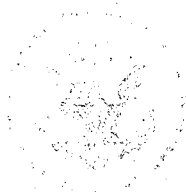

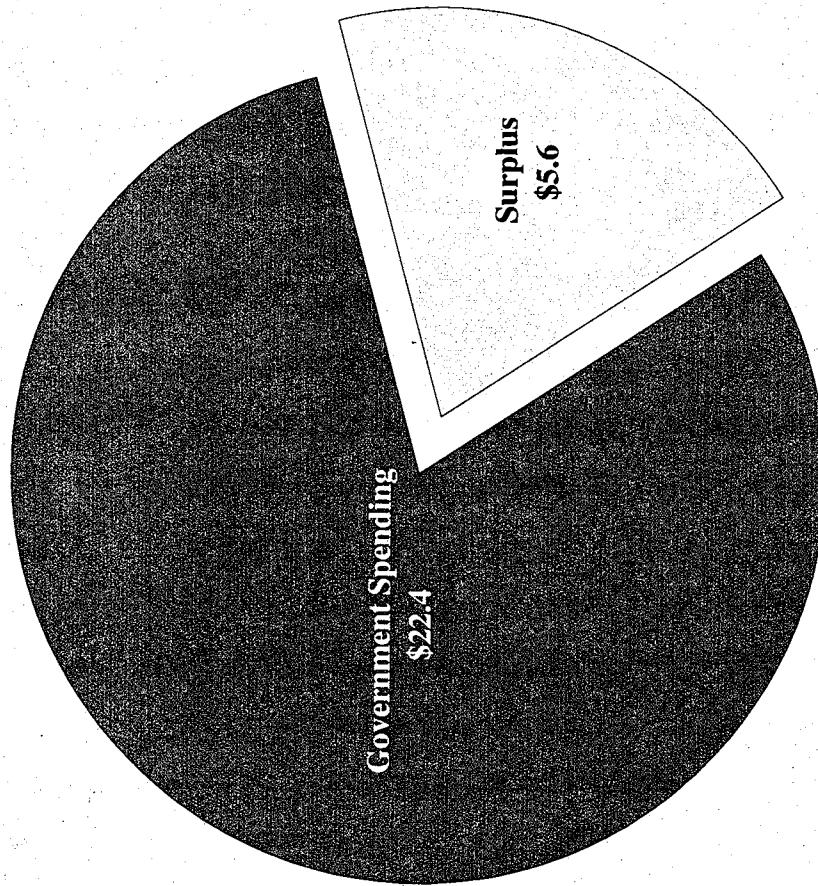

2002-2011**

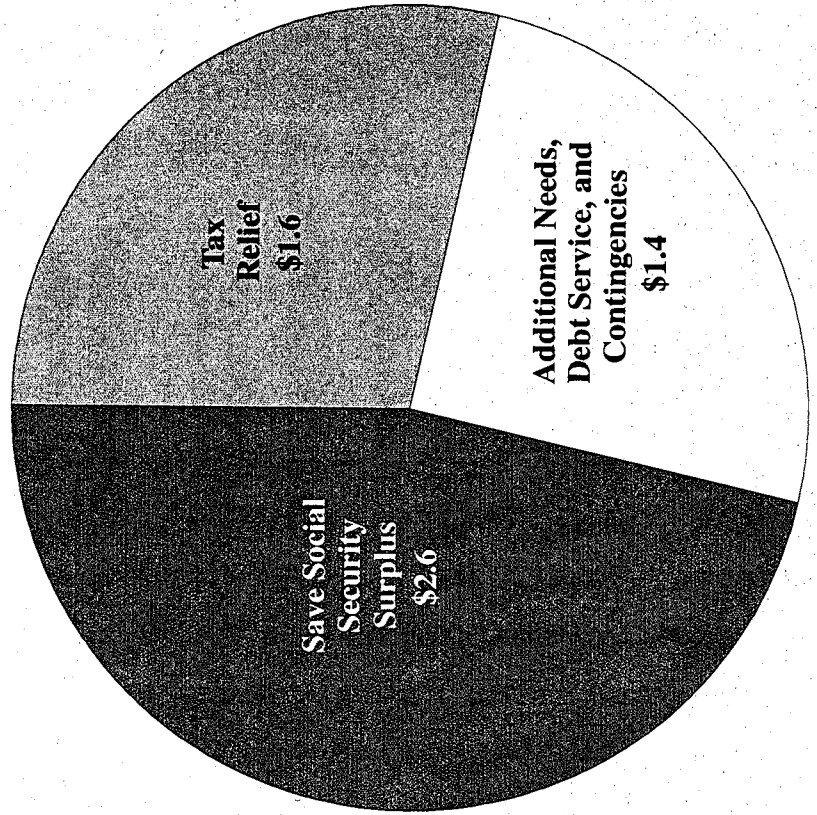
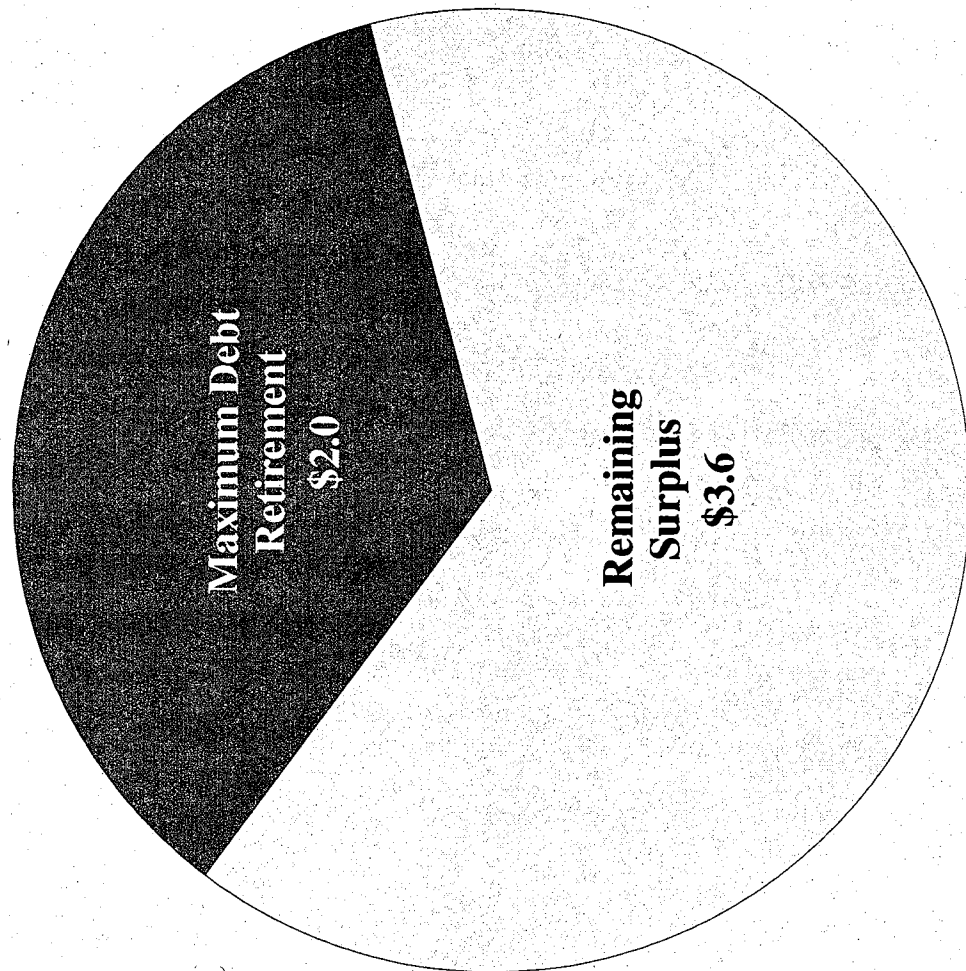


Chart III-2. President's 10-Year Budget Plan

Thank you very much. I am honored to join all of you in celebrating the great work of the National Children's Cancer Society.
