Kommando 120 in south, though Trupps 123 and 134 believed to
have been more successful in Moselle and Cleve areas

cover stories of agents. Captured agents state more use being made of Abwehr personnel for espionage; if captured latter may pose as deserters and claim PW status.

3. Following additional details current GIS activities.

Luftwaffe signals WT operators being attacked to Trupps as short term stay behind agents. German refugees being sent back across Rhine to operate in places of residence.

SD continuing to train members of Darnand's Wilice for espionage and sabotage. More agents being given mission to penetrate Allied Intelligence Services.

Captured agents state others being issued with camouflaged poison for assassination. Evidence that enemy still hopes to exploit sabotage dumps in Belgium.

Espionage:

A. Two Abwehr stay behind agents captured near Satzvey in camouflaged dugout with WT signal equipment and food for 20 days. They had transmitted on 3 days prior to arrest.

B. Two post occupational agents arrested Cologne and First United States Army areas.

D. Two confessed WT agents under a interrogation First Army.

Yalta decisions and with no anti Nazi rallying point, will probably support the crumbling Wehrmacht to the last. This attitude helpful to GIS improvisations and guerrilla preparations.

For guerilla activity Wehrwolf organization was formed under Himmler about November 1944. This pre-dominantly SS with regional control by higher SS and Polire leaders. Organization intended operate on all fronts and training, with special emphasis on WT, proceeding in several localities; many Hitler Jugend trainees. Trainees also selected from men whose homes are Allied occupied territory. Group in sabotage are possibly from this organization.

1. Continued enemy espionage activity in Spanish Morocco has been reported by U. S. Legation, Tangier. U.S. Naval Attache accompanied by Spanish officer inspected premises at 16, Calle Teniente Pacheco, Ceuta, 22nd February 45, where they found radio transmitter, codes, and messages for transmission.

2. Legation has notified General Orgaz that Manuel Centeno, 7, Calle De La Legion, Ceuta, employed airport of Ceuta, is member of German Intelligence Service and chief of all observation services in Ceuta area, and that he possesses all codes used and handles all coded telegrams with German Intelligence Service.

3. Orgaz was also informed that another of Centeno's observatories was believed to exist on side of Recinto proceeding up by Pasaje Del Recreo, and that German Consul gave Centeno one transmitting set in Ceuta, 27th January 45.

4. Difficult to believe these activities are conducted without tacit approval of some authorities in Ceuta, possibly involving Spanish Intelligence Service, particularly in view of refusal to expel Seydel, active German agent,

18 for week ending 16th February 1945:

1. According to captured agents numerous parachute
operations are in readiness and only awaiting suitable weather
and aircraft. Flying Fortress operated by GIS is stated to
have American signals code and American method of establishing
identity with ground; Fortress has compartments to prevent
contact between the different groups of agents to be dropped.
Tendency for saboteurs to be parachuted rather than passed
through lines.

2. Increased efforts, partly stemming from Atlantic pockets, are being made to overhaul, activate and extend stay behind network. Extent of effort indicates possible long term aim directed at post Armistice period. This type operation now thought to have priority over short term military tactical missions.

3. Many agents now given as additional mission assassination of persons of importance.

4. Captured agents report interest in Belgium increasing and directed partly at ports and shipping.

5. Use of dogs as couriers considered probable: 1 dog caught 6th Army Group area. Use of carrier pigeons by agents has considerably increased.

6. Many instances parachutes and equipment found, latter including small printing press, mortars and a marked map.

7. Reports point to greater GIS activity from Spain, Germans relying increasingly on Spanish Intelligence Services to run agents for them. French renegades among those being employed.

8. Indications that GIS are utilizing sources in neutral legations in Paris for espionage purposes.

A. Eight out of nine agents parachuted (summary number 17, espionage A) now captured in following areas: three at Metz, one at Luneville, two at Maubeuge, two at Dijon.

B. Five parachutists captured near Douai each equipped with landing contraption (summary number 15) of type to hold one man.

C. One (SD) Ant six (WT) stay behind agent discovered in Belgian prison.

D. Abwehr agent, parachuted with WT at Chartres, has surrendered in Paris. Mission was to contact an official in an Allied consulate in Paris.

E. Three Abwehr agents captured First Army area including recruiter for Kommando 120.

F. German agent arrested had mission establish himself with WT at Marseilles. Reports required include results of possible future V1 attack from north Italy.

G. Member of Eins (rpt Uins) Marine captured on Mediterranean Coast. Recruited in November and trained at San Remo.

Sabotage.

A. Three Flemish SS agents dropped in new type container night of 3rd February 1945 near Putte, one surrendering next day. Agents recruited at Geestacht near Hamburg

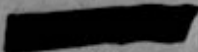

and trained at Bad-Ems under Wagner in service of Skorzeny. WT with party. Mission troop and convoy movement, V weapon reports, sabotage in Antwerp and of railway lines. Party had considerable quantity sabotage equipment. Pistols with silencers carried for assassination of Belgian Minister of Justice, General Ganshof and Burgomaster of Antwerp. Surrendered agent had instructions to find landing ground for later party of parachutists. Many Belgian parachutists reported in training.

B. Three girls from Sonderkommando Hager state mission was to set up female resistance organization composed of French Fascists and have provided names of possible members. Most of these Sonderkommando now arrested.

C. Three parachutes with cylindrical containers of sabotage equipment found about 20 miles north east of Sajie.

D. Further member of SD saboteurs parachuted at Guilty captured (summary number 17).

E. Three blocks of German explosives found 7th February 1945 under pipeline near Vire.

F. Two parachute agents dropped 3rd February 1945 21st Army Group area. One captured 8th February 1945 and one surrendered. Mission sabotage, assassinations and V damage.

150th Panzer Brigade. PW truck driver of brigade captured 3rd February, 1945 gives following information.

Total strength of brigade was 2,000 to 3,000 men with approximately 50 assorted Tigers and Panthers with false American superstructures.

Brigade reassembled 5th January at Blankenheim and returned to Grafenwoehr; about a hundred jeeps and 30 US two and a half ton trucks were with party. Some men still wearing American uniforms. Brigade believes their own attack was betrayed in advance and Americans knew what to expect.

On return to Grafenwoehr Brigade gave in American uniforms and equipment and on 17th January it was officially dissolved by Lieutenant Colonel Wulf; Skorzeny was not present. No ceremonial but appeal for volunteers for SS JAGD Verbaende, which was described as a Sonderkommando of similar nature to 150th Panzer Brigade. Nobody forced to volunteer. Men then received 14 days leave and returned to their units. Volunteers for JAGD Verbaende received only 9 days leave.

The Germans have offered to relieve the situation by providing food trains from the North East to the West. They guarantee trains would be used for food transport only and that Dutch personnel and engine drivers shall be employed.

Extremist left wing elements organizing themselves in cells and occupying key positions in the underground movement.

Germany.

Interrogation of captured 15 year old Hitler Jugend member reveals that he attended a sabotage school near the Dutch border, where 400 similar members were in training. The members attended school from July to September 1944 under German and Flemish SS Instructors. Considerable attention paid to coverstories with result that this interrogation proved difficult. It may be assumed considerable number Hitler Jugend now effectively trained in sabotage.

Following is from member of Amt 6. In general, German resistance plans are based on lessons learned from Soviet Partisans. Cadres of the movement will be formed by JAGD Verbaende with smaller sabotage and intelligence units and individual agents. Volksturm will also be included, exact role not at present clear.

Intelligence and sabotage plans are worked out by Amt 6 under Schellenberg, assisted by Schmitz, who helped Franco's Armies in Spanish Civil War. Most of resistance

leaders will come from Amt 6, Senior Gestapo Officers (Amt 4) being drawn on also.

In view of close links binding Amt 3 to the Hitler Jugend, this section will also be active.

Present senior RSHA leaders will all disappear. It is intended to make full use of the KRIPD (criminal police) IE Amt 5, on the principle that Allies will not be able to dispense with it, however much they may tamper with the ORPO (ordinary uniformed police). For this purpose Gestapo men are being introduced into KRIPD, so that they can continue their work under its cover. These Gestapo men will probably not be those who are now working abroad, but younger men now working in Germany. The life of a post occupation German agent is estimated at one and a half years.

WT units in resistance groups will be mobile, sets being probably captured British or American and operators being chosen from suitable members of the Hitler Jugend.

There follows report from CO Ladd Field for G-2:

Broadcast believed German heard by pilot Flt Jack R Dean and copilot Flt Carl F Lewis on 1132 kilocycles between 2000 PWT and 2145 BWT 17th January 45 enroute Nome to Fairbanks. German speaking voice and possibly Japanese voice heard clearly on same frequency while over Moses Point Alaska by same pilots enroute Fairbanks to Nome between 2015 BWT and 2145 BWT 18th January 45. Radio compass direction finder used in attempt to determine location of station. While over Moses Point flying on course of 240 degrees a bearing of 110 degrees was shot on signal with ADF reading of 350 degrees. Pilots believe station located north of Nome possibly near Winwright or Point Barrow but back azimuth of bearing of 110 shot on signal passes in vicinity of Marshall Alaska where 1 Jap balloon has been recovered and another located 14th Jan 45. Intelligence officer this Headquarters and an FBI agent are investigating second balloon and possible connection with strange broadcast. Monitoring net and direction finder net established to attempt to locate any secret enemy station. Will keep you informed results.

Sabotage.

1. Further to sabotage section B of Summary number 10, saboteurs left from airfield at Finow, 30 kilometers north west of Berlin and possessed blank sheets of paper bearing stamp of Mayor of Marseilles. Stamp bore incorrect inscription "Forces Francaises De L'Interieures". They state Norwegians, Austrians and Czechs also under training. On completion of mission saboteurs were to regain German lines either on east or on Atlantic.

2. Indications of preparation for seaborne sabotage operations out of the German held Atlantic ports.

3. Night of 6/7 January. Three parachutists, with WT, landed near Tulle; one captured. Three parachutists landed at Toulouse; one captured.

General security and political factors.
