A. Italy.

1. Operations.

In Adriatic sector own troops reached line of Santerno between 35 and 44 northings after only slight opposition. Further west air recce reports road Tossignano-Imola blown as far as 21 easting, indicating enemy probably preparing to pull back as far as Santerno in hill sector as well as coastal plain. No sign yet of reinforcement arriving for 76th or I Para Corps. In western sector unconfirmed report claims capture of Carrara and 200 PW by Partisans.

2. Movements.

Large number of reports indicate move in early April of substantial elements 29th PG Div into Venice-Treviso area. Photo coverage of 8 April also shows military rail movement Udine-Tarvisio of fairly heavy nature including flats loaded with MT or HDV. No evidence yet to connect 29th PG Div with this movement which may equally well involve one of

B. Austria.

Between Morava and Danube, Russians occupied Gaenserndorf (S 61), Deutsch Wagram (S 50), Glinzendorf (X 59) and Wittau (X 59). In Vienna whole of city cleared south and west Danube Canal. Enemy appears to be making little effort at fortress resistance.

C. Yugoslavia.

By 10 April Jugoslavs controlled coast as far north as Krimpote (RJ 6711) and captured Ogulin meeting little opposition.

On 6th April, 724th Regt located area Petrovo Selo (WF 38) and 734th Regt immediately to east.

On 10 April, elements 104th Jaeger and 10th Croat Divisions reported reached Dreznikgrad, northwest Petrovo Selo, enroute for Karlovac. Thus appears enemy switching troops to prevent Yugoslav breakthrough from Ogulin to Karlovac.

Ref G-2 Summary Number 218 Para C, Hq 392d Division moved Karlovac and not Senj.

In Bosna Valley, Zenica captured by Jugoslavs and enemy rear guards believed north of town.

Part 1.

1. Operations.

Scattered resistance met in drive south from Karlsruhe and Ettlingen (R 4938) cleared. Enemy raid on Ettlingen repulsed during night. Only light opposition met in crossing Neckar River and entrance of Allied Troops into Heilbronn. Enemy counter attack against bridgehead north of town at S 0865 repulsed. Several enemy units along Jagst river area Neudenzau (S 1278) during ~~night~~ to cover withdrawal. Odheim (S 1173) reached later without opposition. Resistance generally slackening Heilbronn to Wuerzburg.

night apparently interrupted

Mopping up continues in Wuerzburg and thrust through town reached Rottendorf (N 6535) against negligible resistance. Advance of 15 miles east from Gemuenden (N 4064) reached Werneck (N 6857) six miles southwest of Schweinfurt.

North of Hammelburg (N 5471) advance of one to 12 miles on
20 mile front against light opposition reached Hohe Roehren
mountains.

Road blocks and dug in infantry supported by anti
tank fire and Nebelwerfers stubbornly resisted Allied advance
east from Suhl to Stuetzerbach (J 2131). Strong resistance
being encountered along line Ruhla (H 8558) Wutha (H 8665).
Stubborn infantry opposition in Eisenach overcome and town
cleared. Enemy resistance stiffened along line Bad Sooden
(H 5699) Helms (H 3697) with approximately 15 tanks active
in area and several small counter attacks were repulsed dur-
ing day. Allied advance to Grossalmerode (H 4397) bitterly
contested but town cleared at close of period. North of
Grossalmerode estimated battalion of infantry encountered
dug in along both sides of road at Hundelhausen (C 4701).
Camp southern sector of Ruhr pocket platoon strength enemy
counter attack area Wiesen (G 0344) repulsed, another counter
attack with infantry supported by one self propelled gun at
Litzel (G 3166) easily repulsed. Siegen cleared but heavy
resistance encountered north of town from enemy paratroops.

East of Weser River enemy observed digging trenches and foxholes along line C 4808 and C 3515. In Hann Muenden well dug in enemy continued to resist stubbornly. Hsmeln cleared against light resistance and bridgehead across Weser south of town extended. Hegen (C 2180).

Three enemy strongpoints of 50 men each west edge of Bueckeberg (W 8908) holding up Allied advance. Two railway guns at W 819095 knocked out.

Little resistance met in establishing Allied bridgehead over Weser from Minden to Petershagen (W 8422). Diepholz entered and thrust east to Kirchdorf (W 7545) and Sieden- burg (W 8156) met little opposition.

East of Liuten counter ^{measures of} enemy using assault guns delayed Allied advance; Germans probably effecting local withdrawal from Rheine Nordhorn Lingen salient. Allied sweep area north of Almelo continued overrunning Coevorden (V3252) and driving east to Meppen (V 7055) against light opposition. Heavy fighting in Zutphen with some Allied progress north towards Deventer.

Deserters stated Dunkirk garrison planning sortie by one to three battalions on western sector of perimeter, possibly night 6 April

(S 49). 9th Volksgrenadier southwest of Bad Mergenheim

In Ruhr pocket 338th Division moved across to east side to join Bayerlein group in area Oberkirchen.

7th Parachute Division at Lingen and 15th Panzer Grenadier still in area north of Rheine: Grossdeutschland Training Brigade between them. 8th Parachute out of contact probably withdrawn eastwards between 7th Parachute and 15th Panzer Grenadier.

Document dated 28th February implies Nineteenth Army no longer under command of Army Group G.

Still no appreciable fresh forces have yet come up between Bremen and Weimar. In north between Weser and Ijssel only serious opposition coming from II Parachute Corps between Lingen and Ibbenbueren: little resistance to right and left of it. Appears that reserves of Parachute Troops from the training division and the aborted 10th and 11th Parachute Divisions have about run out and the indefatigable *Corps will* now begin to feel its losses.

In the past it has been my policy to refuse permission for French troops to operate across the Franco-Italian Border.

2. In order to assist 15 Army Groups coming offensive by containing German forces on border for as long as possible SHAEF have agreed to carry out certain limited operations with French Troops across the border.

3. I have therefore withdrawn my previous objections to operations of French troops across the border to the extent necessary to achieve the object stated in para. 2 above.

4. The British resident minister and US political advisor have been kept informed and have represented certain political objections.

5. I consider that in this case military advantages outweigh political disadvantages and I have acted accordingly.

6. I propose to request SHAEF to withdraw French Troops concerned from Italy at earliest practicable moment after Germans cease fighting or when progress of coming battle in Italy no longer demands this threat on the Franco-Italian Frontier.

Departure of div to another front not as yet indicated by this reported move. Bn CO of 142 Recon Unit of 42 JD reported captured in Spit area. All officers of Bn reported killed or captured. Deserters from 993 GR of 278 ID identified along L 17 easting. Line up of regiments from east to west now appears to be 993 GR-992 GR and 994 GR.

Pezinok northeast of Bratislava. West of Neusiedler Lake photo recce showed Russian columns crossing river Leitha at points three and nine miles northeast Wiener Neustadt mid-day 2nd April. Southwest Wiener Neustadt columns five miles east of Glognitz morning 2nd April. Line thence ran to Rechnitz and along Austrian side frontier to junction with Yugoslav frontier. Nagykanizsa occupied by Russians. 118 Jaeger and 71 Infantry Divisions reported left latter town before 31st March for west. 6th SS Panzer Army reported recently Szentgotthard. Both reports unconfirmed. 1st April enemy columns observed moving from Straß (RE 29) on Austrian border towards Maribor including 1000 MT and tanks were attacked from air. Heavy road traffic observed 2nd April between Graz and Bruck/Mur.

2. Yugoslavia:

Twenty miles northwest Sarajevo railway to Grad cut by Jugoslavs. Enemy continues thinning out forces Frem, Danube and Drava fronts. 117 Jaeger Division reported left area Vinkovci for Brod. Ustashi reinforcements reported arrived Lussin Island night 2/3 April.
