
Thank you very much for your note of appreciation regarding my autobiography, which you graciously accepted at the May 8 EIA Government-Industry Dinner.

## LETTER TO PASTORS DISTRICT 15, FLORIDA

May 8, 2001

Dear :

As you know, last Thursday, May 3, was the National Day of Prayer. It was, in particular, a very special occasion in that it was the 50th anniversary of this event and the first one with our new President, George W. Bush, in the White House. As you know, I am strongly committed to encouraging more Americans to pray, and that I feel prayer has played a critical role in the birthing of this nation and sustaining us through many difficult challenges in the years passed.

This year, I had the privilege of being invited to a special National Day of Prayer service held at the White House. There were many religious leaders in attendance along with the National Day of Prayer coordinator, Shirley Dobson, who spoke at the event.

The President's words that day were especially comforting and encouraging. I want to share them with you today:

"This is a day when our nation recognizes a power above our power, and influence beyond our influence, a guiding wisdom far greater than our own. The American character, it 's strong and confident; but we have never been reluctant to speak of our own dependence on providence.

Our country was founded by great and wise people who were fluent in the language of humility, praise and petition. Throughout our history, in danger and division, we have always turned to prayer. And our country has been delivered from many serious evils and wrongs because of that prayer.

We cannot presume to know every design of our Creator, or to assert a special claim on His favor. Yet, it is important to pause and recognize our help in ages past and our hope for years to come.

The first President to live in the White House arrived with a prayer. In a letter to his wife, written on his second night here, John Adams offered a prayer that Heaven might bless this house and all those who would call it

home. One of his successors, Franklin D. Roosevelt, thought enough of that prayer to have it inscribed on a mantle piece in the State Dining Room where you can still find it today.

In this house, I make many decisions. But as I do so, as I make those decisions, I know as surely as you said that many Americans lift me up in prayer. Those prayers are a gracious gift, and Laura and I and my family greatly appreciate them.

America has many traditions of faith and many experiences of prayer. But I suspect that many who pray have something in common: that we may pray for God's help, but as we do so, we find that God has changed our deepest selves. We learn humility before His will and acceptance of things beyond our understanding. We discover that the most sincere of all prayers can be the simple words, 'Thy will be done.' And that is a comfort more powerful than all our plans."

I hope this letter finds you and your congregation doing well. May God bless you in your work in the months and years ahead. And may we go forward together—on our knees in prayer.

Below are my notes from the roundtable with the President.....

We went into this meeting not completely clear on the format, so I had to re-plan what I was going to do/say about three times,... the last time was during the President's speech at the banquet. In short, the final guideline we were each given was a 30-60 second window to deliver a message,..... the President's "people" stressed that this message was to focus on "technology" and how it is helping or can help save energy. Then the president was to ask questions during, before or after at his discretion..... so below, is my "blow by blow" summary of what transpired.....

Immediately after the speech, the Secret Service ushered us (12 businesses) into a small room. We each had assigned seats, with the President, Gov. Davis, Mayor Riordan, and the moderator sitting at the front of the tables which were arranged in a square. So there were 4 people on each side of the square. I sat between Craig Barrett, CEO of Intel, and John Woolard CEO of Silicon Energy. I was about six feet diagonally from the President. (Also in attendance were: Ake Almgren, CEO of Capstone, Howard Earhart, CEO of Power Integrations, Inc., Brian Halla, CEO of National Semiconductor, Ellen Hancock, CEO of Exodus Communications, Peter Larkin, President of the California Grocers Association, Liam McGee, President of Bank of America (California), Bill Pauli, President of the CA Farm Bureau Federation, and Vince Sollitto, CEO of Photon Dynamics.

When the President entered the room, he went around the room shaking hands. I introduced myself by saying, "Mr. President, this is an honor, I'm Charles Zimmerman from Wal-Mart. The President shook my hand, told me he was glad I could come, then as he passed me he patted me on the back and said, "tell those boys down in Bentonville I said hello....."

After the introductions we were seated, and the President quipped about his "much talked about meeting" with the Governor which was scheduled to occur after our meeting. Governor Davis was pleasant during the meeting, and said very little. Mayor Riordan said nothing. The President talked about his energy policy and the fact that it dealt with not only conservation and production, but with protecting the environment as well. He said he recognized the responsibility of the Federal Government in any energy crisis, but that it was people like us sitting in the room that would ultimately find the solutions. He stressed that a free market place is the only way to stimulate the thinking that will create the solutions. I have a copy of the White House's summary of the President's energy policy that I will distribute separately.

The moderator made a few brief comments basically identifying the time constraints that we had all been placed under and described the two basic business types represented (i.e., consumers, and technology). Then he said, "As is typical in most areas, including energy, Wal-Mart will take the lead in today's exercise....." This is basically what I said,..... as the first speaker (..... given the parameters I was asked to stay within...)

"Mr. President, it is an honor to be here..... At Wal-Mart we tend to focus more on long-term energy efficiency vs. short-

term conservation measures that are typically designed only as a temporary response to a crisis."

"We utilize state of the art energy management systems in each of our stores to monitor and control everything from lighting to temperature and humidity back home in Bentonville, AR."

"Our skylight and computer controlled dimming technology (a technology we developed right here in CA) frees up enough energy alone to supply 23,000 homes. By utilizing the latest technological advances in lighting, systems control, and high efficiency equipment, Wal-Mart currently saves enough energy to supply a total of 28,000 American homes each and every day....."

The President then looked at me and asked, "So you can control energy useage at each and every one of your stores from Bentonville?" I said, "Yes, Sir". He then asked, "So how is that going? What kind of impact can you make?" I responded, "Well, as an example, here in California we have seen a decrease in KW utilization of approximately 16% compared to the same time last year in the same stores,.... this is partially a result of our energy management system and adjustments we have been able to make from Bentonville, and it is also partially due to our compliance with the Governor's Executive order from a few months ago regarding parking lot lighting....." The President asked, "16%?",..... I answered, "Yes, Sir... 16%". Governor Davis said, "Great!". Then the moderator moved on. (This was the only reaction from the Governor.....)

A couple of the subsequent speakers, specifically Peter Larkin of the CA Grocers Association and John Woolard of Silicon Energy mentioned in their statements phrases such as "...much like W/M we to, etc. etc". So going first had it's advantages. For the most part, the technology people pitched the fact that there was technology available that could make significant impacts into the pool of "wasted energy", and the generator No one specifically mentioned price caps, but it was alluded to enough times to demonstrate that Governor Davis was the only one in support of price caps (even though he didn't say this in our meeting....)

When it was all over, the president came by and shook my hand again and thanked me for coming..... then, something really neat happened,.... one of the photographers that knew that I was in complete awe over being in the presence of the President, brought him back again and had him pose with me for a good picture. So basically I'm still waiting for my feet to touch the ground. This Christmas I won't be using a picture of Lee for my team Christmas Cards..... it will be a picture of me and The President.

*I have been thrown aside*

At the very end of the meeting as it was breaking up, Governor Davis came over and to me and stated, "You guys are great to work with, you've been absolutely wonderful through this whole thing...." I think Wal-Mart has been one of the absolutely only bright spots for him during this whole energy deal,.... we've been supportive and have made him look good on occasion.

During the press briefing afterwards, there were no questions for anyone but the Intel CEO, and only a handful of those.

I think it went very well. The President was very gracious and made me feel like I belonged in the same room with all of the rest of them (even though he actually knew most of them....). As he spoke, for whatever reason, he seemed to look at me alot.... which made me feel a lot more at ease being in his presence. That's why my notes on the meeting aren't real thorough,.... I thought it best to look him in the eye vs. scribbling notes.

I think the neatest thing about the whole meeting was the fact that Wal-Mart was the only one with a story about real every day people and how what we do can have a positive impact on them. I think that is why a couple of the others referred to us.

We have a great story to tell,.... it's not my story,.... but I'm honored to tell it.

Bob MacAdam, Jay Allen, Mike Duke, Eric Zorn, and Paul Carter..... thank you for this opportunity. I will never, ever forget it. I could go on and on (I probably already have,....) but I still can't get over what I got to do today.

Jay forward this to whoever you feel is appropriate.



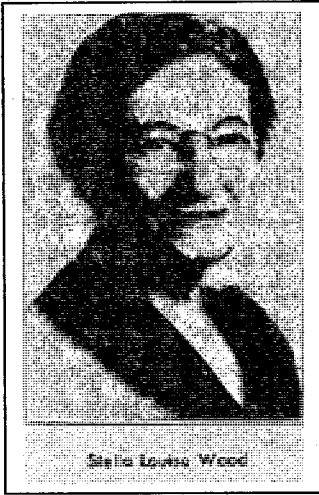

This is a response to the many letters on school reform found in many Newspapers all over the country.

I believe if a Community College would sponsor a school, all money coming from the state would go to the College and the accountability pay plus regular salaries for the certified teachers and building Principal would be paid by the College.

There are several ideas for the instructors. My favorite idea would be to have 4 classroom teachers also be the instructors for the college classes. Each would teach one fourth of the year and when finished go back to the classroom of the next teacher who will teach. Again after the first semester another classroom teacher will teach during the 3<sup>rd</sup> section of the year with the 4<sup>th</sup> teacher teaching on the last fourth of the school year.

The parents of the building will work closely with the teachers and their school board (made up of parents) will work closely with the Building Principal. All group music and group athletic groups will meet on Saturdays hopefully using college students as instructors and parents volunteering also.

Flood related problems caused an interruption in our office building's power this afternoon preventing us from working on the computer. Accordingly, I apologize for the delay in sending this fax to you.

Summarizing our conversation today, my wife and I are the owners of a real estate company which owns and operates multi family apartment communities. One of these communities, Kenley, is an upscale, 402-unit property in the Highway 280 Corridor/Inverness area of Birmingham, about 15 minutes south of downtown Birmingham. One of our children, one of whom was diagnosed with CML (a form of leukemia)

As a result,

we have become very involved with efforts to support the Leukemia Research Society and have dedicated our Company's charitable efforts to this endeavor.

Along these lines, we started planning several months ago to have a fund raising event at Kenley, which will last from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Thursday (June 21), 2001. At this event, we will have a charity auction and various activities such as golf putting lessons on our full sized golf green, a tennis tournament, several fashion shows overlooking the lake on which the property sits, several bands, food, etc.

Having just learned that President Bush would be in Birmingham on that same day, (I believe to raise money for Senator Sessions), it occurred to me how wonderful it would be if he could make a symbolic, token appearance at the property to show support for the concept of private initiatives devoting time to, and raising money for, charitable causes and medical research. I suspect President Bush and his family have their own strong, personal interest in attacking this particular disease. However, since discoveries in this area may also represent the key to a whole new arena of treatment, namely the development of designer drugs aimed at controlling cancers, as evidenced by the recent fast track FDA approval of the drug Gleevec, it may be especially meaningful to highlight this area now. If it were possible to fit in a visit to the property, we envision he could symbolically make a "putt for leukemia research" and add a few well chosen comments about the dawning of a new horizon in medical research and the importance of volunteer efforts to combat this dreaded disease. Needless to say, if this is something the President could consider, we would be happy to offer our full cooperation to make his visit possible.

In conclusion, recognizing how unlikely the possibility of his attending may be, we do want to thank you for taking the time to look into the possibility. It is very kind of you and equally kind of Arthur to suggest that we call you.

**MEMORANDUM**

TO: THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

FROM: Eric L. Chase

DATE: September 18, 2001

SUBJECT: Recommendation for Enhancement of  
U.S. Capability to Counter Terrorism

---

1. Overview. Many professionals in specialty areas in the military, specific government agencies and in private security businesses have been aware for some time that the United States remains vulnerable to threats of terrorism across a broad spectrum of technology. Beyond the tragedy of September 11, 2001, the potential for loss of American life and property through future acts of terrorism is undiminished. Under Executive control, the federal government should initiate a permanent program and infrastructure to deal with all aspects of terrorism threats, including counter-terrorism, anti-terrorism and civil defense preparation for the nation's population.

2. Appointment of High Level Official to Guide, Implement and Enforce Policies. The President and the Congress should consider the establishment of a cabinet-level department, responsible for developing policies regarding terrorism, with the broad authority to act in a crisis to implement prompt defensive and protective measures. Alternatively, such an appointment might be considered as part of an existing agency. But this option would seem to be less preferable since there are already competing responsibilities among several agencies, and one discernible

advantage of the new office would be its ability to bring all available resources together in carrying out a critical responsibility.

3. Coordination/Cooperation/Liaison With Existing Agencies. The new cabinet member and/or department would need to tie in and work with existing assets at many agencies, including DOJ (including FBI), CIA, State, DOD (including DIA), etc. It would be a key element of this coordination that all existing terrorism data and information would be immediately accessible by and, when necessary or appropriate, disseminated by a single agency.

4. Identify and Cure Existing Gaps in Intelligence Resources, Terrorism Security; Make Recommendations for Legislation. The new agency/team would have the considerable responsibility of immediately commencing a top-to-bottom study of where we stand as a nation in our ability to cope with the infinite varieties of possible terrorist threats. It would not be a purpose to duplicate the capabilities of existing intelligence agencies, but it would be a mission to assure the seamless communication of terrorism intelligence to those with a need. This would have to be a cure-and-correct-as-you-go activity, because some aspects of any foreseeable program will require immediate implementation.

5. Civil Defense. The United States is in dire need of some reasonable public educational and emergency doctrine to deal with predictable, as well as unforeseeable, threats from terrorism. At present, there is virtually nothing disseminated to the general public regarding self-protection, safety measures, evacuation procedures, etc. The extraordinary crisis response that followed (and continues to follow) the September 11 assault should not provide comfort to our national

leadership that we are ready to cope with other acts of terrorism. All things considered, the nation is faring well in the ongoing crisis response because of the team available to the President, the President's hands-on leadership and local heroic efforts, but there are telltale signs that we are in drastic need of broad institutional change and upgrade.

6. Balancing Liberty and Security. Although some immediate protective measures and further study are clearly called for, care must be taken to strike a rational balance between liberty and security. This is an old debate that now has an unprecedented lesson and urgency. Security has often been given short shrift for the sake of some perceived – often intangible, often minute – belief that personal freedoms were at stake. The over-balance in favor of irresponsible concepts of "liberty" was at times just foolish. Some existing laws still perpetuate this problem.

Through legislation and inaction over a period of decades, the population is more exposed to real and grave risks than it should be. Small nuclear weapons, chemical or biological agents, in the hands of a few suicidal extremists, could make instant casualties of millions of Americans. A tragedy of unspeakable proportion could happen tomorrow, and a host of venues are vulnerable to almost limitless specific kinds of terrorist attacks. Nevertheless, the Executive Branch can move promptly to prevent many of the worst possible scenarios and/or minimize the impact of "worst cases." Much more, however, must be done. In addition to the urgency of "shoring up" certain areas of our terrorism prevention capabilities, the overall process will be long, pervasive and expensive. At the same time, I am confident that the President would assure Americans that steps are being taken to assure the permanence of both security and

liberty – not one at the expense of the other. Indeed, the rallying cry should make clear that the country cannot enjoy one without the other.

7. Conclusion. For the foregoing reasons and innumerable other details that would be expanded, a task force should go into action on an immediate basis. Given the importance of the effort, I anticipate that the President might look to the exceptional talents and leadership of several of his appointees in such an endeavor. (I have had a fair bit of experience in teaching and writing on International Law issues that are directly relevant. If anyone in the Administration thinks any of this makes good sense that I might contribute to a discussion, I would be honored to meet or talk further).
