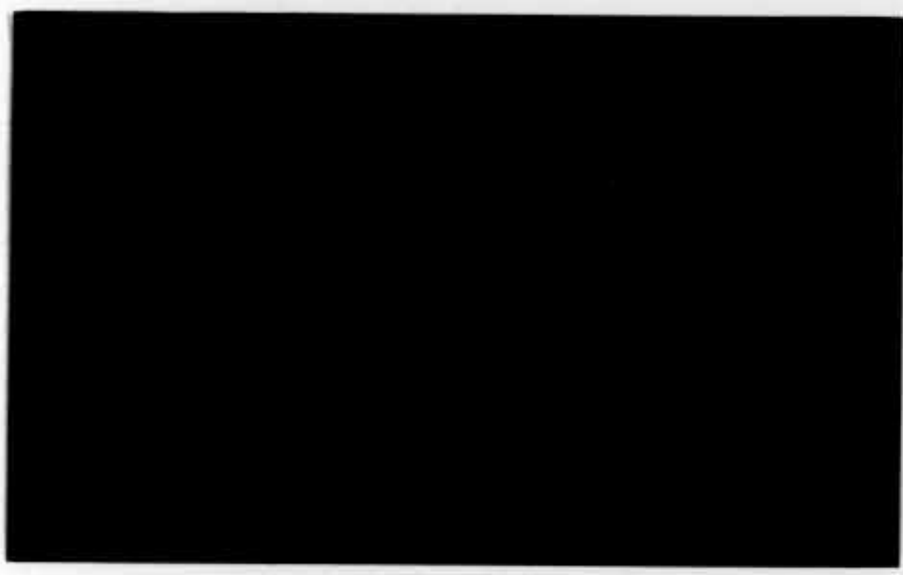

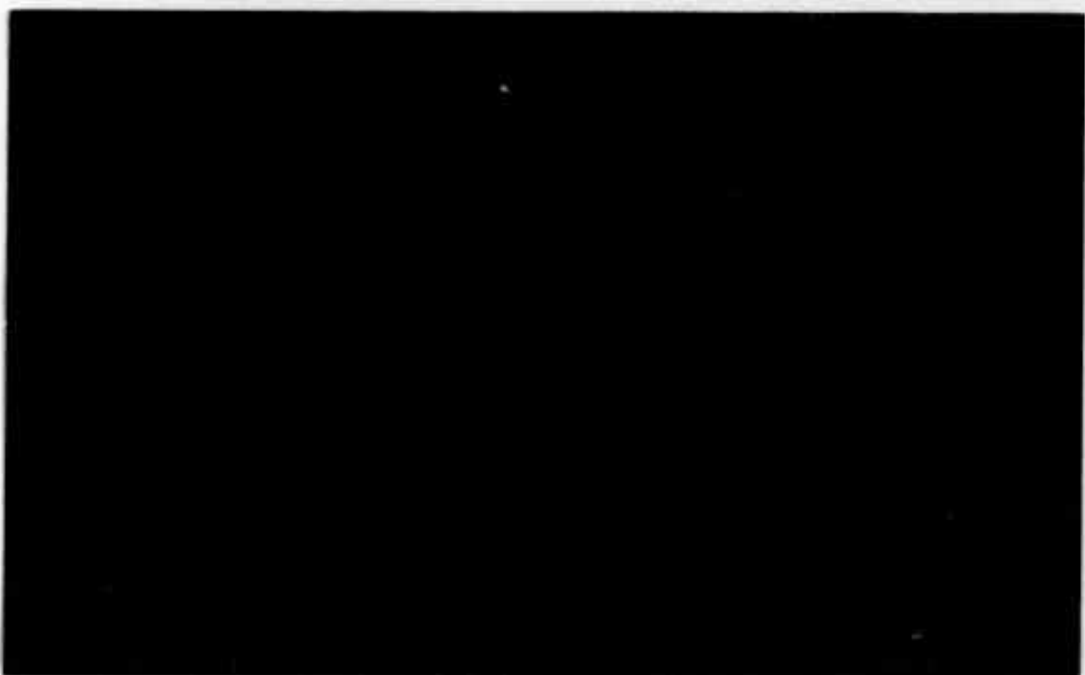

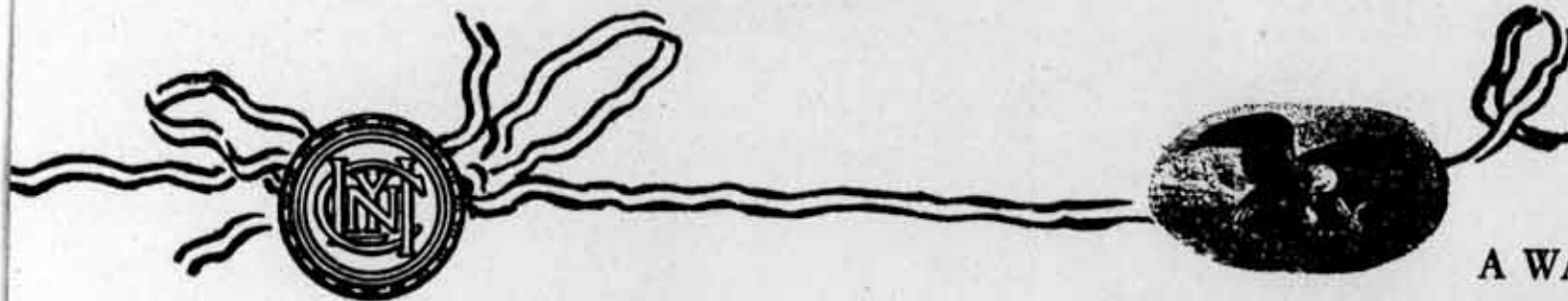

Holland Lodge No. 8, M. & A. M.

Notice from the Standing Committee to Members in the Armed Forces

New York, October 27, 1942

Holland Lodge, No. 8, established just after the Revolutionary War, has existed through the War of 1812, the Mexican War, the Civil War, the Spanish-American War, and the first World War. In the present world conflict, the Lodge is establishing an enviable record from the viewpoint of patriotism because, taking only our records on hand to date, no less than 52 annual members, i.e. members paying annual dues, have already joined the armed forces and more are expected to follow.

From the viewpoint of Lodge income, however, this record is also significant, for it means, on the basis of the approximate membership for the present fiscal year to end October 31, 1942, that out of a total of \$8,225 receivable for dues in support of the Lodge from annual members, approximately \$1,300 has come from members now in military or naval service. Should this latter amount all be withheld for the duration of the war, the annual income would not equal the annual expenditure.

The Lodge has no way of increasing its income and no way of reducing its expenditures except by curtailing the service it endeavors to give to the membership. This the Standing Committee believes would be undesirable in the long run. Unlike a club, the Lodge must pay a tax to the Grand Lodge upon every member whether in the armed forces or not.

The matter of the remission of dues to the annual members in the armed forces has received the very serious consideration of the Standing Committee. The By-Laws of the Lodge recently were amended so as to provide for remission of dues to the extent permitted by the Grand Lodge constitution in cases where such remission was recommended by the Standing Committee.

This Committee has determined as a matter of policy to recommend remission in every case that it is requested to the extent that it is requested, i.e. 100 per cent, 50 per cent, 25 five per cent or any other percentage of the full dues of \$25.00 where the request comes from a member actually in military or naval service. This means that the matter of remission and the extent thereof is left to the individual member. What he requests in this matter will be accorded to him.

A word of explanation as to why this decision was arrived at seems in order. A Masonic Lodge has obligations which a social club which is merely maintained for convenience or luxury does not have. It would be highly undesirable for the Lodge or for anyone in its behalf to adjudge individual situations and from such action lay down discriminatory distinctions and yet it is, we believe, a fair and reasonable assumption that many of our members in service, who are the best judges of their individual circumstances, would not wish to avail themselves of the right of exemption in whole or perhaps in part.

To enable this individual judgement to be exercised and in aid of keeping the financial records of the Lodge in order, a form card is enclosed which you are asked to check in the square you select, and return to the Secretary. An addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience.

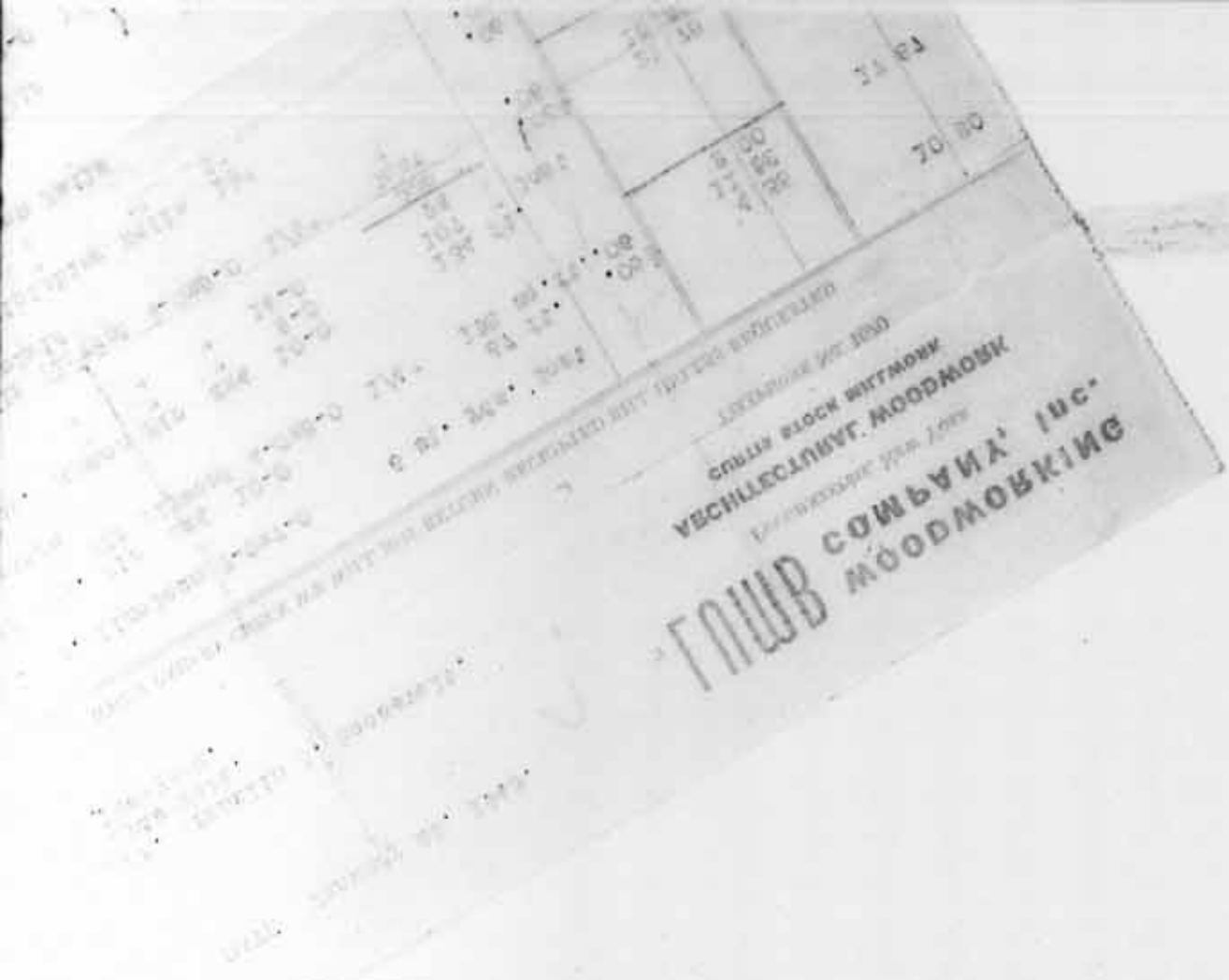

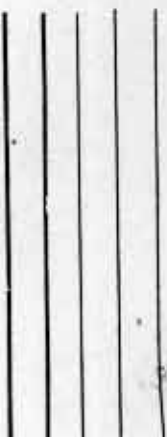

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The vaults shall be open from 9 A. M. to 4:30 P. M. of each business day, excepting on Saturday, when they shall be closed at 12:30 P. M. (June-September, inclusive—closing time one-half hour earlier).

No person shall be allowed access to a safe excepting the lessor or such person or persons as he may authorize on the books of the Parish Safe Deposit Company, hereafter known as the "Company", or by power of attorney approved by the Company, or the legal representative of the lessor in the event of his death or of other disability. The Company shall not be liable for any act of a representative of the lessor, unless it has had actual notice in writing of the revocation of his authority. The lessor shall indemnify the Company against any unauthorized or wrongful act of any representative of the lessor.

Unless expressly notified that access to a safe is to be had only by two or more persons together, either or any one of joint tenants or his authorized representative, shall have such access and the right to surrender the safe.

The Company shall exercise ordinary diligence in order that unauthorized persons may not be allowed access and no unauthorized access shall be inferred from partial or total loss of property.

Payment for the use of a safe shall be due in advance.

The Company may terminate the lease of a safe at any time upon the repayment or tender of the pro-rata rental for the unexpired period.

Upon the termination of a lease the keys shall be returned and the Company notified in writing, or the Company may consider the lease in effect for a further period.

The lessor shall not use the leased space for any purpose hazardous or illegal nor shall he assign, underlet or in any way part with possession of said space or any part thereof. The lessor shall not deliver his keys to any person not authorized to have access as herein provided, and he shall notify the Company forthwith of the loss of one or both keys, and any remaining key shall be surrendered to the Company. All expense incurred by changing locks or furnishing new keys shall be paid by the lessor.

The lessor must not leave safes unlocked at any time, and the contents thereof shall not be examined in the vaults, rooms being provided for such purpose.

The Company shall be promptly notified of any change of address of the lessor, or of any desired change of right of access to a safe.

In case the Company is served with any legal process which affects or in the opinion of the Company may affect property in, or alleged to be in, said space, the Company may, without incurring any liability to the parties entitled to access, suspend the right of access to the said space until it is advised by counsel of its interests.

Upon the death of any lessor, whether space is rented to one or more lessors, the Company may deny access to the leased space to all parties interested therein until the proper taxing authority of the State of New York has been notified and an opportunity given for a representative of said taxing authority to be present at the opening of the said space and all claims for taxes upon any property in said space as against the Company have been released and proper written evidence thereof received by the Company.

Where a safe is leased by a Corporation or an Association, the lessor shall file with the Company a duly certified copy of the resolution of its Governing Body designating such officers of the Corporation, person or persons who shall have access to and power to surrender the leased space. Such authority shall continue until the Company shall have received written notice of its revocation. Notice of any change of officers of the Corporation shall be promptly furnished the Company.

These rules and regulations supplement and do not restrict the rights of the Company otherwise established by law.



To Our Subscribers:

Recently, as a part of the Telephone Hour Radio Program which is broadcast every Monday Evening at 9 P.M. over a nation-wide network including WEAJ, New York—WGY, Schenectady—WBEN, Buffalo—and WSYR, Syracuse—several questions relating to the war time shortage of telephone equipment were discussed. Because of the general interest in the subject, we reprint here the full text.

ANNOUNCER: Nearly everyone who is waiting to have a telephone installed understands the principal reason for the delay: Practically no telephone facilities have been made for normal civilian use since Pearl Harbor — while the *demand* for service has gone sky-high. But a lot of people ask us questions about par-

tioular situations — questions like these:

MAN: I'm waiting for a telephone, but a neighbor of mine just got one put in. Why should he get one before I do?

ANNOUNCER: Well, your neighbor may *need* a telephone for vital war work, or to carry on some kind of essential civilian activity such as public health, or police or fire protection. I'm sure you'll agree that we *should* install that kind of service first . . . It's also quite possible that your neighbor applied for service before you did. If so, his name is higher on the list, and in all fairness his order should be filled ahead of yours.

WOMAN: We're going to move into a home where there's a telephone already installed. Why can't we have that one?

ANNOUNCER: Well, that would be convenient for you and convenient

for us, just to let you have the telephone that is there. But how about the man who is on the waiting list and has waited months and is due the next telephone that is given up? It would not be fair to him.

MAN: Just how long will I have to wait to get a home telephone?

ANNOUNCER: That's pretty hard to say, because it depends on a number of things beyond our control. On the number of present users who decide to give up service, for example, and on how much of the equipment released has to be used for essential war and civilian activities. Then, too, the type and extent of shortages vary from place to place — even in different neighborhoods of the same city. So at the moment, the best answer I can give you is that we're doing all we can to make the waiting period as short as possible.

It's not an easy situation, but we're trying our best to be fair to every-

body. We think what we are doing is as good as human ingenuity can devise. We also know the only kind of rationing that is satisfactory is to give everyone what he wants. We'll be happy when we get back to that stage.

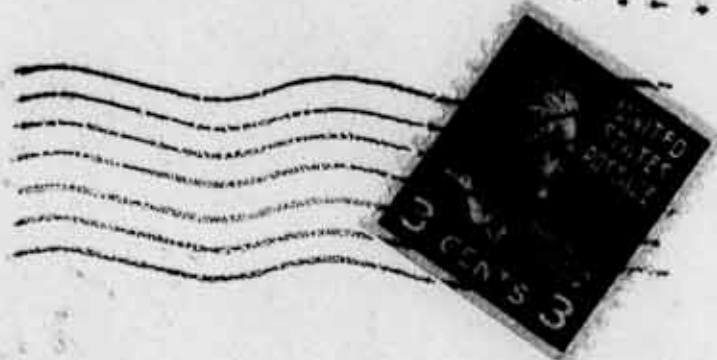

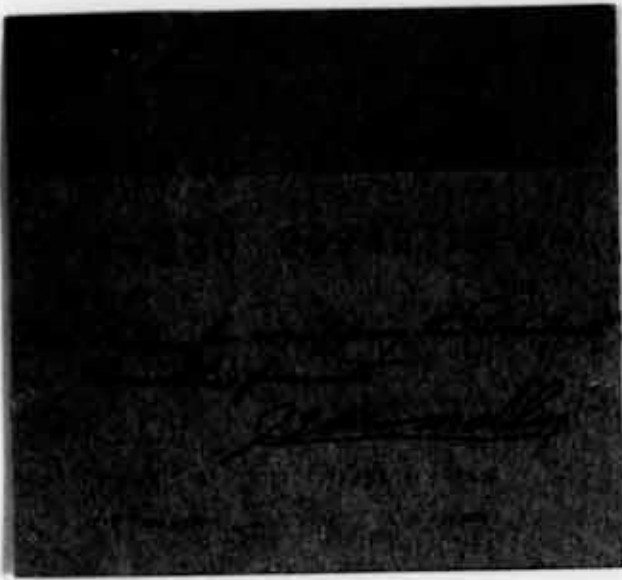
