## **President's Message**

NCNC members and their dogs were very active and successful during the past month. (Show results are listed elsewhere in the Newfs Paper.) Of note: Dexter (Joyce Taylor) won multiple Best of Breed awards and a G1, G2 and G4. Congratulations!

The **water test at Folsom Lake**, a new site, was very successful. Ten dogs entered and all showed, of which eight qualified. New titles were earned Saturday in the senior class (WRD) by Ready (Pearson), Tucker (Sayre), Doe (Masters) and Austin (Gallagher). Ready and Tucker also completed their Versatile Newfoundland (VN) titles. Trace (Jatczak) and Ramble (Brown) re-qualified in junior (WD) on Sunday. Senior re-qualifiers (on both Saturday and Sunday) were Jeter (Robinson) and Rose (Littleford). (See more details elsewhere in the Newfs Paper.) The judges, Erin Zimmer Palmer and Deborah Rothwell, did an excellent job. It was a pleasure to show for them. Test Chair Carol Chew and her crew did a great job preparing the site (think raking up rocks and smoothing the gullies!) and providing a smooth running test. Test Secretary Patti Sondgroth had all her paperwork well in order. Chief Steward Dawn Druge assembled and led a great group of stewards who performed their jobs very well and kept the test moving. Cathy Sayre and Carol Chew provided ample food for all, and Robin Welter once again provided her photographic expertise. It was a wonderful team effort. Thank you to all who helped and participated, and congratulations to all the qualifiers!

We are **seeking new chair persons** for several key NCNC positions, including the **Membership** committee, the **2016 Regional Specialty**, and the **2016 NCNC picnic**. If you are interested please give me a call. These positions will also be discussed at the next NCNC meeting, along with choosing the judges for the 2016 Regional Specialty.

As discussed before, NCA expressed interest in having a west coast National Specialty. Membership in both NCNC and the Seattle Newf Clubs voted to join forces to submit a proposal to host the **2017 NCA National Specialty** with co-chairs Kevin Gallagher (NCNC) and Chris Lyden (Seattle). One potential site near Mount Hood in Oregon is no longer available. Two other sites are currently being considered. One is the Double Tree hotel in Rohnert Park (site of the 1998 National Specialty hosted by NCNC). I visited the Double Tree with Kevin -- the hotel is very nice and the outside areas for rings and tentage are essentially the same as in 1998. However, the area which was used for RVs is no longer available. Kevin and Chris recently visited another potential site on the Oregon coast, the Salishan Spa and Golf Resort in Gleneden Beach, Oregon. It looks very promising. It is about a 2 ½ hour drive from the Portland International Airport, and there is a large RV park nearby. Kevin and Chris are talking to both sites and comparing them. We will hear more at the upcoming NCNC meeting.

**Water training sessions** are ongoing at Folsom Lake (contact Cathy Sayre or Carol Chew) and at Lake Del Valle (contact John Pearson). If you are interested in participating, please contact the persons listed for details and schedules, as they may change from week to week. The **Fall NCNC water test** is scheduled at Lake Del Valle for September 12-13. (The premium list is now available on the NCNC website.) The test committee has several jobs available. (Contact Lori Littleford for information. If you are interested in stewarding at the test, please contact John Pearson.) Currently, the water level at Del Valle is excellent for training, and hopefully the water level will remain good through the scheduled test dates, as was the case last year.

The next **NCNC meeting** will be held August 8 at the home of Hazel Jacoby in Castro Valley. On the agenda, we will discuss the **2016 Regional Specialty**, including show chair positions and judges (conformation, sweepstakes and obedience/rally). We will also have an update on the 2017 National Specialty search effort, open committee chair positions, and other important club business. So, come prepared to participate.

We have lots of activities planned for you and your dogs. As always, check the calendar section of the Newfs Paper or the NCNC website for more details. I hope to see you there!

During practice at Folsom Lake on July 3rd, we had a real rescue event. Although our dogs were not involved, two of their trainers were. Across the "bay" a woman was swimming with the help of an inflatable object when she lost her hold on it. The wind carried it out of her reach and she could not catch up with it (at least this is my interpretation of the events leading up to the rescue). She was a considerable distance from shore. Patrick Benshoof and Laura Gallagher noticed that she was in distress. Patrick in the kayak immediately began paddling out to her. Laura Gallagher ejected everyone from the boat and rowed out to the swimmer as well, fearing that the kayak would be too unstable to effect a rescue. Laura and Patrick rounded up the swimmer and brought her to shore. With no life jacket, this woman was in very real danger. I know Laura is a trained lifeguard and I'm glad that training aided her in recognizing the situation while the rest of us were so focused on training our dogs. Kudos to Laura and Patrick!

## Treasurer's Tips

The NCNC Board has identified and approved a procedure for documenting merchandise sales on vouchers. At this time NCNC sales include Working Dog equipment (harnesses, water work items, t-shirts, etc.), Regional fund raising

items, and possibly Ways and Means.

Anyone who sells items to support NCNC activities should be aware of the sales tax implications as well as other potential expenses, such as postage and fees. The NCNC policy to date has been that tax is included in the sales price rather than added to each sale. State sales tax is due once a year on all items sold. If they are mailed out of state or fees were charged (such as PayPal fees), these expenses may be deductible from the income received for tax purposes. Accounting of all income and expenses is a requirement!

If you plan to sell items to support an NCNC activity, please check with the Treasurer to ensure you understand the requirements.

Our Newfoundlands and Rescues

We purchased our first Newfie in the fall of 1980. Our 17 year old Ridgeback died in the spring and we were not looking to get another dog. We took the kids on a trip to Maine in the summer and saw our first Newfoundland dogs. We had never seen a Newf and we all fell in love with them. We came home excited and researched them and found a breeder in the Midwest where we lived at that time. Shylock arrived in November and he was a Landseer who grew to 200 pounds!! His parents were 150 and 185 so he came from big parents and he happened to be the runt. He lived to be 13 years old. We have not been without a Newfie since! There was Splash, Shadow, Sinnamon, Spice( both Bronze), Shash Yaz, Simon and Shiloh! There have always been two to four Newfies living with us over the years! Now we have 3 rescues, Bear, Callie and Brodie to add to our Newfie family!!!

Four years ago we were thinking about getting another Newfie and I was surfing the web and came upon the Northern California Newfoundland site. We sent in an application and waited to be approved.

**Bear** joined our family in August of 2013. Beth called and asked us if we would take a special dog and I asked what was special about him. She explained that he was a senior dog, 8 years old and had an eye problem that would require daily medicine. I laughed and said no problem. I loved special needs kids and dogs as I have been a special educator for years! Bear is the big, silent type and kind of a loner about 160 pounds. He became adjusted easily as our Sinnamon was 10 years old and they became best buds. We had just lost Shiloh, one of our twin Newfs to cancer and his 6 year old brother, Simon, was very depressed. Simon took Bear under his wing and showed him around the property and looked after him as he and Shiloh had done with Sinnamon. Tragically Simon passed 6 months later from the same cancer as his brother. We were devastated!

Bear and Sinnamon had each other and we had them and we struggled together! Just before Christmas in 2013, I received a call from a local person who worked with the NCNC. She had a 10 month old she had rescued from a dire situation and had placed in a local veterinary. She needed to find a placement or foster quickly and wanted to know if we would be able to take her. We had never had a female Newf so this would be another new experience. I went out to the vet and brought her home.

**Callie** is her name and we call her Cowgirl, as she is a Landseer with beautiful markings weighing around 115 pounds. She was just what the doctor ordered for all of us! Callie was/is a lively puppy and kept the seniors active and involved. We have an annual Holiday Open House the second week in December and we did not know what to expect of Callie with all the people attending the party. We decided she could roam like all our Newfs had done as she was a very cute and calm girl. As people came and went many replied that we had a wonderful hostess that took care of them that evening. We were puzzled because our grandson was our host. We did not have a hostess. We would inquire about the "hostess" and they would all say she liked to come up and put her head under their arm or want to sit in their lap or just worked the crowd checking on them. Callie was the "hostess" and the hit of the party at 10 months old and had only been with us about three weeks. What a girl! They also commented on her walking style...she struts! They were calling her "Sally Swagger"!!! She owned the party!

In November of 2014, Sinnamon passed just shy of being 13 years old. We never get used to losing our "kids" and it was almost Christmas. We knew it was his time to pass over the Rainbow Bridge and we were all there when he did.

Unbelievable as it seems, Beth called us a week later and said she had a big strapping 18 month old boy who needed some good training, as he lacked that, and would we be interested in taking on the challenge. We said yes, and we picked him up a couple of weeks later.

**Brodie** is his name. Well Brodie was more than a challenge! He was 165 pounds, 33 inches at the withers, long body and is one of the biggest Newfs we had seen! He reminded us of the cartoon character, Marmaduke! Very gangly and undisciplined, curious about everything and broke all the rules! Callie loved him as they were only 4 months apart and they became the "double trouble twosome" BFF's. I worked with Brodie on discipline daily and he was wonderful in the house! Always obeyed, great with Callie and Bear and Brodie followed me around like a big baby!! ( Terry, my hubby would laugh at him as he would never let me out of his sight!. He's yours!!!) However, once he walked outside of the house, game on! He would chase butterflies, squirrels, birds (he even ran into the fence chasing the bird) and then he discovered our neighbor's horses and would fly over our 5 foot fence with Callie right behind him and they were gone. After two weeks of

chasing the “dynamic duo” around the neighborhood (we are in the country with 3 acres and bridle paths) I was desperate!

I called a trainer (a friend) and asked for her help. She came over and we worked with him. She thought I should use a long line, like a lunge line for a horse, with him and give him some more space. I anticipated his “bolt”, had my feet planted and ready and he drug me across the back forty. We both survived but the training wasn’t working.

I just happened to have a neighbor who is a Vet Med Tech (he owns the horses) and I asked him for some help! He volunteered to help me with the training as he said Brodie was a small horse! We put up an electric web line above our fence and introduced Brodie and Callie to it. That keeps them on our property. (Now Brodie and Callie visit the horses with me frequently and under control.) I also bought an electric collar for him as the pinch and others did not work. Five days of the collar, commands and practice and he was a champ! I can walk all three of them together a mile a day, pass dogs and other animals and Brodie is for the most part a gentleman under control. (On a recent walk, however, he thought a Bassett hound named Hank was a toy and rolled him. ... much to my dismay) Now I just show him the remote and we are doing just fine. He was great at the vet’s office and now we are going to the pet store. I take him alone and will add the other two eventually. He and I practice good behavior daily! Hopefully he will mature with age J! He still chases squirrels, butterflies and anything that moves and runs into things as he is so focused on the chase! Brings us a lot of smiles and outright laughter!

I hope our stories about our rescues will put a smile on your face and encourage others to “Rescue a Newf!”

#### Wanted: 4,600 Dogs for Bloat Study

Tufts University will examine 23 breeds to try to find genetic links to life-threatening bloat.

Tufts University researchers are looking for 4,600 purebred dogs to participate in a landmark study of bloat, a life-threatening condition that primarily afflicts larger canines.

The study will use DNA taken from blood and abdominal tissue samples to investigate possible genetic links to bloat. The condition—a stomach dangerously filled with gas, fluid or food—can kill a patient even after immediate veterinary treatment and surgery.

“Bloat is a challenging disease because it escalates quickly,” said assistant professor Claire Sharp, BVSc, MS, Dipl. ACVECC. “The dog is fine one minute and in a life-threatening situation the next. Dogs often die from bloat while their owner is off at work or sleeping at night.”

Sharp and colleague Elizabeth Rozanski, DVM, Dipl. ACVIM, Dipl. ACVECC, received a \$250,000 grant from the AKC Canine Health Foundation to examine bloat.

Teaming up with researchers from the Broad Institute of Harvard and MIT, the two Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine professors hope to enroll 200 dogs from each of 23 breeds. Ideally, half of the dogs are bloat survivors and half have been bloat-free.

More than 150 dogs were enrolled as of late June.

“We are confident that a significant amount of risk for bloat will be explained purely by genetics,” Sharp said.

The sought-after 23 breeds are Bassett hound, Bernese mountain dog, bloodhound, Borzoi, boxer, Briard, Doberman, English setter, Fila Brasillerio, German shepherd, German shorthaired pointer, golden retriever, Great Dane, Greater Swiss mountain dog, Irish setter, Labrador retriever, mastiff or bullmastiff, Newfoundland, Saint Bernard, Siberian husky, smooth collie, standard poodle and Weimaraner.

## NCNC Water Test Results – Folsom Lake 7/18-19/15
