My dear Miss Le Hand:-

On behalf of the committee charged with the administration of the Heyerman stamp holdings, I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 8th.

Please assure the President that it is farthest from our thoughts to either check his totalings, as he so kindly suggests, or to take exception to his pricings on the uncatalogued items; he has doubtless forgotten more about the latter than we will ever know; nor can his omission of damaged items from consideration be questioned.

But I must in frankness admit that we are rather disappointed to see a cash rating of only "one fifth cat" allotted to the undamaged catalogue total of \$322.17, thus bringing the total net figure for the entire collection down to the \$106.43 which you name. I may say that as a rough guess, for the mere reason that we could not analyze the collection in detail as the President has so painstakingly done, we had hoped to realize at least \$125.00 from it. If we were wrong in this, we must not be guilty of even seeming to "haggle" with the distinguished other party to the transaction.

I am therefore authorized by my fellow-committeemen to say that if the President feels disposed to wander somewhat upward from his figure, though not necessarily all the way toward ours, it will be appreciated; we are content to leave the determination of this to him. And it will simplify matters if the check, whatever its amount, though sent in my care, be made payable to (Mrs.) Elizabeth H. Heyerman.

Perhaps you will recall that we had some correspondence relative to Haitian stamps of which I have a nice stock gleaned while I was in the Diplomatic Service at Port-au-Prince. This was during your term as Governor of New York. I tried to have you allow me to send you some stamps of Haiti at that time.

At the present moment I have remade some of my books of Haiti 1881 and 1882 liberty heads and would be pleased to send them to you.

While in Haiti as a member of the Haitian Philatelic Society we were able to get the material for a handbook on all the Haitian stamps and it is now published in German as the Kohl-Briefmarken Handbuch. If you are interested I would also be glad to mail my copy to you. This is gratis.

I am a collector of Presidential Franks and if it is not too much trouble could you sign the outside of an envelope with your signature, upper right hand?
