Thank you for your letter proposing that I consider creating a national monument in the San Rafael Swell area in Emery County, Utah. I appreciate the desire to protect the San Rafael Swell area. I also appreciate your concern about the manner in which national monument designations are made.

I have requested that Secretary Norton provide me with information about the San Rafael Swell, and any historic landmarks, historic or prehistoric structures, or other objects of historic or scientific interest that are present there. In addition, you will be pleased to learn that I have asked that she solicit public participation and comment and consult with you and the entire congressional delegation of the State of Utah. Furthermore, I requested that she provide me with any information about the development of plans and programs for the management of the lands in the San Rafael Swell that may be considered for monument designation, including any public comments that may be offered. An open and public process for gathering this information is important to me. Before making any decision about national monument designation, I will consider carefully the information Secretary Norton provides.

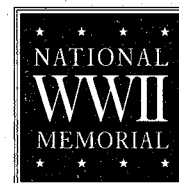

Dear Mr. President:

I write to bring to your attention the current status of our efforts to establish a National World War II Memorial in Washington, D.C. With your support, and the support of millions of other Americans, we had reached the point where we should have been in position to begin construction in March. The American Battle Monuments Commission has fully complied with the Commemorative Works Act by receiving approval of site and design from all approving agencies and having on deposit the necessary funds.

Accordingly, the National Park Service issued a construction permit, the final step in the legal process. Regrettably, however, construction is delayed indefinitely pending resolution of a lawsuit filed by a small opposition group and a procedural issue involving the National Capital Planning Commission (NCPC), one of the agencies required by law to approve the memorial.

NCPC decisions of the past two years, including its approval of the WWII Memorial, were placed in question because the former NCPC chairman continued to serve on the commission after the expiration of his term. To correct this oversight, the NCPC has opted to hold yet another public hearing on June 13 and 14 to reconsider its previous approvals of the memorial. The delay caused by these processes has already, as a practical matter, caused a one-year delay in construction activity. Revisiting of both the site and design approvals could push us back to square one and force us to begin another five to six-year approval process.

The memorial site and design have received the endorsement of the State Historic Preservation Officer of the District of Columbia, four endorsements from the D.C. Historic Preservation Review Board, and five separate approvals each from the Commission of Fine Arts and the National Capital Planning Commission. In a unanimous concurrent resolution last October, the Congress strongly expressed its desire and expectation that the memorial be completed expeditiously, and that it be built as designed on its approved and dedicated National Mall site. Now, seven months later, we are no closer to getting started. Legislation that would direct construction has been introduced in the Senate by Sen. Tim Hutchinson (S.580) and in the House by Chairman Bob Stump (H.R.1696).

The memorial fund-raising campaign, under the leadership of Senator Bob Dole, has received financial support from half a million individual Americans, hundreds of corporations and foundations, dozens of civic, fraternal and professional organizations, 48 state legislatures, 1,100 schools, and more than 450 veterans' groups representing 11 million veterans. We have received, in cash and pledges, more than \$170 million.

What's most unfortunate and disturbing is that this delay will deprive hundreds of thousands of WWII veterans from ever seeing the memorial completed. Of the 16 million who served in World War II, only 5 million are alive today. And we lose another 1,100 with each passing day.

Contrary to what the opposition contends, the WWII Memorial is the product of an open and democratic process, in full compliance with all applicable laws. The site and design were debated in the media and 22 public meetings since 1995. No one has been denied the right to be heard, and critics have had full opportunity to state their positions during the many public meetings held over the past six years.

Veterans are writing and calling with a simple message: it's time to end the debate and begin the construction. We agree. We would appreciate anything you could do to help get us back on track.

Thank you again for all you have done to support our efforts to date. If there is any other information you need, please let me know.

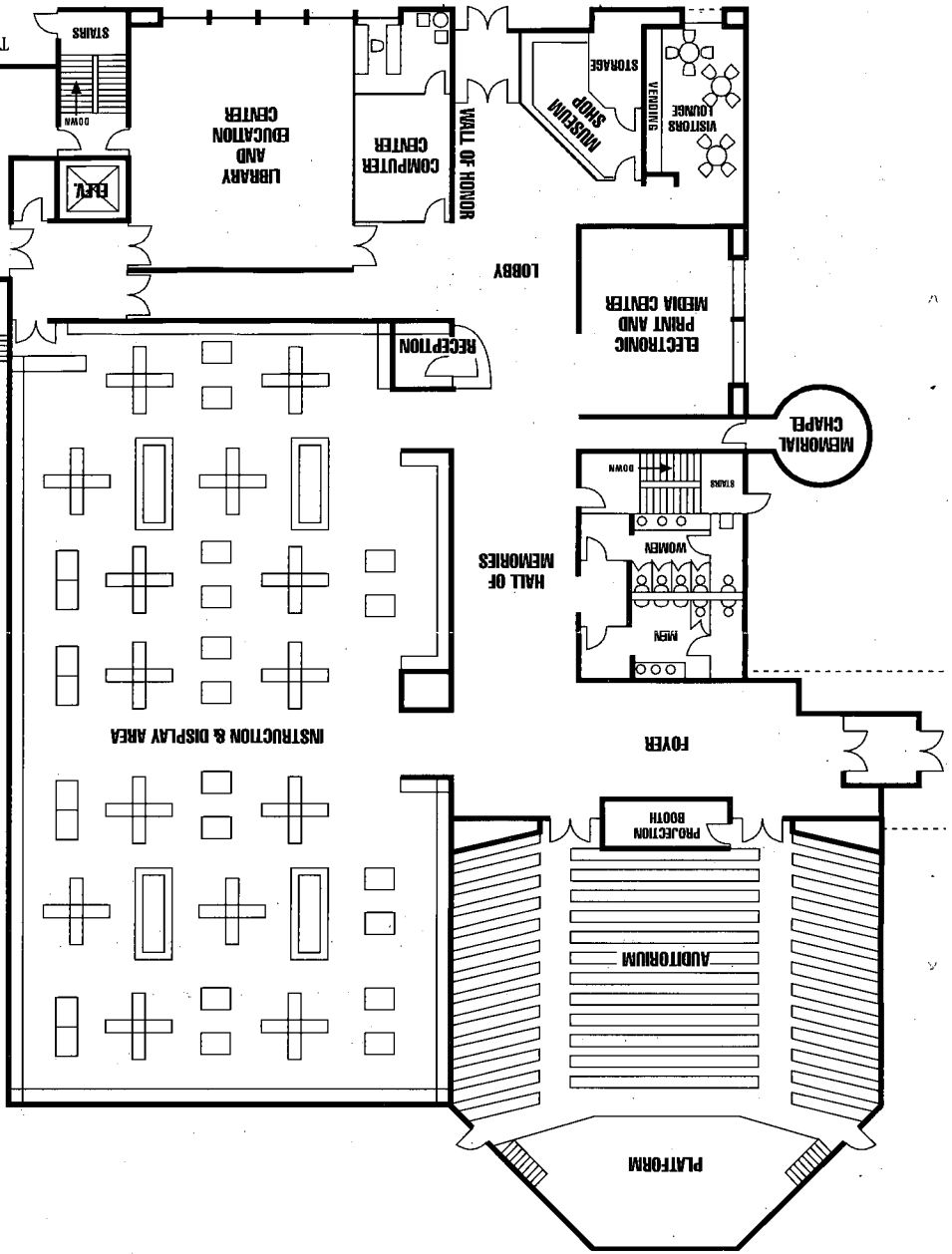


PROPOSED FACILITY PLAN

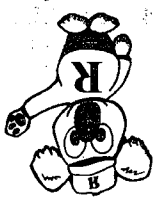

Thank you for your letter to President Bush expressing your objections to former President Bill Clinton's designation of national monuments. Both the President and Secretary Norton have been receiving a large volume of correspondence expressing similar concerns about specific monument designations.

At a recent meeting of the Western Governors' Association, Secretary Norton stated that the Interior Department does not have the authority to rescind any of the new monuments established in the Clinton Administration. However, the Administration is committed to working with local governments and communities in developing appropriate management plans for these areas. Deputy Assistant Secretary Tom Fulton echoed this commitment in his testimony in support of H.R. 2114, the National Monument Fairness Act, "ensuring that those most directly affected are not disenfranchised by the process."

I assure you that these monuments will be administered in a way that takes into account not only national interests but local needs and concerns as well.

I am incredibly disappointed with your inaction. The "war on the west" is not a cliché. It is a reality. My constituents suffer on a daily basis from over-zealous environmental rules and regulations. Forty-eight per cent of the State of Washington is already in control of some form of government entity.

If we consider the states of Montana, Colorado, California, Oregon, Wyoming, New Mexico and Arizona, a conservative estimate would be that a government entity controls 75% of that land mass. This is totally unacceptable.

I wonder if anyone in Washington DC has ever seen Article I, Section 8, Paragraph 17 of the United States Constitution and at a bare minimum believed in it. I could argue the equal footing doctrine, but the liberal courts of this nation have already skewed this doctrine beyond belief. I have a great amount of angst with this situation.

I implore you for the sake of the people of the Western United States to explore this situation and remedy this problem.

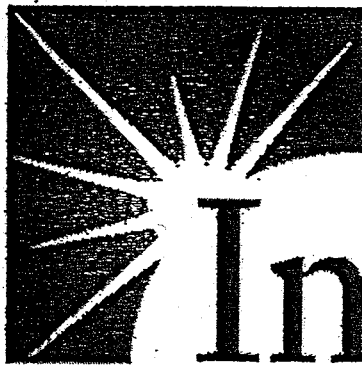

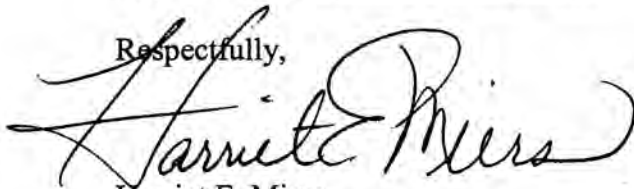

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE GOVERNORS ISLAND NATIONAL MONUMENT

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
A PROCLAMATION

On the north tip of Governors Island, between the confluence of the Hudson and Eastern Rivers, Governors Island National Monument served as an outpost to protect New York City from sea attack. The monument, part of a larger 1985 National Historic Landmark District designation, contains two important historical objects, Castle William and Fort Jay. Between 1806 and 1811, these fortifications were constructed as part of the First and Second American Systems of Coastal Fortification. Castle William and Fort Jay represent two of the finest types of defensive structures in use from the Renaissance to the American Civil War. The monument also played important roles in the War of 1812, the American Civil War, and World Wars I and II.

The fortifications in the monument were built on the most strategic defensive positions on the island. Fort Jay, constructed between 1806 and 1809, is on the highest point of the island from which its glacis originally sloped down to the waterfront on all sides. Castle William, constructed between 1807 and 1811, occupies a rocky promontory as close as possible to the harbor channels and served as the most important strategic defensive point in the entrance to the New York Harbor. The monument also includes a number of associated historical buildings constructed as part of the garrison post in the early part of the 19th century.

Governors Island has been managed by the U.S. Army and the U.S. Coast Guard over the past 200 years. With the site no longer required for military or Coast Guard purposes, it provides an excellent opportunity for the public to observe and understand the harbor history, its defense, and its ecology.

Section 2 of the Act of June 8, 1906 (34 Stat. 225, 16 U.S.C. 431), authorizes the President, in his discretion, to declare by public proclamation historic landmarks, historic

and prehistoric structures, and other objects of historic or scientific interest that are situated upon the lands owned or controlled by the Government of the United States to be national monuments, and to reserve as a part thereof parcels of land, the limits of which in all cases shall be confined to the smallest area compatible with the proper care and management of the objects to be protected.

WHEREAS it appears that it would be in the public interest to reserve such lands as the Governors Island National Monument:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM J. CLINTON, President of the United States of America, by the authority vested in me by section 2 of the Act of June 8, 1906 (34 Stat. 225, 16 U.S.C. 431), do proclaim that there are hereby set apart and reserved as the Governors Island National Monument for the purpose of protecting the objects identified above, all lands and interests in lands owned or controlled by the United States within the boundaries of the area described on the map entitled "Governors Islands National Monument" attached to and forming a part of this proclamation. The Federal land and interests in land reserved consist of approximately 20 acres, which is the smallest area compatible with the proper care and management of the objects to be protected.

Subject to existing law, including Public Law No. 105-33, Title IX, section 9101(a), 111 Stat. 670 (Aug. 5, 1997), all Federal lands and interests in lands within the boundaries of this monument are hereby appropriated and withdrawn from all forms of entry, location, selection, sale, or leasing or other disposition under the public land laws, including but not limited to withdrawal from location, entry, and patent under the mining laws, and from disposition under all laws relating to mineral and geothermal leasing.

The Secretary of the Interior ("Secretary"), acting through the National Park Service, shall manage the monument

in consultation with the Administrator of General Services, consistent with the purposes and provisions of this proclamation.

For the purpose of preserving, restoring, and enhancing the public visitation and appreciation of the monument, the Secretary, acting through the National Park Service, shall prepare, in consultation with the Administrator of General Services, a management plan for the monument within 3 years of this date. Further, to the extent authorized by law, the Secretary, acting through the National Park Service, shall promulgate, in consultation with the Administrator of General Services, regulations for the proper care and management of the objects identified above.

The establishment of this monument is subject to valid existing rights.

Nothing in this proclamation shall be deemed to revoke any existing withdrawal, reservation, or appropriation; however, the national monument shall be the dominant reservation.

Warning is hereby given to all unauthorized persons not to appropriate, injure, destroy, or remove any feature of this monument and not to locate or settle upon any of the lands thereof.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this nineteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord two thousand one, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and twenty-fifth.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

FINAL NORTHWESTERN HAWAIIAN ISLANDS
CORAL REEF ECOSYSTEM RESERVE

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including the National Marine Sanctuaries Act, (16 U.S.C. 1431 et seq.), and the National Marine Sanctuaries Amendments Act of 2000, Public Law 106-513, and in furtherance of the purposes of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1801 et seq.), Marine Protection, Research, and Sanctuaries Act (33 U.S.C. 1401 et seq.), Coastal Zone Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1451 et seq.), Endangered Species Act (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.), Marine Mammal Protection Act (16 U.S.C. 1362 et seq.), Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.), National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470 et seq.), National Wildlife Refuge System Administration Act (16 U.S.C. 668dd-e.e.), and other pertinent statutes, it is ordered as follows:

Sec. 1. Preamble. On December 4, 2000, I issued Executive Order 13178 establishing the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands Coral Reef Ecosystem Reserve (Reserve) pursuant to my authority under the National Marine Sanctuaries Act, as amended by the National Marine Sanctuary Amendments Act of 2000 (Act). In establishing the Reserve, I set forth a number of conservation measures and created specific Reserve Preservation Areas to protect the coral reef ecosystem and related marine resources and species (resources) of the Reserve. The Act provides that no closure areas can become permanent without adequate notice and comment. Accordingly, I proposed to make permanent the Reserve Preservation Areas and initiated a 30-day comment period on this proposal. I also sought comment on the conservation measures for the Reserve. On my behalf, the Secretary of Commerce received the public comments and held seven public hearings.

including six throughout Hawaii. After considering the comments expressed at the hearings and received in writing, I have determined to make permanent the Reserve Preservation Areas with certain modifications set forth below. Further, I have modified certain conservation measures to address concerns raised, particularly regarding commercial and recreational fishing within the Reserve. With this action, the establishment of the Reserve under the Act, including the conservation measures and permanent Reserve Preservation Areas, is complete. The Secretary of Commerce will manage the Reserve pursuant to Executive Order 13178, as modified by this order, under the Act. The Secretary shall also initiate the process to designate the Reserve as a National Marine Sanctuary, as required by the Act.

Sec. 2. Purpose. The purpose of this order is to amend Executive Order 13178, and to make permanent Reserve Preservation Areas, as modified below, to ensure the comprehensive, strong, and lasting protection of the resources of the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands.

Sec. 3. Amendments to Sections 7 of Executive Order 13178.

1. Section 7(a)(1) of Executive Order 13178 is hereby amended by revising the first sentence to read as follows: "Commercial Fishing. All currently existing commercial Federal fishing permits and current levels of fishing effort and take, which also includes the non-permitted level of trolling for pelagic species by currently permitted bottom-fishers, as determined by the Secretary and pursuant to regulations in effect on December 4, 2000, shall be capped as follows:"

2. Section 7(a)(1)(C) of Executive Order 13178 is hereby revised to read as follows:

"(C) The annual level of aggregate take under all permits of any particular type of fishing may not exceed the aggregate level of take under all permits of that type of fishing as follows:

(1) Bottomfishing -- the annual aggregate level for each permitted bottomfisher shall be that permittee's individual average taken over the 5 years preceding December 4, 2000, as determined by the Secretary, provided that the Secretary, in furtherance of the principles of the reserve, may make a one-time reasonable increase to the total aggregate to allow for the use of two Native Hawaiian bottomfishing permits;

(2) All other commercial fishing -- the annual aggregate level shall be the permittee's individual take in the year preceding December 4, 2000, as determined by the Secretary."

3. A new section 7(a)(1)(F) is hereby added to Executive Order 13178 and reads as follows:

"(F) Trolling for pelagic species shall be capped based on reported landings for the year preceding December 4, 2000."

4. Section 7(b)(4) is revised to read as follows:

"(4) Discharging or depositing any material or other matter into the Reserve, or discharging or depositing any material or other matter outside the Reserve that subsequently enters the Reserve and injures any resource of the Reserve, except:

(A) fish parts (i.e., chumming materia or bait) used in and during fishing operations authorized under this order;

(B) biodegradable effluent incident to vessel use and generated by a marine sanitation device in accordance with section 312 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended;

(C) water generated by routine vessel operations (e.g., deck wash down and graywater as defined in section 312 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act), excluding oily wastes from bilge pumping; or

(D) cooling water from vessels or engine exhaust; and"

Sec. 4. Amendments to Sections 8 of Executive Order 13178.

1. Section 8 of Executive Order 13178 is modified by substituting "provided that commercial bottomfishing and commercial and recreational trolling for pelagic species in accordance with the requirements of sections 7(a)(1) and 7(a)(2) of this order, respectively," for "provided that bottomfishing in accordance with the requirements of section 7(a)(1)" everywhere the latter phrase appears in section 8.

2. Section 8(a)(1)(A) is modified by substituting "a mean depth of 25 fm" for "a mean depth of 10fm."

3. Section 8(a)(1)(B) is modified by substituting "a mean depth of 25 fm" for "a mean depth of 20fm."

4. Section 8(a)(1)(D) is modified by substituting "a mean depth of 25 fm" for "a mean depth of 10fm."

5. Section 8(a)(1)(E) is modified by substituting "a mean depth of 25 fm" for "a mean depth of 20fm."

6. Section 8(a)(1)(G) is modified by substituting "a mean depth of 25 fm" for "a mean depth of 50fm."

7. Section 8(a)(1)(I) is revised to read "Kure Atoll."

8. Sections 8(a)(2)(D) and (E) are hereby deleted and a new section 8(a)(3) is hereby substituted as follows:

"(3) Twelve nautical miles around the approximate geographical centers of

(A) The first bank west of St. Rogation Bank, east of Gardner Pinnacles, provided that commercial bottomfishing and commercial and recreational trolling for pelagic species in accordance with the requirements of sections 7(a)(1) and 7(a)(2) of this order, shall be allowed to continue for a period of 5 years from the date of this order; and

(B) Raita Bank, provided that commercial bottomfishing and commercial and recreational trolling for pelagic species in accordance with the requirements of sections 7(a)(1) and 7(a)(2) of this order, shall be allowed to continue for a period of 5 years from the date of this order; and

(C) Provided that both banks described above in (3)(A) and (3)(B) shall only continue to allow commercial bottomfishing and commercial and recreational trolling for pelagic species after the 5-year time period if it is determined that continuation of such activities will have no adverse impact on the resources of these banks."

Sec. 5. Reserve Preservation Areas. The Reserve Preservation Areas, as modified in sections 3 and 4 of this order, are hereby made permanent in accordance with the Act.

Sec. 6. Judicial Review. This order does not create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable in law or equity by a party against the United States, its agencies, its officers, or any person.

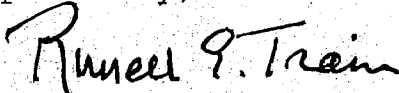
At its annual meeting on February 23, 1998, the members of the Washington National Monument Society unanimously adopted a resolution opposing the location of a World War II Memorial, as presently planned, between the Washington Monument and the Lincoln Memorial.

The Washington National Monument Society was organized in 1834 and chartered by the Congress in 1859, as amended by Acts of August 2, 1876, and October 1888. The undersigned is the First Vice President of the Society. The President ex officio of the Society is the President of the United States. (The Society is the parent organization of the Association on which letterhead this letter is written.)

The Society, most and perhaps all of whose members are veterans of World War II, does not oppose the creation of a suitable memorial, but it does take strong exception to its proposed location directly on the axis between the Washington Monument and the Lincoln Memorial. In our opinion, the vista which has stretched uninterrupted for generations between the monuments to these two, towering giants of our history as a nation and as a people should be left uncluttered by new memorials and their inevitable concomitant of parking lots, tourist buses, souvenir stands, etc.

While it is my understanding you gave your approval to the location in question some time ago, we urge that reconsideration be given the matter.

Dear President Bush,

We write to express great disappointment with the lack of responsiveness from your Administration regarding a matter of great importance to New York: the future of Governors Island.

We were alarmed to learn from news reports today that your Administration has been busy devising a legal strategy to overturn former President William J. Clinton's designation of the Governors Island forts as national monuments.

The plan, which will ultimately restore ownership of the Island to the state of New York, was reached through successful bipartisan collaboration over several years by Governor George Pataki, Mayor Rudolph Giuliani, the New York City Council, Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan, Senator Charles Schumer, Senator Hillary Rodham Clinton, Representatives Jerrold Nadler and Carolyn B. Maloney, the entire House delegation and local civic, historic preservation, business, and environmental groups. We are unhappy to learn that your Administration is prepared to disturb this effort. Further, we are particularly concerned to learn about your Administration's efforts through the press, rather than through an official communication from a member of your Administration.

Several weeks ago, we contacted Interior Secretary Gale Norton to request clarification regarding her April 18 statements to the *New York Post*: 'Before lowering the price tag of Governors Island with a monument designation, government leaders should examine the impact on the federal budget, Norton said. "It's an expensive piece of property," Norton said, "and the federal budget needs to be aware of the tradeoff between keeping the property and receiving money for that property."' (*The New York Post*, April 18, 2001, *NOT SO FAST ON GOVERNORS ISLAND SALE, FEDS SAY*). Our offices were told by a representative from her legislative affairs office that the Secretary's schedule was "too busy" for this meeting request to be granted in a timely manner. Though they are seldom extravagant, membership does have its privileges, and one

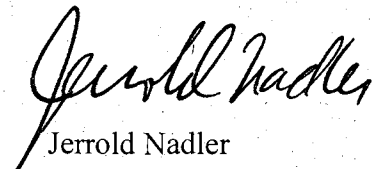
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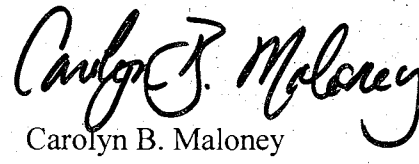
privilege of being a Member of Congress is that our requests to meet with Cabinet Secretaries are generally taken seriously.

Mr. President, we would like you to designate a member of your White House staff to serve as the lead point of contact for matters related to Governors Island. We would like to meet with this person as soon as possible to discuss both the Administration's position on the status of the monuments and the Administration's position on the disposition of the entire Island.

Mr. President, there are seldom issues that unite the entire state and city community of New York's elected officials. However, this is one of them. The fate of Governors Island deserves your Administration's attention. You have frequently said that you intend to represent "all of the people," even people living in areas of the country where you did not enjoy electoral success. We encourage you to view the bipartisan support behind Governors Island as an opportunity for you to show your commitment to responsible and responsive public service over politics. We look forward to an early and favorable reply.
