Read the following passage:

If you look up at the sky on a clear night, you may see a red "dot" among the stars. This "dot" is Mars, named in ancient times after the Roman god of war. Although no one has ever visited this red planet, we know a lot about it. This is because we studied it through telescopes but, over the past few years we sent up two rovers (Spirit and Opportunity) and the Phoenix lander to study the planet.



Mars is more like Earth than any other planet in our solar system. Mars has a 24-hour day, a rocky crust, canyons, volcanoes, polar ice caps and seasons. But, Earth and the "4th rock from the sun" are hardly twins.

Mars is half as large as Earth and has less gravity. It has a thin atmosphere. The surface of Mars has no bodies of water, plants or animals. No place on Earth gets as cold as Mars. The lack of life on the surface of Mars is not surprising, considering the bone dry environment.
