PROJECT SUMMARY:

Salish Kootenai College is a tribally controlled college. The NACTEP project design and services are based on competency-based instructional programs with a coherent sequence of courses in five CTE programs: Information Technology (STEM), Forestry (STEM), Nursing, Dental Assisting Technology, and Highway Construction Training. Instruction includes "all aspects of industry" and cooperative education where students gain hands-on practical working experience for course credit. The project also provides job placement services and career guidance and counseling, which includes utilizing the Montana Career Information System (MTCIS), a computerized program that matches student interests, values, and occupational aspirations and expectations with any of the 16 CTE career clusters and associated educational and career pathways. The NACTEP project also provides professional development workshops for CTE instructors.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- A minimum of 83 students will be enrolled each year in the five CTE programs, with 75% completing their courses with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater, a 60% retention rate, a 35 % completion rate, and a 30% job or advanced training placement rate.
- Career counseling and guidance, including MTCIS services, will be provided for 100% of project participants seeking these services.
- Cooperative education work experience courses will be provided for 50% of project participants.
- Professional development training will be provided for 20-24 NACTEP CTE instructors and staff.
