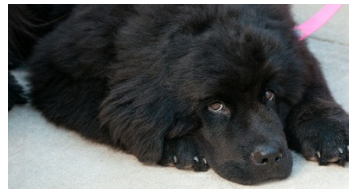

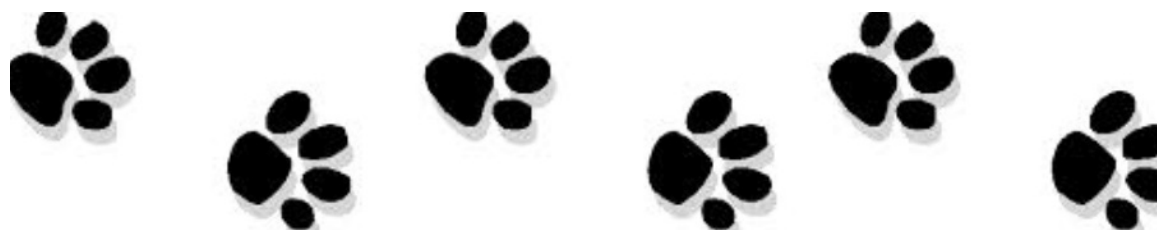

NCNC Carting Seminar

The Newfoundland Club of Northern California - (NCNC) is happy to announce they will have a carting seminar in Walnut Creek on Saturday, January 13, 2018, weather permitting. (If weather becomes a problem, those folks registered will be contacted.)

Directions to the seminar site will be provided with registration confirmation.

The faculty will consist (at press time) of the usual group of NCNC draft and carting experts.

At this time the tentative list of subjects will include;

Beginning Carting - This class is for the beginner and covers, carts, harnesses and how to get your dog involved.

Intermediate Carting - This class is for graduates from the beginning class. It'll cover sharp turns, negotiating narrows, and teaching your dog to backup.

Draft Test Preparation - This class helps people train for a Newfy draft test but would probably be helpful for people going to other breed's draft tests.

Other subjects will be added depending upon the information received with your applications.

A delicious hot lunch is provided for pre-registered participants.

Carting Seminar Signups

1. Fill out the registration form and send it to the person and address shown. Please do register ahead of time so we can plan accordingly & let you know if there are any schedule changes.
2. The \$30.00 fee is per handler. One handler can work as many dogs as they wish. Students without dogs will be charged \$10.00.
3. Please give us as much information as possible. The more we know about what you want to learn the better we can meet your needs.
4. Additional lunches for non-participants will be available for \$7.00 but we must know by at least four days prior to the seminar. (January 9, 2018)
5. We must receive pre-sign up applications 4 days prior to each seminar. This will give us time to send you a confirmation note and instructions on how to get to the site and to make sure we have enough instructors and helpers.

Event Safety

1. Any dog who is aggressive will be requested to leave.
2. All participants including instructors and other helpers will be asked to sign the club's hold harmless agreement.
3. Handlers will be asked to either have their dogs on leash or in a crate except when they are actually working with the dog such as in the maneuvering course.
4. On freight hauls we will ask people to keep a minimum of 5 foot distance between dogs and when passing let the person ahead know that you are passing.

AKC Canine Scent Work

On October 1, 2017 the American Kennel Club launched its Canine Scent Work titling program. Scent work trials (AKA “nose work”) offer an opportunity to demonstrate a dog’s ability to locate a specific odor hidden in a defined search environment. It mimics the work of explosives and drug detection dogs. The sport has been popular for a while with trials offered by other organizations, notably the National Association for Canine Scent Work.

The sport is very inclusive. All AKC registered and ILP dogs as well as those in miscellaneous classes, and All-American dogs with PAL numbers can compete. Physically impaired dogs such as those that are blind, deaf or have had legs amputated can compete as long as they display no signs of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Physically challenged handlers can also compete as long as they can negotiate the course. Obviously it is a great sport for older dogs and handlers as well as younger ones. It is not athletic.

For obvious reasons AKC events cannot have dogs search for cocaine or explosives. Instead they search for the essential oils: birch, anise (liquorish), clove and/or cypress. In novice classes, the odor is always birch and there is only one hide. As the classes advance, the other odors are added plus there are two hides for advanced classes, three hides for excellent classes and an unknown number (1 – 3) of hides for master classes. Two drops of one of the oils is placed on half of a cotton swab and the cotton swab is placed in a scent vessel such as a small tin with holes in it, a piece of a drinking straw, or some other inconspicuous object. When not in use the swabs are stored in glass containers. In the handler discrimination classes, the dog searches for an object with the handler’s scent on it.

The AKC trials have classes in two divisions, odor search and handler discrimination. The odor search division has classes for four “elements” or search environments. In all four elements as well as handler discrimination there are four levels of attainment: novice, advanced, excellent and master with titles at each level following three passes or “legs.” There are also elite titles offered when the dog earns all four element titles at the particular level such as novice or advanced). The titles get even more complicated but I won’t cover it all here. The rules are available on the AKC web site.

The four elements for the odor search division are containers, interior, exterior, and buried. The containers are cardboard boxes at the novice level but can be anything (luggage, flower pot, traffic cone etc.) in the more advanced classes. The number of containers for the container element and size of the search area

for all elements increases with the level of competition. For interior searches the hide(s) may be on a shelf, in a drawer, under the edge of a cabinet, etc. For exterior searches they may be under the arm of a lawn chair, behind a gutter down-spout, under a bench, etc. For buried searches the scent vessel is buried under soil or sand in a plastic container for novice and advanced classes. There six (novice) to eight (advanced) containers of dirt and the dog has to find the one(s) that contains the target odor. For excellent and master classes several holes are dug outside in the ground. The scent vessel is placed in one hole and all are then refilled. In all classes with more than one hide, the handler has to call "alert" with each find and "finish" when they think the dog has found the last one.

In novice classes there are no deliberate distractions, but in higher level classes there are planned distractions. In excellent and master classes there can even be food distractions.

For handler discrimination classes, the search environment varies with the level. It is containers for novice, interior for advanced, exterior for excellent and at least two different ones for master. In addition to the handler's object (a sock or glove for novice, a cotton ball or swab for the higher levels) an object with the judge's scent is hidden in the search environment.

Once a dog achieves a master title in at least one element, it is eligible to compete for the Detective Dog title. In these searches, there are 5 to 10 hides with the number unknown to the handler. The hides are both indoors and outdoors. The dog has to find all of them and the handler has to call "finish."

Page and I have participated in two trial weekends. On December 6 we went to the Northern California Golden Retriever Club trial at a training center near Lodi with all four novice elements and novice handler discrimination. Page was entered in Exterior and Interior. To begin a search the dog is brought to a start line and given the order to search. The search area is marked off in some way. There is a time limit for each search which is set by the judge for each class. When the dog indicates the location of the hide, the handler calls "alert" and this stops the time. Page did very well and earned a leg in novice exterior. For interior, I over thought the situation and failed us. The following weekend Davis Dog Training Club had four trials (two Saturday and two Sunday) limited to the container element at the novice level. Page was entered in all four and passed the first three earning her Scent Work Containers Novice (SCN) title. During her first search someone was pounding on the door which was very distracting and cost her time. She still found the correct container with time to spare (What a good girl!). I pulled out of the fourth trial to allow one of the alternates to take my place. Some of the dogs found the correct container in less than 5 seconds. Others took a bit longer, especially if the handler did not believe the dog when it first identified the container. There was a high pass rate at this novice level but some dogs did alert on the wrong container. The pass rate improved with each trial.

Training for scent work is not particularly time-consuming. I train a couple of

time per week for 15 minutes and go to a class once a week. Many clubs are offering classes so I recommend you give it a try. I have not seen any dogs that did not love it. Page surely does.
