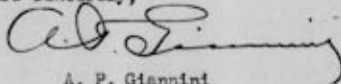
I recall with much pleasure meeting and dining at the same table with you at the Jim Moffetts last Spring. Of course, I enjoyed our little dance immensely.

I have talked the political situation over with everybody who had the patience to discuss it, particularly with those who had something to say about it, and I will outline to you here the results of my temporary and present moment conclusions:

The Roosevelt enthusiasm spread over the land and came to a finish when F. D. accepted the nomination and made his big radio speech in Philadelphia, and all the executives of the party fled to comfort and seclusion. You could shoot a thousand shot guns in every direction and not hit an important Democratic politician, and you couldn't point your finger in any direction without poking it into a Landon enthusiast.
