who might otherwise have been sympathetic to such an attack now say that with their families in France they would hardly be likely to take any active part in assisting such an attack. They say that already their positions have been put in jeopardy by the sympathies for the United Nations which they have shown and now they feel discouragement because the attack which they once would have welcomed and which they counted on has not yet come.

In connection with this subject please refer to my telegrams no. 399 and 406.

It is estimated that a total of more than 7,000 women and children will be evacuated if the plan is given full execution. Today 1,300 women and children are leaving for Casablanca and Marseille on the 1st repatriation convoy made up of the SAVOIE, LIPARI and PORTHOS. This is half of the number of evacuees originally planned for this convoy.

It is possible that the evacuation is being carried out not only or primarily to make the defense of Dakar more easy but to remove family influences from all men who are potential defenders of Dakar or other parts of French West Africa.

Netherlands press announced orders prohibiting establishment of moving to new domiciles following coastal areas since construction in course coastal fortifications (1) necessitates entire or partial evacuation population (2) such evacuation both militarily necessary and in interests population which might suffer in fighting and (3) orderly and organized evacuation must be prepared and carried out in calm period rather than after fighting may start.

This rather frank announcement to Dutch public that fighting may be expected in the entire coastal region is of interest and it follows rather closely somewhat similar action in evacuating coastal areas in Denmark. While the permanent population appears not to be affected the order effectually showed control movement of unauthorized and thus in some cases suspect persons in the fortification zone.

For General McHarney. In order to carry out the evacuation of persons of Jap ancestry from the Pacific Coastal Frontier with any continuity of purpose no Japs is permitted to remain within Military Area Number 1. The Forest Area of Calif is in Military Area Number 2 and as soon as the evacuation of Military Area number 1 is complete evacuation of the Calif portion of Military Area Number 2 will be initiated and carried to completion. When that is done it will be equally essential to the success of the program that no exceptions be permitted and that no Japs be permitted to remain therein. Respecting the Naval Jap language school the Commandant 12th Naval Dist has made all necessary arrangements to remove that school to Denver, Colo where it can be operated without interruption and with equal efficiency under the jurisdiction of University of Colo. Com 12 has assured me that supervision of that school by University of Calif is not essential to its success. The same reasons which compelled the establishment of the policy respecting Military Area Number 1 obtain with respect to Calif portion of Military Area Number 2 which will shortly be evacuated of all Japs as indicated above.

Included among civilians were Indians, Anglo-Indians, Burmese, Anglo-Burmese and Europeans. In addition to evacuation work RAF dropped 100,000 lbs. food to evacuating parties on the ground. Brereton

Due to active belligerent submarine campaign in Gulf especially around New Orleans, CG CDC has directed that evacuation of women and children, officers on leave and enlisted men on furlough on 3 vessels leaving this department May 19 be voluntary. All officers enlisted men and officer candidates under orders are directed to sail. All sick, insane, and general prisoners also directed to sail. Vessels will be convoyed by 3 destroyers and available air coverage for entire voyage.

Memorandum for Naval Aide.

Subject: Evacuation of Dependents from Honolulu.

Admiral Bloch, who has recently returned from Honolulu, states advantage is taken of every boat which has facilities for carrying passengers to return dependents.

The Navy makes only the following exceptions:

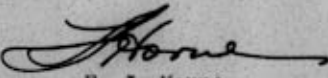
- (1) Dependents whose bona fide homes are in Hawaii.
- (2) Dependents holding positions in National Defense Work, who sign certificates - they will remain for the duration regardless of where husband is ordered.

Problem on merchant ships not fitted for carrying passengers, involves provision of sufficient life boats, life rafts, and life preservers and personnel to handle them as well as improvising toilet and messing arrangements.

The reason the remaining Navy dependents number, (as of May 1) 4000 against Army's 200 is that Navy had more to start with, - as indicated by figures as of March 11, when Commandant Fourteenth Naval District reported

The reason for greater number of Navy dependents in Hawaii December 7 is attributed to (1) greater percentage enlisted men married (2) number fleet dependents who drifted out while fleet was based at Pearl Harbor.
